From Fr. Mark Livingston

"You gave your children good ground for hope."

There are weeds everywhere! This doesn't always mean that individuals and people are weeds, but even within our own hearts as we try to serve the Lord, we can encounter difficulties. disappointments and wounds. We need to place our hope in Jesus and his divine economy (his grace and plan, the Blessed Virgin Mary, angels, saints, etc.). One of the Hebrew words for hope is Tikvah. One of the meanings of this word is "thread." Have you ever said, "I'm hanging on by a thread, here!"? Let the thread you're holding onto be Jesus and all will be well, even if it's the thinnest of threads. His light will dispel all darkness and we will begin to see again. Pray, pray, pray. There is wheat everywhere too, by God's help and grace!

I have been assigned as the Administrator at our Family of Parishes. People have been asking me two primary questions: (1) what does it mean to be an Administrator and (2) where are you living? I have answers!

First, "What does it mean to be an Administrator?" Monsignor Halfpenny was the Temporary Administrator of the Family. He was here, from start to finish, with the understanding that he was here on a time-limited basis to assist our parishes in the interim period until they assigned a new Administrator and Pastor. Monsignor is a mentor, brother and friend of mine and I was so happy to be with him at Shrine and now to come to our Family after him. I am grateful to him for everything he has done for our Family.

As the Administrator, this is the Archdiocese's newer way of assigning Pastors, especially priests who are new pastors. We are placed at a parish as "Administrator" for one year before being officially named "Pastor" as a way to observe the right "fit" and to give all of us a chance to ease into our family relationship together. I have been informed that this will likely be a longterm assignment for me and I am very happy about that! My hope and goal is to do whatever God tells me to do ... and my private desire is to be here, in our Family, for many years as your pastor. So, the concept is the same, whether discussing Administrator or Pastor, but think of this as the initial phase of becoming pastor.

The answer to the question, "Where are you living?" is a bit more complicated. I keep telling people, "My heart, prayer and office hours reside at all three places equally ... and I will be physically living at Holy Family." Sometimes there can be mixed feelings about this. There can be hidden thoughts and feelings behind that question that might even hit a wound. There can be an unspoken question asked between the lines, "Are you going to love me/us as much as the others, or will I be forgotten among the many obligations and other family members?" I will always do my best to be present with you and love you. You are lovable so it won't be that hard! LOL! I have an understanding love for each and all of you that change can be difficult. Sometimes it's very welcomed and other times it can bring up some serious and legitimate questions, maybe spanning back to past hurts and wounds in the parish or in families. Just know that I have the good of all in mind as we serve and worship God together and love our neighbor as ourselves.

We are one family in geographic location, in the Faith, and in the human family. Driving to St. Mary's the other day, about ³/₄ of the way to the church, I saw a St. Augustine Festival lawn sign at a house. Where does one parish begin and the other end? We are all in the same boat; many are farmers and all are hard workers and show great kindness. We may have a shortage of priests, but not a shortage of hope, hospitality and love with God. Let's always think, talk about, and pray for our different church communities within our Family with great affection and ready to lend a helping hand to the one in need. Let's pray for each other constantly!


Cherish your community, certainly — but beware of the lure of the Catholic Bubble. We are called to be yeast in the loaf of bread, and yeast is nothing on its own.


