From Fr. Mark Livingston

Sell the world, buy God's Kingdom ... and gain everything!

There are two main realities that result after this life—heaven and hell. Scripture tells us in the story of the rich man and the poor beggar, Lazarus, that a great chasm exists between heaven and hell. These are the two ultimate destinations in the spiritual life. As Catholics, we talk about Purgatory too, which is a reality as well, but it's on the heaven side of things. We might think of Purgatory as the waiting room for heaven. No souls in Purgatory go to Hell; all are saved (CCC 1030-1032). From Catholic Answers, we read that "The Catechism of the Catholic Church defines purgatory as a 'purification, so as to achieve the holiness necessary to enter the joy of heaven,' which is experienced by those 'who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified' (CCC 1030). It notes that 'this final purification of the elect . . . is entirely different from the punishment of the damned' (CCC 1031)." There is clear scriptural evidence for Purgatory in 1 Corinthians 3:11-15, when it says that we will be saved but only as through fire. No souls in the fire of hell are saved, so there must be a saving fire, which is Purgatory. It is the place/state of God's great merciful love to rescue us who are not quite ready for the perfection and beauties of Heaven.

In Matthew 25:31-32, Jesus says we will be separated as a shepherd separates goats and sheep. In this judgment and separation, our sins will be revealed

(Luke 12:2-5). There will be no more excuses or explaining away our behaviors by emotional appeal, etc. It will just happen. The Lord wants us all to be on the sheep (Purgatory and Heaven) side with him forever! It is not his desire that even one of his children be lost to Hell. But, it's us who choose heaven or hell by our attitudes, disposition and choices each day, either conformed to God and his will, or going our own way or the way of the world.

Saint Faustina (Divine Mercy) explained that she had been commanded by God to testify to hell's existence and to give a warning to us. She said, "Let the sinner know that he will be tortured throughout all eternity, in those senses which he made use of to sin. I am writing this at the command of God, so that no soul may find an excuse by saying there is no hell, or that nobody has ever been there, and so no one can say what it is like" (Diary, 741). She further stated that "most of the souls there [in hell] are those who disbelieved that there is a hell." They lived for themselves, not worrying about who they were hurting or affecting by their attitudes, words and actions. God did not want death; he did not make it (Wisdom 1:13-15). God is life! He did not want hell; it was requested by his fallen angels (from a book by the late Fr. Gabriel Amorth, Exorcist of Rome). We chose to experience life apart from God. He allowed it when we chose evil and death rather than good and life in the Garden. We have free choice still today.

Heaven is for those who believe in God and follow him, walking in his

ways. It is the place of perfect, communal, supernatural happiness with God that "eye has not seen and ear has not heard what God has prepared for those who love him." Jesus is clear, though, that "whoever perseveres to the end will be saved" (Mt 24:13-14), not "whoever is flawless will be saved". There's hope for me! This should give each of us great hope! Even if in our past we have committed grave sins that really hurt God, our family and friends, or others, we can humble ourselves, repent, ask for God's forgiveness, and he will give it and save us. Remember that the repentant thief on the cross was promised Paradise "today"! He believed in God, sold all the empty promises and temptations of the world and the Devil, and bought the pearl of greatest price—Jesus and his Kingdom.

It's never too late to come to Jesus. Call on him and come home, regardless of the lie the Devil has fed you/us, like "I'm hopeless" or "it's too late for me" or "I'm too far gone." False! If you have breath and life, you have been given the chance to call on Jesus and HE WILL COME, HE WILL RESCUE AND SAVE YOU. Do not be afraid. He will not be harsh; he is gentle and humble of heart and you will find rest for yourselves. Choose God and life by following His commands, receiving his sacraments and participating in His life. Reject the Devil, sin and death. Come to Jesus in Confession and prayer, and be healed and saved.

DO YOU KNOW SOMEONE IN NEED?

Since December of 2022 Macomb County has been sending a Food Truck to Holy Family on the first Thursday of every month from 10:00am to 12:00pm. Anyone in the state of Michigan who is in need is eligible for a food box. A box containing non-perishables, a pound of ground beef, a pound of lunch meat, fresh fruit or vegetables, and some form of juice or milk is provided. The person seeking to receive a box only needs to provide their name, address, and number of people in the family.

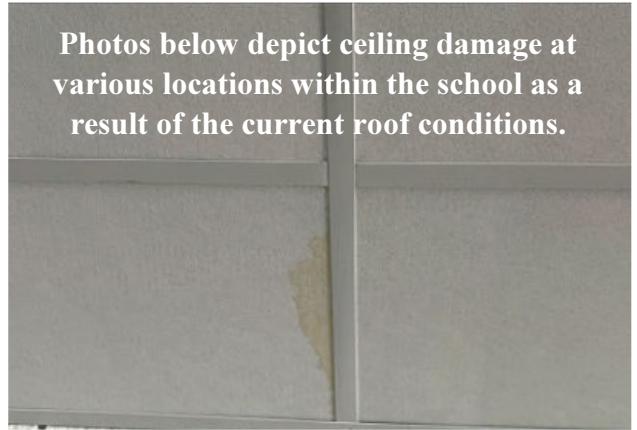


All river rock will be removed. No rock will be used with new roof system.

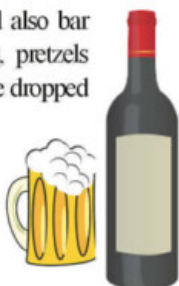

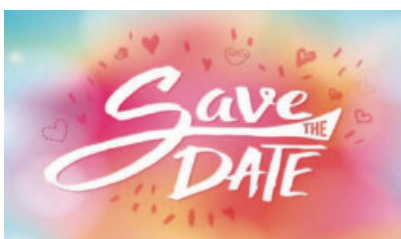
