From Ordinary to Extraordinary

Jesus is the Son of Man, who transforms our ordinary humanity into something supernatural and extraordinary. When did Jesus say he was God? He did say it eventually when the high priest confronts him, demanding, “tell us plainly are you the Son of the Most High God?!” Jesus answers him, “I AM, and you will see the Son of Man coming on the clouds of heaven,” which is the name for God dating back to the burning bush with Moses. After that statement, Jesus is crucified for “blasphemy.” He has many other titles in the New Testament that are foreshadowed in the Old—Messiah (God’s saving anointed one), Emmanuel (God with us), Eternal King (2 Samuel 7), and Son of Man. In each of these titles, Jesus is claiming to be God in an Old Testament Jewish way. He is revealing himself to us as the fulfillment of the Jewish scriptures. He is the one they have been waiting for! Many recognize this and follow him; many others do not.

The “Son of Man” title or concept is found in several places in the Old Testament—in our first reading this Sunday, in the Book of the Prophet Daniel, in Ezekiel, and in Genesis. The name “Adam” means “man”—the first man was simply named “Man.” There is a curious statement made by God in

Genesis 3 while he is speaking to the woman and the serpent. He says, “I will put enmity between your offspring and hers, HE will crush your head and you will bruise his heel.” In this translation of the Old Testament, the “son of Man” (Adam) will crush the head of the serpent. This is amazing! Jesus is the Son of God (divine), descended of Adam in the line of humanity (Son of Man), whose kingdom (as king) will be established forever (promised to King David in 2 Samuel 7), and who is God among us (Emmanuel) born of the Virgin (Isaiah). He is God and will accomplish all things. Our lives are in his hands. Despite being the all-powerful God, he came personally and intimately to be close with us and among us; to be like us in all things but sin.

The story of the feeding of the 5,000 is an extraordinary account of Jesus’ superabundant providence for each and all of us. He was given very little and He made of it a great feast for all ... and there was still a lot left over. Imagine how much you could save on groceries! This account is found in all four Gospels—Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. It is the fulfillment of the story of Elisha the prophet who multiplies loaves (2 Kings 4:42-44) in the Old Testament by God’s power (Jesus’ power).

We might think of this story not so much about loaves and fish, but about the message for us in life. Jesus comes to fulfill this and to show us that he will magnify our gifts and efforts. He has

superabundant grace and mercy to give to each of us. We can’t imagine what he can do for those who believe. This is a great exchange that benefits us most! We give him what little we have in the tank—our loaves and fish—and he gives us all of the superabundant treasures of heaven. Our loaves and fish come in different forms, like our energy, time, prayers, gifts and talents, etc. He wants us to try and persevere to the end. He will magnify what little we give him and make us bear superabundant fruit. I remember when my aunt was sick with cancer, I prayed for her healing. She died and I was upset. I cried out to God why he didn’t spare her because I was faithful in prayer. After that prayer, my eyes were opened and I saw clearly. The doctors reported that she had 6 months to live and God gave her 6 years. I wanted her to be rescued from early physical death. God wanted her family and friends to come back to him too; all were praying and many came back to God more firmly. There is no doubt in my mind that my aunt was saved and rests in the love of God now. Mission accomplished! Let’s be faithful to God and give him our loaves and fishes, especially our trust, and let him bear his supernatural fruitfulness in his perfect timing.

I would like to begin by thanking you for the generous donation to the Pantry Project through the Alms Giving during Lent. For those of you that do not know what the Pantry Project is, please allow me to explain.

The Pantry Project was created in 2019 through Rustic Ramblers 4-H Club where my husband, Loren, son, Scott, daughter-in-law, Lucy, and myself are 4-H leaders (it is fitting to tell you about this since we are also parishioners of Holy Family). Through this program the leaders, 4-H kids, and their parents fundraise by selling candy bars, pizza kits, cheesecakes, and spring and fall flowers, as well as hosting a Day on the Farm, Bowling Fundraiser, and Wine Tasting. Donations are also sought to raise money.

The purpose of this initiative is to help the 4-H kids and our community. We go to the St. Clair County 4-H Livestock Sale and bid on animals that the kids are not getting bids on, or they are receiving very low bids. After purchase, we have the animals processed and the meat is then donated to local Food Pantries. Thus helping the kids and the hungry. Last year we were able to donate a ton (2000 pounds) of meat to nine pantries. This year, through our purchases and some very generous donations of hogs, we estimate to be able to donate 3500 pounds of meat to fifteen or more pantries.

I feel so blessed to be part of this amazing parish and 4-H community. God is so good. Thank you again for helping those less fortunate. So much can be done when we all work together. May God Bless you all.

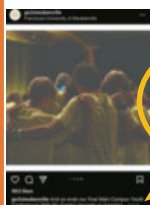

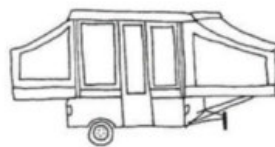

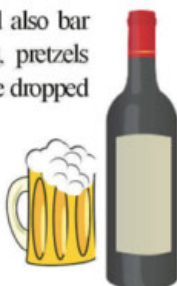
