In accordance with the guidelines of the Province of Michigan, engaged couples must contact the Parish Office six months prior to the desired date of marriage and complete required preparation.



There is an experience in the spiritual life that changes, even annihilates in a pure and beautiful sense, your senses and It's a true encounter with the will. Living God that makes you want to give up everything material you thought was of value in this life and follow the Lord. All other consolations of earthly life pale in comparison. You have met the Lord of Glory himself. You have encountered Peace that you never thought was possible. You have experienced Rest that you did not know you needed. You have the certitude of faith that opens every door and dispels every anxiety and fear. Everything is different from that dav forward. No drug or new relationship, no new material item will ever come close to matching what you have experienced in the Lord. What St. Augustine said so many years ago is true, "My heart was restless until it rested in you [Lord]." When this true, lasting and beautiful revelation of Jesus happens, our proper and appropriate response is to bow down to the ground before him. It's all we can do. It's all we want to do. We might call this a theophany, or an experience of the revelation of God, also known as a "mountaintop experience."

There are many mountaintop experiences recorded in scripture and in the writings of the saints. Elijah experienced it on Mount Carmel, Moses on Mount Sinai, and Peter, James and John on Mount Tabor (with Jesus'

Transfiguration). There are many more. They go to the mountain to be alone (not lonely) in solitude with the Lord, to experience his presence and gentle calm, receive his rest, and hear his voice, listening for the "tiny whispering sound" or the "still small

voice." God isn't often found in the flashy, "wow" experiences of fireworks. violent storms, and distraction. He is most clearly found in the quiet stillness of for the silent prayer. Remember the effect he had on the storm in the Gospel this weekend? He calmed it. He calms us; reminding us to "Be not afraid" because he is with us.

He wants us to experience rest in and through him. This is why people go on retreat, away from the world-to pray, listen, receive graces from God, and respond appropriately.

It's a loud world and our hearts really long for the silent stillness and rest that only God can give. But, God doesn't just meet us on retreats and in hours of rather. he meets adoration, us everywhere if we are open to hearing his still, small voice, even at work and in the activities of daily life. We often aren't prepared to hear him. We have our ear buds in constantly, or staring at our phones, or need to talk constantly about

subjects with anyone who will listen. Maybe God's just calling us to listen in prayerful silence to him and each other.

Is it time for you to take a retreat? There are men's, women's and couple's retreats offered at local Catholic retreat centers, like Manresa, Columbiere, and St. Paul of the Cross. There are retreats for teens and people discerning their vocational call in life. There are retreats for people who have suffered loss, others who need to experience healing after abortion, and still others who want healing in another aspect of life. Maybe we should start an annual retreat for people in our Family of Parishes? Outside of retreats, when do you spend time with Jesus in adoration, letting him look at you and you look at him in silent stillness? When you are in a crowded place, can you still have stillness in the "monastery of your heart," knowing that God is with you and you can converse with him even in the middle of the activity of a local fair, big family gathering, or busy service project? Carve out time in your daily scheduled to pray. It doesn't have to be a dedicated hour, but maybe it could be. Jesus is waiting to calm your storm and give you peace. Our natural response to his incredible goodness and love is to worship him.

**Q.** Why did the Catholic Church change the title of the Book of the Apocalypse to the Book of Revelation? Didn't Martin Luther remove this book from the bible because it was not inspired by God and impossible to understand? Why has the Church allowed this book to remain in our bible?

**A.** Luther removed several books from the bible; the Book of the Apocalypse was just one of them. It was written by the Apostle John. Most scholars believe he wrote it sometime shortly before 70 AD, just before the destruction of Jerusalem. The word "apocalypse" simply means revealing or unveiling. In reality the words revelation and apocalypse have the same meaning.

In our society however, the word has morphed to be misunderstood as calamity or disaster on a grand scale, a holocaust.

It appears the Holy Spirit had a two fold message in writing this book through John. First, was to encourage Christians to remain faithful during this time of horrible persecution. Second, to warn them of things that would "soon" come to pass (Revelation 1:1).

John describes a vision of his being caught up into heaven "on the Lord's Day" (Sunday). He witnessed the very same mass being celebrated in heaven as they celebrate here on earth. Now that had to be enormously encouraging to Christians who risked being fed to lions if caught attending mass. The early Church, established by Jesus, had a full understanding of the meaning of the symbols, numbers and imagery John used. The Church was not only familiar with the symbolic language, she was the intended recipient. If, however, his letter fell into Roman hands, its message would not be understood.

In 70 AD Roman forces destroyed the Temple and burned Jerusalem to the ground. Thousands of Jews were slaughtered. Bible scholars believe there is archeological evidence to suggest that Christians, heeding John's warning, left

the city before the Roman siege began. Scott Hahn's research leads him to believe that no Christians died in this holocaust. They did indeed understand the message in this letter from the Apostle.

John wrote this letter in a style known as Apocrypha which was most common in the 400 year period between 200 BC and 200 AD., but dates back to 1,800 BC. The images and symbols he used were known to the recipients because they were drawn from the Old Testament, ancient Jewish writings and folklore. Yet, if the letter fell into the hands of the Romans, they would not understand the message.

There are four methods used to interpret the Book of Revelation:

> Prederist is a description of only past occurrences. Historistic illustrates various stages of Church history. Futurist describes only what is vet to happen in the end times. This is the most common view today. It is, however, condemned by the Church as a heresy. *Idealist* is the view held by most Church Fathers. This view contends the book is a description of the on-going spiritual struggle that every Christian and the Church faces in every generation, which will culminate with the second coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. There is a fifth method which is a blend of all of the above.

Finally, we can be thankful that the Holy Spirit guided this Church when assembling the canon of Sacred Scripture. In so doing, we have the Book of the Apocalypse from which to draw much encouragement. The revelation that the battle has already been won against evil is illustrated here more than in any other book in the bible. How could anyone, who understands the message, not recognize this is truly a Holy Spirit inspired book? As for why the Church has not removed the Book of the Apocalypse from our bible? I think the answer is clear. The Holy Spirit is at the helm keeping the Church from making such blunders.


