From Fr. Mark Livingston

Thanks be to God for a great St. Augustine festival last weekend, and a terrific Armada fair, despite the torrential rains at the start! I'm so grateful to all of the volunteers who gave so selflessly of their time and energy this week. You make our parishes amazing places and I am so grateful to God for each one of you. I was especially encouraged to see how many individuals from St. Augustine and Holy Family assisted at the Armada Fair food booth, and how many people from St. Mary and Holy Family attended the St. Augustine festival. I am so happy that our communities operate well as one Body in Christ! And there's plenty of room at the table for more!

Each and every person is called to enter the kingdom of God and remain with Lord forever. Those of us in the household of the Lord already are called to invite more people into his household! Our gospel this weekend is tricky, but it gets to the heart of this understanding.

Jesus is in the Gentile (non-Jewish) region of Tyre and Sidon, the region north of the Sea of Galilee. He and his disciples intentionally go there. While there, a Syrophoenician Gentile woman approaches them to heal her daughter. At first glance, it seems like Jesus gives an almost rude reply to her, saying "I was sent only to the lost sheep of the house of Israel" and "it is not right to give the food of the children to dogs." It is true

that in Matthew 10:6, Jesus commands his disciples to go only to the lost sheep of Israel. It is also true that in Matthew 28, the last chapter of his Gospel, Jesus commands his disciples to "go out to all nations, baptizing them...". The story of this woman in Tyre and Sidon is the turning point of the gospel, returning from "Jewish people only" to "all people."

Jesus wanted the children of the promise (Israel) to have a chance at conversion first. But that did not mean that non-Jewish people were excluded from his saving plan. It is shockingly true that Jesus called this woman a dog. We cannot deny it. We also cannot deny that he never sinned. How can these two exist at the same time?

In Jesus' time and prior to his bodily arrival on earth, it's very well documented that a common slur was to call someone a dog. It was common to call the pagans of the region this name because of their worship of false gods, sacrificially offering their children to false gods, and immoral practices. Conversely, the pagan nations called the Israelites dogs, too. There are many passages in the Bible about this. It was a great insult.

In our gospel, we have to picture the scene to understand it. This was a public interaction, mainly in the presence of his disciples. The woman approaches and falls on her knees in front of him and his

disciples, begging him for mercy. No doubt, Jesus knew their hearts. It's even quite possible that some of them said in their hearts, "Get this dog away from him!" They want him to send her away, not heal her daughter! The Greek word ἀπολύω (apolyō) is translated here "send" in the context of "send her away." This is a very interesting word choice, because it more accurately means "to loose her" (from a bondage or connection) or "set her free." Jesus intends to do just that! While his disciples mean send/apolyo in the sense of "get rid of her, she's bothering us," Jesus wants to set her and her child free from the distress and affliction that she's suffering from ... because of her faith IN HIM. And he does set her free and heal her daughter.

This must've been shocking for his disciples to witness. It must've felt strange to them because they were told only to go to Israelites and then they see Jesus healing a Gentile woman. Was the Messiah really helping their historical enemies? With Jesus there are no enemies and no strangers; there are only potential friends and family members in Christ. That's why he asks us to pray for people who hurt us.

I once visited the Air Force Academy, and saw a plaque of a famous instructor that said something like, "when we are outnumbered by the

God and the Good Strong Wind

My only real memory of the Mackinac Island ferry was the physical sensation of the wind against my face. I remember, distinctly, that it hurt.

It surprised and confused me because wind had never felt painful before. Looking back now, I realize that it wasn't just the wind but the spray from the waves that crashed against the side of the ferry — that was what produced the sharp, biting sensation on my skin. But I couldn't have known that then, because my eyes were clamped shut. I refused to open them, even if I had, I would not have seen much, because my long hair was blown straight across my face.

I was four years old, and it was, in the immortal words of Winnie-the-Pooh, a very blustery day as my family made our way to Mackinac Island. I remember thinking I was going to die. I'm positive now that it wasn't really all that dramatic, but at four years old, you're awfully scared of a good strong wind. Deep inside, aren't we all, really?

I think of the apostles who cannot recognize Christ — their friend — because he is doing something new. Something impossible. They are so sure he is a ghost, a sinister thing — children are always frightened of what they cannot understand.

And even when he reassures them, still Peter is not convinced. He demands, essentially, a miracle. He demands that Christ make him do what only Christ can do.

And even when the miracle takes place — he walks on water, he defies physics — still he is human. Scared, doubtful, distractible. No match for a good strong wind.

Mail Call

Q. My wife and I, along with several of our Catholic friends have become concerned with our Church. It appears that we are capitulating to worldly influences. Pro choice priests, bishops shutting down mass per governmental mandate and the Pope leaning towards new age philosophy. Maybe this is why mass attendance is declining?

A. Perhaps this perception, right or wrong, is indeed a contributing factor in a decline in mass attendance. However, there is a list of many factors that are affecting all of Christianity in every denomination all around the world. Let's not forget MSM has often twisted and even fabricated stories about our Church. No matter what our concerns may be, as Catholics, deserting mass is the exact opposite of what our response needs to be.

Consider our Church when it was in its embryonic form. There were twelve men in a fishing boat on the Sea of Galilee. A violent squall came up. The boat began taking on water. They feared for their lives. They called out to Jesus and they were saved. Jesus then asked them *"where is your faith?"* (Luke 8:22-25). This question is as relevant for us today as it was then. Where is OUR faith?

None of those men in that boat considered jumping ship, instead they called on the Lord. We can do the same. This Church has been under attack since the day of Pentecost. Sources, both external and internal, have been battering this boat for two thousand years. We need not fear, Jesus promised to be with us until the end of the age (Matthew 28:20).

We are free to disagree with bishops and popes. We are not free to undermine their authority. We did not put these men in office, God did. These men do not

answer to us. They answer to God. We do not know the Lord's plan, but rest assured he has a perfect plan. History is replete with examples of God turning sorrow into joy and anxiety into peace, even death into life. Jesus told his followers that although the scribes and Pharisees were hypocrites, they sit on the Chair of Moses, obey them. (Matthew 23:1-3)

We understand that it would have been foolish for the disciples to have climbed overboard into the sea's abyss. It would be equally foolish for us to abandon ship. As thousands of followers were walking away from Jesus he asked the twelve if they were leaving too. Peter answered: *"where would we go, you have the words of life"* (John 6:68). Where have our AWOL parishioners gone? Into what abyss have they jumped? What do they risk losing for all eternity? Who might they be dragging along with them?

Scripture records that *"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday, today, and forever."* (Hebrews 13:8) This same Jesus is just as much present in his Church today as he was in that boat 2,000 years ago. The sacraments are still as effective today as ever. Anyone who leaves the Church, for any reason, is risking grave eternal consequences. However, to leave because you disapprove of the man God has placed in the Chair of Peter may be especially dangerous. Let God be God as he works to accomplish his purpose. In the meantime, we should earnestly pray for those that God has placed in authority, whether or not they have our personal approval. In these turbulent times we need to double down on receiving the Eucharist, not walk away.

enemy in a dog fight, don't think of it as a problem, think of it, rather, as being given plentiful targets!" My friends, let's not look at the world or each other as "enemy territory," but as potential Christian family member territory! Let's boldly go out and, in a normal and approachable way, invite people to consider believing in Christ and his Church, whether that's at the St. Augustine festival, the Armada Fair, an upcoming event at Holy Family, Kroger, or wherever!

I want to challenge you this week to say "God bless you" to someone in a public place, or invite someone to church with you, offer to pray for/with someone on the spot, or even talk to a person about Jesus. We're all in different places with different comfort levels because of our temperaments and other factors. But let's never be afraid to say the name of Jesus in public and to invite others to try to get to know and love him too. There is plenty of room at the Lord's table; no one needs to beg for scraps.

God bless you and thank God this week for his gift of conversion.
