# From Fr. Mark Livingston

By God's divine plan he has given us parish patron saints! Beginning this year, we will be celebrating our parish feast days going forward! This is hopefully exciting for each of us. It isn't meant to be a burden added to an already very busy fair and festival season, but rather a time to relax together as a family and pray. This year, we will keep everything simple. In future years, I would like to have a special Mass celebrating our respective parish feast days, to which prior priests will be invited to concelebrate and we will have a potluck "picnic" or other simple party to spend time together. This week, on Monday, August 28th we celebrate the feast day of St. Augustine. He was the bishop of Hippo in northern Africa and underwent a famous conversion from paganism and living a very worldly life to completely converted to Christ. It was his undying thirst for truth that led him to The Truth, Jesus Christ. He famously said in his work called Confessions, "My heart was restless until it rested in you." This is a great truth for each of us. No material or relational thing in this world will ever satiate our thirst for God. We will remain thirsty and restless until we finally find rest in Jesus and his Church.

The Lord is our strength and our refuge. Jesus said on the cross, "I thirst." He was thirsty for water long before that moment. He meant something much deeper. He thirsts for you, your faith, your love, your devotion. We thirst for him too, though many do not even know what might satiate their thirst and dissatisfaction with life, and they try to fill it with everything but God. This year, we have a unique and important opportunity to satiate the thirst of Christ and our own thirst by going much deeper into our understanding and lived experience of the Eucharist.

Next summer, we will be celebrating the National Eucharistic Congress, at



Lucas Oil Stadium Indianapolis, in Indiana, with 80,000+ Catholics, from July 17-21, 2024. This year is dedicated to the Eucharist and preparation for the upcoming Congress. Formation on the

Eucharist is critical during this time. I plan to do this with a Eucharistic focus in catechesis and parish formational opportunities, along with adoration in different forms. I, along with my brothers in the clergy and other lay leaders, will be writing articles and producing (or distributing) videos on our beautiful Catholic Faith, especially on the "Hidden Jesus," to quote the visionaries of Fatima, in the Most Blessed Sacrament, or the Eucharist. To quote the documents of Vatican II, the Eucharist is the "source and summit" of our faith. He is our origin and destination. Let's chat about him and how to receive him.

## Who Do You Say That I Am?

I once knew a very devout woman whose adult godchild had fallen away from the practice of the faith. This godchild still believed in God, and even felt a sense of belonging in the Church. He was a good and kind person. But poor catechesis and a society that confuses pleasure with joy had left him lax in practice, without an appreciation of the sacraments. He was making choices that threatened his soul.

His godmother wanted more for him. She planned to speak with him about his life, hoping to encourage him to return to the practice of the faith. She knew that, when she brought this up, he would reply that it wasn't important to attend Mass or to receive the Eucharist, that was all just "extra."

She told me that she was going to begin their conversation by asking him the question Jesus poses to Peter in Matthew 16:15 — the critical question in all our lives, the question whose answer will define what we become in this world and the next.

Her godson knew the answer. She was confident, unshakably, that he did. He may have forgotten it or ignored it. He may have tried to convince himself he wasn't entirely sure. He may have refused to give an answer. But he knew it. He knew the answer.

There is a reason that, after Peter's response, Jesus gives him the keys to the kingdom of heaven.

"Who do you say that I am?"

Let our whole lives be our answer.

**Q.** What are the major Catholic doctrines on Mary? I have heard there are four and I have heard there are five, which is it? What are they? Why is the Blessed Mother not important in most Protestant sects?

**A.** The Blessed Mother is important to all humanity whether or not they recognize her importance in God's plan. She is important because she brought God's Son, the Messiah, into this world so that humanity could gain eternal life (John 3:16). That, in and of itself, should be sufficient. But there is more. Below are five truths concerning Mary:

### 1. <u>Before the foundation of the world</u> <u>God chose Mary, out of all humanity, to</u> <u>be immaculately conceived in order to</u> <u>provide untainted human DNA to His</u> <u>Son.</u>

God operates outside of time and space. He could have chosen any woman who was ever to be born. Out of millions of possible choices, He chose Mary. God spoke of her at the beginning of human creation. He told Satan "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers" (Gen 3:15). God promised something about this woman that would be extraordinary. She is the only person whom God declared would have enmity between her and Satan. It is a trait shared only with the Son, who is God incarnate. In addition, nowhere else in the bible is there any mention of a woman's seed. It's always the seed of a man. The Lord God made her importance quite clear.

## 2. <u>The merits and grace of Christ's</u> <u>redemptive power was applied to Mary</u> <u>at the moment of her conception</u> <u>preserving her from original sin</u>.

The pure, holy second person of the Trinity (Jesus), through whom all things were created (Colossians 1:16), would certainly have created a pure, holy human vessel in which to take on human form Himself. Jesus spent nine months in Mary's womb drawing nourishment from her body as He formed. Holiness

and sin cannot coexist.

3. <u>Mary's perpetual virginity is the</u> <u>natural outcome of giving her total self</u> <u>to God.</u>

Mary's entire life was dedicated fully and completely to God and was lived out as the virgin mother of God's Son and virgin matriarch of His Church.

## 4. <u>Mary's assumption into heaven</u> <u>strengthens our faith for our own bodily</u> <u>resurrection.</u>

Whether she was assumed before or just after her death is a matter of speculation. We do know that Mary was the Ark of the New Covenant. This pure, holy vessel did not see bodily corruption of the grave. There was no corruption in her. History records the area if not the actual burial site of almost all of the first century leaders of the Church, except one, and of all people - the Mother of God. Nowhere in recorded history do we find any mention of Mary dying or being buried. There have never been any Marion relics.

## 5. <u>Mary watches over and protects us</u> <u>through intercession with her Son.</u>

The Blessed Mother is our heavenly intercessor. In ancient times the king's mother was his queen. Her function was to sit at the right hand of her son and provide intercession for the people. For example, King Solomon's mother, Bathsheba, was his queen (1 Kings 2:20). Jesus Christ is the King of kings. His sinless mother is naturally understood to be the Queen of Heaven. It's a title she rightfully holds and a mission she joyfully fulfills.

Over the last 2,000 years volumes have been written about Mary. It's a study well worth the effort. A good starting point would be the book "*Hail Holy Queen*" by Scott Hahn.
