From Fr. Mark Livingston

Greetings to all! It has been a very interesting and grace-filled Summer and I am so thankful for being assigned here and getting to know so many of you. Whether it has been a brief conversation and handshake or hug, or a more in depth meeting or discussion, I am grateful for your time and openness to share your heart, mind and life with me. I hope you always feel at peace knowing that I want to talk to you and get to know you. I love spending time with you and look forward to our encounters.

As promised in my last article, I will be writing about Jesus, the Eucharist, in a series of articles. This is the first one. Our Gospel this weekend is about losing the world and gaining heaven, or gaining the world and losing heaven. What is our focus? Do we see with eyes fixed on heaven, or earth? Eyes fixed on heaven tend to lead us to forgive others because we see the broken humanity in the other, rather than just an annoyance. We tend to participate fully in the life of the Church and perceive the mysteries of God that lay hidden to our sense; we walk by Faith, not by sight. Eyes that are fixed on earth tend to lead us to be overcome by worldly desires and distractions, trying to gain the upper hand over the other, and not perceiving the mysteries of God. To see the Eucharist and love Him, we have to see with eyes fixed on heaven.

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, number 1326, it says, "Finally, by the Eucharistic celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all." Many saints and Catholic theologians have written that the heavenly liturgy is occurring ongoing; it is, in fact, heaven itself. It is the most magnificent liturgy of angels, saints, and God. The singing, wonders, and graces will astound us for all eternity as we are filled to capacity in a level never imagined possible as we worship God together. Heaven is the place and state of perfect supernatural happiness. It's beyond our natural conceptions of joy, happiness, peace, exuberance, etc. It is true that "eye has not seen and ear has not heard what God has prepared for those who love him." At Mass, an incredible union of heaven and earth occurs. God has prepared the mystery of the Mass, especially the Eucharist, for those who love him. We might say, eye cannot see, nor can ear hear if

we don't see the mysteries of the Mass with the eyes of Faith and love for God. In Fatima, one of the visionaries, Francisco, said that he was going to stop and spend time with "Hidden Jesus" at church on his way to and from school. He would stop into the church and pray, frequently spending time with his beloved "Hidden Jesus." He meant Jesus in the disguise of bread and wine in the Eucharist. Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist! When we receive the host, we consume his body. When we drink the cup, we consume his blood. His very precious Body and Blood is meant to be consumed by us. He wants this. In fact, he commanded it, saying, "Do this in remembrance of me." Jesus is God. We consume Jesus' flesh and blood; we consume God. This is truly a marvel and wonder!

In my next article, I will be answering the question, "Is the Eucharist holy and so to be avoided because of our imperfection, or medicine and so all should feel comfortable receiving him?"





Q. Was Martin Luther's Protestant Reformation against the Catholic Church actually a revolt against a corrupt Church? A preacher on YouTube made a convincing argument that there were 95 corrupted practices Luther exposed, and then the preacher asked why anyone would remain Catholic knowing this.

A. Legend records that in the late middle ages Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg. It was his response to a change he felt was desperately needed. There were not 95 separate issues. It's more of a letter with 95 numbered sentences. The issue was the abuse of indulgences by both clergy and laity.

At the time the Church was also embroiled in political struggles and humanist /modernist ideas. People had also become disillusioned by the eroding morality in Church hierarchy. The sale of indulgences and the practice of simony were particularly disturbing to the people. Luther had a legitimate concern which he put forward in his thesis. The Church responded to the concerns and instituted reforms.

I believe Martin Luther's intention was to bring reform to the Catholic Church, and he did. He was a Catholic priest and Augustinian friar. The Reformation had other schismatic protagonists. There were men such as Calvin, Knox, Tyndale, Wycliffe, Zwingli and Henry VIII to name a few. Some had personal agendas, as did King Henry VIII who asked Pope Clement VII to annul his marriage, but the pope refused. Hence the Church of England was born under the control of English monarchs. These and other reformers did not seek to reform the Church, but rather Christianity itself.

It should be noted that few of the issues these early reformers had are at issue today and few of the issues Protestants have today were at issue back then. For example, most early reformers venerated the Blessed Mother. Today, Marion Theology is the most common and strongest

objection Protestants have regarding Catholicism. While Protestant theology is diverse and fluid, the Catholic Church has remained steadfast.

The Catholic Church is the oldest and largest Christian faith community in history. This of course would have been impossible had the Church excluded human beings. Jesus himself established this Church. He knew we would be a hospital for sinners more than a hotel for saints. Human corruption, fueled by satanic forces, has always been present since the beginning. Judas is the premier example of this fact.

As corrupt as things have been, are, or will become, no matter the human frailties and Satan's cunning, this 2,000 year old Church has been and will continue to faithfully teach the same message. What other institution or government is anywhere near 2,000 years old? Humans acting alone cannot establish anything permanent.

The Reformation paved the way for the thousands of different faith communities we have today. Just like the Catholic Church, they too are led by flawed human beings prone to err. Sin is in our nature. We inherit it at conception. By definition being a sinner is a prerequisite for admission into the Catholic Church. Jesus not only knew this when he promised to be with his Church until the end of the age, it is the very reason he made the promise in the first place. He knew we would need his divine power of protection.

Knowing all the facts and putting everything in perspective is the reason Catholics remain Catholic. We are all free to make a choice, we can choose safe, or we can choose sorry. Catholics stick with the Church that Jesus Christ established as redeemer, savior, centerpiece and protector and where the Eucharist is the sum and summit of worship.




