From Fr. Mark Livingston

Happy Sunday! God bless each of you and your loved ones! In my last article, I promised that I would address the somewhat common dilemma in many hearts, "Is the Eucharist holy and so to be avoided because of our imperfection, or medicine and so all should feel comfortable receiving him?" On the one end of the spectrum—the Eucharist is holy and to be avoided because of imperfection—persons often struggle with the torture of scrupulosity, in which a person is plagued by even the slightest imperfections in daily life, including both commissions (acts committed) and omissions (acts not committed but believed they "should have been"). On the other end of the spectrum—the Eucharist is medicine and all should be able to receive him whenever they want-persons often struggle with the presumption of God's mercy, thinking that no matter what sins they have committed, the deserve to receive Jesus as a right even without having to go to confession because "Jesus understands and forgives". The answer is in the middle, not on these two poles of scrupulosity and presumption.

Scripture tells us that some sin is deadly (1 John 5:17). This means that some sin is not. Persons struggling with scrupulosity are tortured with the belief that all sin is deadly and that even things that are just conditions of our broken and fallen humanity, like not noticing the slightest suffering of another in a chaotic

situation are grave sins. They often believe that no sin can really be forgiven and they are hopelessly trapped in a cycle of sin that is seemingly unbreakable. Jesus disagrees; he came to free us.

Persons struggling with presumption, presume (or assume) God's mercy without expressing their repentance in the way Jesus presents to us as the ordinary way, which is Confession or the Sacrament of Reconciliation, especially when we have a committed a mortal sin. This is a terrible spiritual and relational poverty. They believe that all sin will be forgiven simply because they are loved by God and made in his image and likeness. In their hearts and minds there is no need for repentance because "Jesus will understand". Jesus disagrees with them; he came that we would repent, believe, be baptized, celebrate the sacraments ("do this in remembrance of me") and, then, be free and have abundant life!

The conscience is a tricky thing. Some of us have adopted a view that all things are sin. Others have adopted the view that nothing is sin. Both of these come from a troubled conscience. We are called by the Church to form our consciences according to God's teachings in Scripture and Church Teaching (i.e., the Catechism of the Catholic Church). We should not think that "conscience" means "whatever I feel like doing whenever I feel like it". No

way! We are called to discern Truth out of a "well-formed" conscience, conformed to the heart and mind of Jesus. This means that those who struggle with scrupulosity would understand and live his merciful and understanding love for them more, and those who struggle with presumption would understand and live their need for repentance so as not to experience God's justice in the final judgment.

So, "Is the Eucharist holy and so to be avoided because of our imperfection, or medicine and so all should feel comfortable receiving him?" Eucharist is Jesus Christ himself. He is both supremely holy and dwells in unapproachable light and He supremely merciful and approachable. This means that, as we pray, "I am not worthy to enter under your roof ... but only say the word and my soul shall be healed," we speak a profound theological truth. As fallen creatures, we are not worthy to approach God, but he took on our flesh and made us worthy, especially those who believe in him, repent, are baptized and remain in him. In other words, he "said the word" of life, he "worthified" us by his grace, and wants us to be healed through Confession and subsequent reception of the Eucharist.

If you feel like every thought and action is a sin and so feel the need to run

I am reminded of a quote by Dan Coulter who said, "It's an uncommon pleasure to remember someone who believed in you before you were sure you were worth believing in."

I hope we all have teachers we can remember with affection and good memories. As we begin another school year, say a prayer for those people who have made a positive impact on you. It is so true that an inspiring teacher has effects on a child long after they leave their classroom.

to Confession each day for even the slightest perceived offense of God, consider Jesus' merciful love more. Consider how he looks at you with great tenderness and love and wants you to come and receiving him without fear. Why did he come as a baby? To be held by you; to be approached by you. Do not be afraid.

If you feel like you never sin and that God's got you without need for Reconciliation, consider that Jesus said to repent and believe (walk with him your whole life, following the teachings from him passed down through the Church). Read and re-sensitize your conscience, go to Confession before receiving the Eucharist if you are living with mortal sin (full knowledge, free consent of the will, and grave matter), and receive the freedom and healing that you so desperately desire. Be not afraid to tell him the truth and ask for his mercy in Confession. Create a regular habit of confession, say, monthly or as needed because of mortal sin.

The Eucharist is God. God is holy. God is medicine. Tell him in Confession where you need to be healed, receive the merciful love and tender understanding of Jesus, and then approach the Sacrament of holiness and healing, the Eucharist, with confidence in the one to said, "Do this in remembrance of me." What is the best way to receive the Eucharist? With a heart lovingly conformed to Christ.

Q. In 1st Timothy the 3rd chapter God calls all pastors to have their own wife in order to avoid fornication. This is not aimed at the Catholic Church. However the Catholic Church does have trouble with pedophilia. My question is why doesn't the Catholic Church obey God? If the Catholic Church has a problem with the message, the problem is not with me, but rather with God.

A. Of course your charge is aimed at the Catholic Church. However, you missed your target. Taking bible passages out of context to prove a preconceived bias and/or ignoring actual facts is common practice among some. The Church does not have a problem with the message in Sacred Scripture, with God nor with you. The problem here is lifting verses out of context and in the process missing the message.

This passage in I Timothy refers to the qualifications for a bishop. St. Paul's guidelines for priests (presbyters) can be found in Titus 1: 5-9. This instruction to Titus on the selection of presbyters coincides with I Timothy's on a bishop's qualifications. This letter to Titus was aimed at strengthening his authority St. Paul's apostolic mandate to appoint priests.

Most all Christian denominations, including evangelicals fundamentalist, have always interpreted these passages in St Paul's letter to mean that a minister of the Gospel cannot be a bigamist or not be divorced and remarried. It is not a command to Remember bigamy marry. practiced in some places in Paul's time and still is today. If this was a command to marry St. Paul was confused. In I Corinthians 7:7-9 he writes: "Yet I wish that all men were even as I myself am. However, each man has his own gift from God, one in this manner, and another in that. But I say to the unmarried and to widows that it is good for them if they remain even as I. But if they do not have selfcontrol, let them marry; for it is better to marry than to burn with passion."

St. Paul also writes in II Timothy 2:3-4: "Suffer hardship with me, as a good soldier of Christ Jesus. No soldier in active service entangles himself in

the affairs of everyday life, so that he may please the one who enlisted him as a soldier."

Matthew 19:10-12; The disciples asked Jesus, if it is better not to be married? Jesus said to them," Not all men are able to take in this saying, but only those to whom it is given. For there are men who, from birth, were eunuchs: and there are some who were made so by men: and there are others who have made themselves so for the kingdom of heaven. He who is able to receive this, let him receive it."

Do you suggest all young Protestant ministers, missionaries and evangelists, who have yet to marry, should step down until they marry? Are pastors who have never married or are now widowers no longer valid ministers? If so, your position is out of step with most all segments of Christianity. The actual message in the passage you cite instructs us to be temperate, sensible, dignified, hospitable, gentle and not quarrelsome. This is the message.

Last but not least, the charge that pedophilia is a problem of the Catholic priesthood requires ignoring the facts. In 1950 there were 50,502 diocesan and religious-order priests in the United States. In 1965 there were 58,632, in 1970 the number was 59,192 and today there are 37,302. In the time period from 1950 to 2020, 3.91% of priests were accused of some sort of sex crime, including pedophilia. Only .25% of the were found guilty. prevalence of pedophilia in the general population is not known, but among adult men it is estimated to be around 5%. It is also estimated that 65% are married.

Harming children is the vilest crime a person can commit, deserving the maximum penalty the law will allow. Pointing fingers is not the answer to this problem. The Catholic Church is actively and aggressively working in "Protecting God's Children" & "Right to Life" to protect all children. The Church would welcome your involvement.






