

From Fr. Mark Livingston

Greetings in the Lord, my friends! I hope everyone had a good week. In the Catholic Church, we have seven sacraments--Baptism, Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation (which comprise the four sacraments of initiation), and Holy Orders, Marriage and Anointing of the Sick (formerly known as Last Rites). This can cause a lot of confusion in the hearts and minds of folks. The sacraments were instituted by Jesus and can be found in Sacred Scripture. In the Catholic Church we don't believe that the sacraments are merely symbolic. The sacraments are, rather, "efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us" (CCC 1131). So, a sacrament is a sacred and visible sign that is instituted by Jesus to give us grace, an undeserved gift from God. In other words, a sacrament is a sign that renders spiritually and materially present what the sign points to. In baptism, the sign of pouring water (or immersion) tells us some things about the effects the grace has on us. Water cleanses (washes clean), it hydrates and gives us renewed or restored vitality and

refreshment. Water can kill, which is the meaning of the full immersion (dipping under water) in some adult baptisms--we die to sin and death (dipped under water) and rise again in Christ Jesus as we are lifted up out of the water as a new creation. Parents wash their children, so the liturgical

act of a priest or deacon pouring water over the heads of children and The Eucharist is God; Jesus. adults on behalf of God is an adoptive act too. We become adopted children of the Living God in and through the waters of

baptism. Lastly, through God's adoption of us, he makes us into Temples of the Holy Spirit, pure, spotless, with the Holy Spirit dwelling in and with us. So, pouring water is not just a merely human symbol or sign, but "an efficacious sign of [the] grace" imparted by Christ through the Church. Wow!

Consider the sign of the Eucharist! The Eucharist is God; Jesus. What is he telling us about himself and the grace he is imparting by the signs involved in the Eucharist? There are

many, but I will stick with only a few. If you would like to read more about this topic, please read the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) no.1333 to no.1336. Let's focus on bread and wine. Scripture tells us, "He took bread..." and "He took the cup filled with wine..." and those

elements of bread and wine truly become the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ, our Lord and God. What does bread tell us about God and his grace; what does wine? We can think of bread and water as the basic food

elements for life. They are the staples to sustain us. So, let's consider that the sign of bread points us to natural life. What about wine? I asked a group of second graders, "When do you consume bread and wine?" One of them with great innocence and zeal emphatically stated, "For breakfast!" I didn't call the authorities, but I did laugh! I hoped two things: (1) his parents are not allowing him to drink wine for breakfast (or at all!) and (2) that he's not witnessing that being done by someone else in the home!

The answer is that we typically consume a little wine for our health or on occasions calling for joy and celebration! We might say that the sign of wine points us to natural joy and celebration! So, if we look solely at the elements (matter) of the Eucharist -- bread and wine -- we see that the Lord, in giving us his very Body and Blood, is giving us his supernatural life and supernatural joy! Jesus said, "I came that you would life and have it more abundantly" (John 10:10). He takes what is natural (us and our troubled, broken minds and hearts) and makes it supernatural by his Real Presence in us and his grace working in us. Where do you currently feel empty, broken, listless, melancholic, etc.? This is precisely where Jesus wants to give you supernatural life and joy! Prepare for Mass by examination, Confession if necessary, forgiveness of and reconciliation with others (the subject of our weekend readings) and receive the treasury of grace that he has in store for you at each reception of the Most Holy Eucharist.

In my next article, I will attempt to explain how bread and wine become truly the Body and Blood of Jesus in the Mass.

My friends, we need more Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion (EMHC's). Remember that the Lord does not call the qualified, he qualifies the called. Are you being called? That is, have you been feeling a draw to this ministry, or thinking you would like to do it? Consider signing up at our upcoming Liturgical Ministries Fair (really a sign-up blitz) on 9/23 and 9/24!

"Teamwork Makes the Dream Work"

"Teamwork makes the dream work" is a well-known phrase attributed to American Clergyman, John Maxwell. The phrase basically means that two or more people can work together in a positive way to achieve a common goal. Essentially, the ultimate goal is that the task should be easier to accomplish if everyone works together rather than one person taking on the task individually. However, as a teacher, I know that teamwork does not always work out well. Sometimes the team dynamics do not mix well, and there ends up being much more drama than what is necessary. As a result, not much work is accomplished and more frustration ensues. This can happen anywhere - school, the workplace, church groups, and even in our own families.

In my classroom, I teach students to act almost as if they are a family. They are taught to care for and respect one another, to raise each other up whenever possible, and to work well together. I also understand that those things may not come naturally to everyone. So, learning to work together as a team - as a classroom family - takes time, effort, and a lot of patience. My group of eighth graders this year is a very tight knit group, which can make group work much more enjoyable. The group also has a light-hearted sense of humor, and they seem to get along well together, for the most part. To me, these students really embody the following Bible verse:

"As iron sharpens iron, so one person sharpens another." - Proverbs 27:17

Over the summer, the eighth grade class (along with many parents) worked together as a team to create an amazing float for the Richmond Good Old Days Parade. This group came together to create a float for St. Augustine School which represented a theme called "Catching the Wave of Faith." They worked together so well and definitely demonstrated great teamwork!

As a class, they all agreed that teamwork was very important while assembling the float because many of the tasks required more than one person. They spent hours together at four separate meetings making their float and growing stronger as a class family. This group came together and really made me proud! They are learning to work better as a team and communicating more effectively everyday. They have come so far as a class family!

Q. I attend mass regularly. My prayer life however, is sporadic at best. I know the Church teaches that we need to pray. I am just not grasping the necessity. God knows exactly what we need. Why do we really need to pray?

A. (PART 1)

Unfortunately I think you may be representative of a great number of us who either consciously or subconsciously have harbored the same thoughts. Most of us have at one time or another fallen into the doldrums in our prayer life. It's partly our weak human nature and partly our ignorance. There isn't much we can do about human frailty but ignorance is cured by education. We can start with the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 2644 – 2649).

Prayer is communion with our Creator. When we pray, we engage in fellowship with our Heavenly Father. He has graciously opened the door for us to have this covenant relationship with Him through the work of our Savior Jesus Christ. Prayer is central to a Christian life. Prayer is the 2-way avenue God has provided for us to flourish spiritually.

Another benefit from a faithful prayer life is it tunes our hearts so that when the Lord speaks, we are more able to recognize his voice. The Scriptures command us to "pray without ceasing" (1 Thessalonians 5:17) and to be "praying at every opportunity" (Ephesians 6:18), "pray daily" (Matthew 6:11). We are to pray alone and in secret (Matthew 6:6). We are also to pray communally with other believers (Matthew 6:9–13). Prayer can be the foundation for every aspect of our day to day life.

Christianity by definition means we are followers of Jesus Christ. If we follow his example in prayer, we will develop calluses on our knees. Jesus prayed frequently and fervently. Jesus set the example for us to follow. Many people pray only in times of a specific, usually urgent need. It's as if they see God as some sort of cosmic bell-hop instead of the creator of the cosmos.

When we come to realize exactly who God is we will want to have an ever deepening relationship with him.

Once we recognize this father /child connection and the divine love God pours out on us, thanksgiving will automatically flow back to him. Giving thanks to God is expressed in many ways, prayer is the foremost. Prayer keeps us living in God's will. Prayer brings peace and contentment. Prayer heals. Prayer improves situations. Prayer reduces selfish attitudes. Prayer helps overcome temptations. Prayer increases our trust in God which in turn reduces stress in life.

Prayer is not intended to be a self centered list of requests but rather to draw us into an ever deeper relationship with our Heavenly Father. In every normal parent / child relationship there is regular and frequent communication. Imagine having a child who only spoke to you when requesting something then never expressing gratitude. The purpose of our very existence is to worship our Creator. The sincerity of our worship can be measured by our faithful dedication to our prayer life.

Prayer takes four basic forms. The prayer of petition: asking God for our needs, especially forgiveness. The prayer of intercession: asking on behalf of others, including our enemies.

The prayer of thanksgiving is giving thanks in all circumstances. The prayer of praise: the highest form of prayer which is "entirely disinterested and raises to God, lauds him, and gives him glory for his own sake, quite beyond what he has done, but simply because HE IS." (CCC 2649)

Learning the purpose for, meaning of, and riches achieved from prayer can help us reap the many spiritual, emotional and physical benefits that personally communicating with God has to offer. Spend some time daily praying each of the four forms of prayer. Ten thousand years from now you will still be glad you did.

I thank you for this question. It's a wake up reminder for me and I hope for others as well. Stay tuned for PART 2 next week.



Protecting God's Children (PGC)

- Did you take Protecting God's Children prior to January 1, 2020?
- Are you planning to volunteer in our school or any of our parishes?
- All volunteers and employees are required by the Archdiocese of Detroit to recertify by November 1, 2023

The Archdiocese of Detroit is updating their Safe Environments policies. These policies are in place to protect the most vulnerable among us, including children and vulnerable adults. Adherence to these policies is required in every parish and school. The AOD uses an online system called Virtus as the platform for all training, monitoring, and data collection.

Recertification is required for all existing volunteers and employees who completed Protecting God's Children (PGC) before January 1, 2020. Recertification must be completed by November 1, 2023.

- All 100,000+ AOD-registered Virtus users were sent an email (from Virtus) in late June and early July with links for recertification.
- If you did not receive an email about your recertification, log into your existing Virtus account. You should not create a new account if you have taken Protecting God's Children in the past. If you do not remember your username or password, Virtus offers a username and password recovery option at bit.ly/Virtus_Account_Recovery. If you have difficulties accessing your account, contact the Virtus Help Desk (helpdesk@virtus.org / 888-847-8870) or send an email to protectchildren@aod.org.
- Once you have logged into your Virtus account you should see the assigned training under the Home tab / Current Training.
- The self-paced modules (Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults) are entirely online and take approximately 2.5 hours to complete.
- You can stop and start as you need to complete training at your convenience.

Existing Volunteers who have NEVER taken a PGC session before:

- A PGC session must be completed by November 1, 2023. The self-paced modules (Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults) are entirely online and take approximately 2.5 hours to complete. Register online at bit.ly/Virtus Registration
- You can stop and start as you need to complete training at your convenience.

New Employees and New Recurrent Volunteers

- All new employees and new recurrent adult volunteers must register on the Virtus platform (bit.ly/Virtus Registration)
- You must be certified before commencing your role.
- You are required to register for a live session of Protecting God's Children training (either in person or by Zoom) and the online self-paced Vulnerable Adults training will be assigned to you.

New occasional adult volunteers (1-3 times per year volunteer), even those who do not serve in a direct role working with vouth, must be trained.

- You must register on the Virtus platform and complete training before volunteering (bit.ly/Virtus Registration)
- You may complete your certification either:
 - 1. entirely online at your convenience with the self-paced training modules for Protecting God's Children and Vulnerable Adults, or
 - 2. by attending an in-person or live Zoom session for Protecting God's Children and completing the self-paced Vulnerable Adults module online.


