Contact the parish office for hospital or home visits.

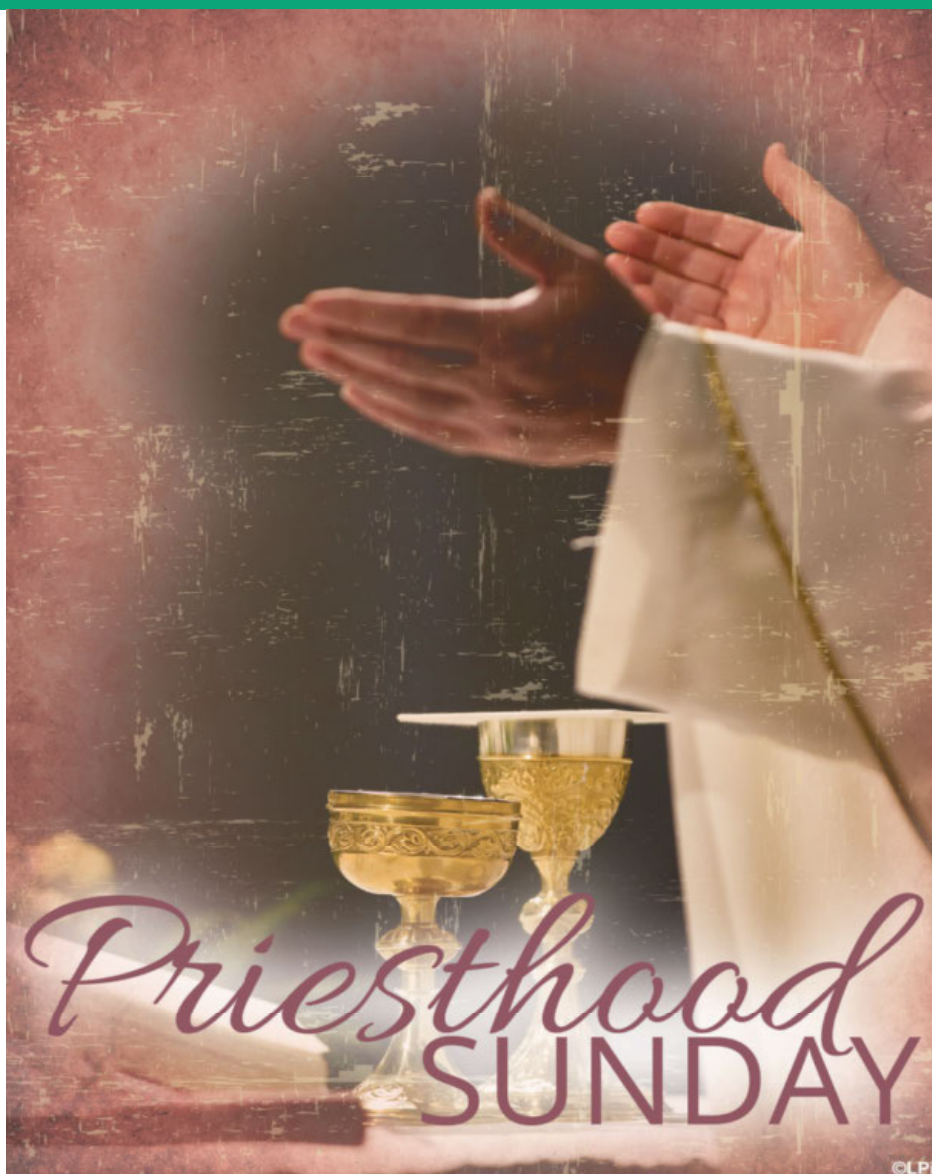

From Fr. Mark Livingston

God's lavish mercy is astounding, bringing us to tears because of his utter generosity. In order to experience the fullness of his merciful love for each of us, we have to understand the justice we deserved before he gave us his mercy. Whether we are early or late to the vineyard, the Lord will give the full inheritance of his Kingdom to those of us who believe and walk in his ways. The greatest and most generous gift of God that we have been given now as a precursor to heaven is the Eucharist, the very Body and Blood of Jesus.

In our liturgy (Mass) and theology, we use two big words that really need some explaining because they come from Aristotle and St. Thomas Aquinas—*consubstantiation* (with the same substance) and *transubstantiation* (across the substance). In order to explain very difficult concepts of what a given thing's being and essence is, they had to develop and expand upon a specialized philosophical language, using the terms "substance" and "accidents" to explain a thing's essence. Everything that exists consists of substance (the what-ness of a thing) and accidents (the attributes of the thing being discussed). Substance is that thing-ness that underlies the accidental properties of a thing. Accidental properties are characteristics or attributes (like quality, quantity, space, location, time, or another attribute) that could be otherwise and, by changing them, the substance of the thing does not change. For example, consider me. I am Fr. Mark. That is my substance. If I changed one of the accidental properties of my exterior appearance and dyed my hair blonde from brown/ grey, I would still be Fr. Mark but a property said of me (i.e., brown hair) has changed. Because I changed my hair color (an accidental property), my substance—Fr. Mark-ness—has not changed. Only a change of substance (or the "what-essentially-makes-it-

that-thing") would change the thing, though the appearance could be different. For example, burning a log changes the substance of wood to another substance, ash/ dust. What does this have to do with the Eucharist? It gives us the explanatory language and tools to discuss how it happens!

When we speak of the Eucharist, consider this illustration. If I was holding a Bible that had the cover and the pages of the Bible and I asked you what it is, you would be right to say it is the Bible. What if I took all of the pages of the Bible out of the Bible cover and replaced the pages of the Bible with the pages of the hymnal? Is it still the Bible even though the cover says "Holy Bible"? No! Why not? Because it underwent a substantive change! The content or essence of the Bible—the pages—has changed! The Bible's "what-ness" has been replaced by the hymnal's content, essence or "what-ness". It still looks like the Bible from the outside and feels like the Bible cover ... but it's not the Bible because the Bible's essence (pages/ content) has changed, though the exterior accidental properties of color, feel, look, etc. have not changed. It looks like the Bible to our senses, but it's not the Bible anymore because it has been substantially changed.

The same is true for the Eucharist! With the right minister (a priest by Apostolic succession), the right intention (to do what the Church does), the right words ("the form" which is Jesus' words at the Last Supper), and the right matter (bread and wine, because that's what Jesus used), the substance of "bread-ness" and "wine-ness" is gone from the bread and wine and the substance of Jesus enters in. Thought of another way, Jesus is there and has assumed the accidental properties of bread and wine (sight, feel, taste, etc.). Because of this interchange of substances, we call it *Transubstantiation*. This means that,

regardless of what you personally believe about the Eucharist and Jesus being really, truly present in the Eucharist, he is there. The substantial change occurs independent of your faith (*ex opere operato*; the work [Eucharist] having been worked [consecrated on the altar]). But, your personal faith determines how fruitful Jesus, the Eucharist, will be in your life (*ex opere operantis*; the work [Eucharist] working [in your life]).

Jesus told us, "Do this in remembrance of me." He wants to do this. He wants us to participate in his saving work at Mass. The natural bread (the sign is life) has, by the power of the Holy Spirit at the altar, become the supernatural "Bread of angels," "Bread of Life," the Body of Christ. The natural wine (the sign is joy) has, by the power of the Holy Spirit at the altar, become the "New Wine of Supernatural Joy," the Precious Blood of Jesus. Some people have said to me, "I consumed the wine today," or "I was a minister of the wine." We never distribute wine to the congregation at Mass. By the time it is distributed, it is the Precious Blood of Christ! We do not distribute bread to the congregation at Mass. We distribute the Precious Body of Christ, who substantively exists while the accidental properties of bread deceive our senses! Faith and logic is our sight. Our words reveal our beliefs. Let's speak how we believe and describe the Eucharist for who HE is – Jesus' very Body and Blood.

What is the best way to receive Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass? With a heart and mind full of faith in the reality of Jesus' Real Presence (Jesus truly, really present, not bread and wine) in the Eucharist.

Q. I attend mass regularly. My prayer life however is sporadic at best. I know the Church teaches that we need to pray. I am just not grasping the necessity. God knows exactly what we need. Why do we really need to pray?

A. (PART 2) *Continued from last week*

Our walk with Christ and perhaps even our eternal destiny is dependent on prayer. Specific prayers such as: “Our Father” which was given directly to us by Jesus. It is the most perfect prayer we have to offer up to God. There are also prayers such as: “Glory Be,” “Hail Mary,” “Rosary,” and “Divine Mercy Chaplet” to name just a few. If we don’t allow ourselves to slip into merely reciting these prayers but rather we engage in full, active, conscious participation in them, they are powerful prayers.

To add richness to our prayer life we can pray the “*Lectio Divina*” which means “divine reading” It’s a prayerful, meditative way of reading the Bible in which we let go of our own agendas and open ourselves to the Holy Spirit’s message to us. While *Lectio Divina* has long been a technique of prayer, there was resurgence in its popularity following publication of *Dei Verbum*, Vatican II’s *Dogmatic Constitution on Divine Revelation*. *Lectio Divina* is scriptural reading, meditation and prayer. It does not treat Scripture as texts to be studied, but rather as God’s living word.

Another guide to prayer that promotes fidelity to our prayer life is the “*Examen*.” This is an opportunity for peaceful daily reflective prayer. This is a spiritual practice of reviewing the day to retune ourselves to the sacred content found in ordinary life. Usually done in the evening and lasting 15–20 minutes the prayer prompts us to call to mind God’s presence during our day, express gratitude, reflect on the day and prepare for tomorrow. It invites us to find God in the events of our day. The *Examen* is simply a set of introspective prompts for us to follow, modify, adapt to our own.

If you are unfamiliar with *Lectio Divina* or *Examen* guides to prayer, visit your favorite Catholic website and search for instructions. Try applying one or both for just two weeks. You will discover

that your grasp on the importance of prayer has greatly improved. If you do not have access to the worldwide web, not to worry, watch for a bulletin insert next week for detailed guides to both.

We mortals cannot fathom how God can exist outside of space and time. We cannot grasp how he could have existed before he even created space and time. These things are beyond us. Nevertheless this same AWESOME creator, out of love created us to love, worship and serve him. Yet he understands our human frailty. We need not beat ourselves up when we have fallen short. All he expects from us is to sincerely work to correct our errors. Correcting inadequacies in our prayer life is one of the easiest, immediately rewarding things we can do.

In the final analysis, prayer is not complicated. Imagine sitting down with one of your best friends and having a conversation about: 1. How very much you appreciate them. 2. Something specific they said or did that encouraged, strengthened, or motivated you. 3. Your hopes and dreams for those you love, perhaps naming them individually. 4. Confiding about the mistakes you may have made. 5. How good or bad your day went. Or 6, a myriad of other topics you talk to your best friend about. Now sit down with the best friend you will ever have, Jesus Christ, and have these same conversations with him. That is how we pray. We simply talk normal and direct it to God.

A faithful prayer life is as important to our spiritual being as oxygen is to our physical being. We do not trek through our day trying to hold our breath until we lose consciousness; at least normal people don’t do that. Our eternal life is far more important than our temporary physical life here on earth. Let’s all find a place to be alone with God and take a long, deep spiritual breath. Then, as St Paul instructed us in 1 Thessalonians 5:17, “breathe pray without ceasing.”

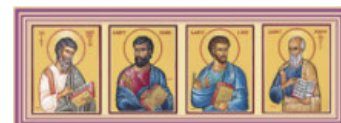

Put God First By Rose Chrcck Middle School Teacher

"Put God First. In everything you do, put God First." Those are the words that make up the first two sentences from a commencement speech given by the actor Denzel Washington at Dillard University in 2015. I came across this speech a few days before school started, and I was so moved by its simple yet powerful message (true Denzel fashion), I decided it was a "must view" for my 8th graders during the first week of school.

Denzel gives many simplistic examples from his own life of how putting God first has helped him to work hard, become successful, find joy, and stay humble. When I thought about this mindset of putting God first, it didn't take long for me to come up with some examples of how we live this lifestyle right here at school.

Putting God first comes naturally at St. Augustine School. Each morning we pray together as a school family. No matter what, we pray! If Mrs. Lenn is at a meeting, another staff member will take her place to lead us in prayers. There is consistency in this daily routine. We put God first every Thursday when we meet God in the Eucharist during mass. We show discipline by being on time and prepared for the mass. We put God first by saying grace with our classmates before we eat lunch. There is something so powerful about putting God first together as friends rather than by ourselves.

When we put God first at St. A's, there is a quiet confidence that grows in each child, the fruit of the relationship they are building as they get to know God on a deeper level. This confidence tells them that they are not alone-Jesus is with them through their best and worst moments. This confidence shines through our stu-

dents in the risks they are not afraid to take, in their failures as they look to make improvements and grow, and in their successes when they remain humble. It is my prayer that ALL kids could experience this peace and confidence that infuses the soul when God is your first priority.

Putting God first in your families will bear that same fruit of confidence. Imagine the graces our students would receive when God is top priority at school and home! It's no secret, the kids whose families put God first are more disciplined, obedient, and natural leaders. They are not afraid to fail or work hard. The great thing about putting God first is it's never too late to get better at it. With discipline and consistency, saying prayers and attending mass each weekend will become routine, and when you start to get off track, you will definitely feel that longing for God.

I would like to share part of the prayer Denzel Washington ended his speech with -the 8th graders gave it an A+. (Just a little hint though, if you insert Denzel's voice while you read through it, it sounds even better!)

"I pray that you put your slippers way under the bed tonight so that when you wake up in the morning, you have to get on your knees to reach them, and while you're down there say thank you for grace, mercy, wisdom, understanding, and parents. Thank God in advance for what is already yours."

Putting God first through prayer, celebrating mass, and giving our best effort in what we do, helps us to appreciate all of the gifts God has put in our lives, especially the gift of our Catholic faith.
