Contact the parish office for hospital or home visits.

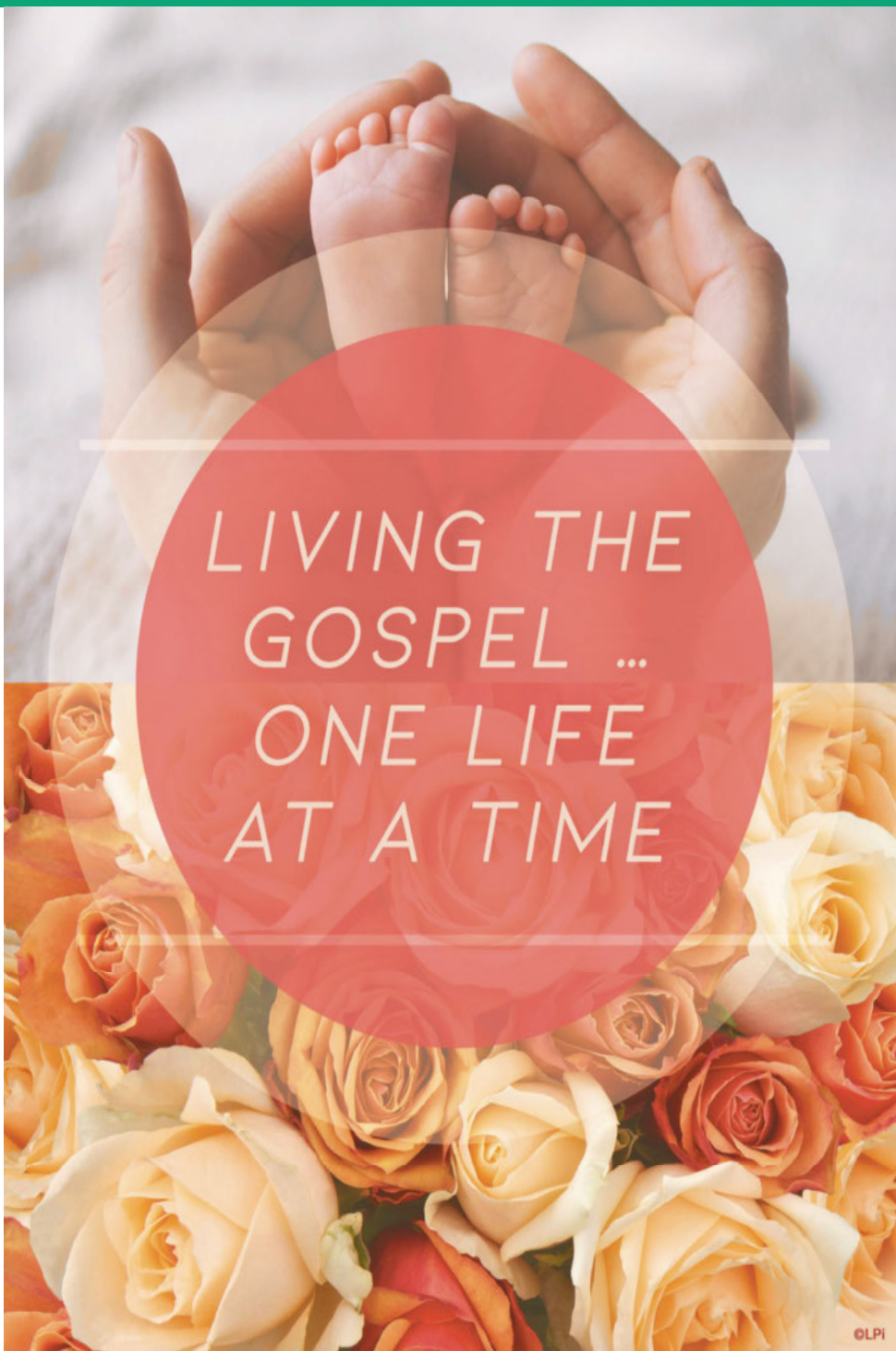

From Fr. Mark Livingston

Jesus gave the power to bind and loose to Peter and, by extension, to the Church hierarchy by Apostolic Succession (from Peter to his successor, etc. up to our modern day). We need this interpreter of God's word and teacher of Faith and morals. The teaching authority of the Catholic Church, the Magisterium (Pope and Bishops), has either made direct declarations on Faith and morals or has delegated decision to local conferences of Bishops. The way we receive the Eucharist is one of those delegated decisions, while holding up the general principals to follow.

There is a long history in the Catholic Church regarding the distribution and reception of Holy Communion (the Eucharist). In the May 29, 1969 document, *Memoriale Domini: Instruction on the Manner of Distributing Holy Communion*, the Sacred Congregation for Divine Worship (CDW) sketched a brief history of the different permissions for the distribution of the Eucharist, basically identifying two main ways for receiving the Eucharist: on the tongue or in the hand. The document states, "It is certainly true that ancient usage once allowed the faithful to take this divine food [the Eucharist] in their hands and to place it in their mouths themselves." The document continues that the, "custom

was [gradually] established of the minister placing a particle of consecrated bread on the tongue of the communicant," particularly when distributing Holy Communion to the sick and dying.

Memoriale Domini (1969) describes Vatican Council II's permission given to local congregations/ conferences of bishops (typically by country) to decide whether they would allow communion on the hand, in addition to the tongue. The document cautions that reception of Holy Communion on the hand must be accompanied by clear teaching to ensure against "loss of reverence for the august sacrament of the altar, of profanation, of adulterating the true doctrine"

In the document, *The Reception of Holy Communion at Mass*, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) stated that their position is to allow reception of Holy Communion on the hand, in addition to the tongue. Recognizing the need for clear catechesis on the reverence due the Most Blessed Sacrament of the Altar, the Eucharist, as *Memoriale Domini* stated, the

USCCB details a reverent process for reception of the Eucharist on the hand:

Those who receive Communion may receive either in the hand or on the tongue, and the decision should be that of the individual receiving, not of the person distributing Communion. If Communion is received in the hand, the hands should first of all be clean. If one is right handed the left hand should rest upon the right. The host will then be laid in the palm of the left hand and then taken by the right hand to the mouth. If one is left-handed this is reversed. It is not appropriate to reach out with the fingers and take the host from the person distributing.

The document grants clear permission for the reception of the Precious Blood of Christ by means of the cup/chalice by the faithful, stating:

When one receives from the chalice, the same proclamation is made by the person distributing Communion ["the Blood of Christ"] and the Communicant again responds, "Amen." It should be noted that it is never permissible for a person to dip the host he or she has received into the chalice. If, for some reason, the communicant is not able or willing to drink from the cup then that person should receive only under the form of bread.

In the wake of the CDW's March 2004 Instruction Redemptionis Sacramentum, the U.S. bishops updated their 2002 document "Norms for the Distribution and Reception of Holy Communion under Both Kinds in the Dioceses of the United States of America" writing:

"Among the ways of ministering the Precious Blood as prescribed by the General Instruction of the Roman Missal, Communion from the chalice is generally the preferred form in the Latin Church, provided that it can be carried out properly according to the norms and without any risk of even apparent irreverence toward the Blood of Christ (42)."

They continue in paragraph 46, "It is the choice of the communicant, not the minister, to receive from the chalice." By receiving the Sacred Host, you receive both the Body and Blood of the Lord, which is inseparable in the Eucharist, who is our crucified and risen Lord. By receiving from the Sacred Cup, you receive the whole Lord.

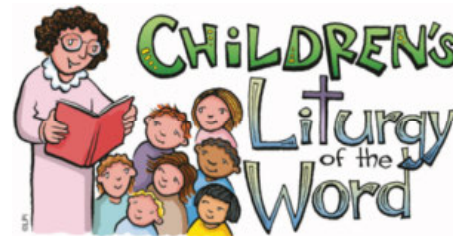
Further, according to the 2004 CDW's Instruction Redemptionis Sacramentum, the Vatican allowed for two other ways of receiving the Eucharist: standing or kneeling. They wrote in paragraph 90 of the document, "The faithful should receive Communion kneeling or standing, as the Conference of Bishops will have determined, with its acts [determinations] having received the recognition of the Apostolic See. However, if they receive Communion standing, it is recommended that they give due reverence before the reception of the Sacrament, as set forth in the same norms."

This "act of due reverence" is typically a bow before receiving the Eucharist.

What is the best way to receive Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass? With great reverence and care—either on the tongue or in the hand, either kneeling or standing.
