

#### From Fr. Mark Livingston

I hope everyone is having a great weekend! God bless you! The power to bind and loose, that is, to teach and interpret the Word of God handed down to us in divine revelation, has been passed down to the pope and bishops by apostolic succession. They teach in the Catechism of the Catholic Church that we receive the whole Jesus in the Eucharist and the whole Jesus in the cup. We do not need to receive under both species to receive the whole Jesus. While it is not necessary to receive Jesus under both species (Body or Blood) in the Eucharist to receive the whole Jesus, it is the fullest sign to do so. In the Body alone, we receive the full Jesus-Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity. The same is true of receiving the Precious Blood from the cup alone. Let's talk about the Precious Blood in Mass.

While there are three permitted ways to receive the Precious Blooddrinking directly from the cup, by intinction, and by a tube or spoon (Redemptionis Sacramentum 103) the most ancient and even original way of receive the Precious Blood was to drink from the one cup together. During COVID and the years immediately following, our community began the practice of distributing the Eucharist by intinction. This is an of Eucharist form uncommon distribution and reception and is typically done in parishes after having received the permission of the Bishop, though it is not technically required to do so. Communicants' self-intinction is not permitted (*Redemptionis Sacramentum* 104) and intinction may only be administered by a priest.

In the Old Covenant sacrifices, reference is made to the life of the victim (flesh) being in the blood (Leviticus 17:11). The priest offers the sacrifice ... of the life of the victim (not the death). To offer the sacrifice, the blood (life) of the victim must be separated from its body. In the case of Jesus, he is both the Victim and the Priest. He is offered as the victim and, as the True High Priest, he offers himself freely to accomplish the will of the Father. If the life of the Old Covenant victim (typically a lamb, bull, goat or dove) is in the blood to atone for sins and Jesus is the Victim (and Priest) of the New Covenant, then when we drink his Precious (Life) Blood, we drink in his very divine life! The blood of the Old Covenant sacrifices was splashed on the altar and sprinkled on the people, so that the life (blood) could atone for our death (sin). We are no longer covered by the life blood of an insufficient animal victim, like the doorposts of the Israelites in Egypt at the Passover, but our lips are now purpled (the "doorposts" of the New Covenant) by the Precious Blood of Jesus which gives us super abundant life in our bodies and our souls. This

is why Jesus said, "Unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you do not have life within you" (John 6:55). This is true of the spiritual life and of the fulfillment of the Old Covenant sacrifice. We drink from the one cup which contains infinite life—the Precious Blood of the Unblemished Lamb of God!

When reasonable, the Precious Blood should be offered to the faithful at Mass. Procedures (and education) should be in place to ensure that the safety of and reverence towards the sacred species' of both Body and Blood are secured. We eat the one Body and drink the one Cup for our salvation with great reverence.

What is the best way to receive Jesus in the Eucharist at Mass? With a heart and mind fixed on the unity and peace of Christ, in communion with each other, as we all partake of His Body and drink of His supernatural, life-giving Precious Blood.

Also, October is the month of Mary and the Rosary. Let's double down our efforts with the Lord to pray for peace, especially with the war in Israel and the surrounding region, and the unrest around the globe.

Mary, Undoer of Knots, pray for us!

### Plenary Indulgence November 1st through 8th

In Catholic Church teaching, a grant (loosing, rather than binding) may be extended by the Pope for the remission of the temporal punishment in Purgatory (i.e., time spent in Purgatory) due for sins after absolution in sacramental Confession. This is called an indulgence (leniency), which can be plenary (full) or partial. The souls in Purgatory are assisted by the prayers of the faithful because they can no longer merit progress towards God by trust/ faith shrouded by the veil of earthly life; they now have clarity, having met and The effect of experienced God. obtaining a plenary indulgence is elimination of all temporal punishment in Purgatory, guaranteeing that the deceased person immediately enters heaven. The effect of obtaining a partial indulgence is the shortening of time in Purgatory, but not a complete elimination of it, unless your offering was the last leg of their journey in Purgatory.

The Catholic Church offers these indulgences--plenary and partial--on various occasions throughout each liturgical year. One of these occasions is the period from November 1<sup>st</sup> through November 8<sup>th</sup> each year. At this time in the liturgical calendar we pray in thanksgiving to God for the saints on Nov 1, All Saints Day, and ask for their intercession for us and, the next day, we pray for the deceased who are not yet confirmed as saints, on Nov 2, All Souls Day. Recognizing the need for us to pray for the dead and the deceased souls' reliance on us to pray and offer sacrifices for them to assist them into heaven more quickly, the Church offers a plenary (full) indulgence to one soul in Purgatory of your choice each day from November 1 through November 8. This will be satisfied by devoutly visiting a cemetery (it is not specified that it must be a Catholic one) and praying for the dead (in any way and for any duration). Also, within that same time frame, on November 2nd, All Souls Day, individuals may additionally devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed and receive a plenary indulgence for the soul of one deceased relative. Essentially, during the time of November 1-8, you can free 9 souls from Purgatory by your prayer in action, one per day with two souls on November 2nd.

Here are the Church's requirements:

- Have a particular person/ soul identified each day or occasion for whom to offer this spiritual gift and work of mercy.
- Perform the indulgenced work by:
- 1. Visiting a cemetery any or every day from November 1-8 and praying, if only mentally, for the deceased, and/ or
- 2. Devoutly visiting a church on November 2, praying the Our Father and the Creed (the 7 PM Mass of Remembrance is a great opportunity to fulfill this)
- Complete the <u>normal requirements</u> to properly dispose yourself several days before or after the indulgenced work day:
- 1. Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin.
- 2. Go to sacramental confession.
- 3. Receive Holy Communion in a state of grace (ideally on the same day as the indulgenced work).
- 4. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father by at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary or any other prayer according to individual piety and devotion (ideally on the same day as the indulgenced work).

If we follow Jesus' teachings in the Beatitudes, then perhaps if we were to look in a mirror, God would see His reflection in us.




