In accordance with the guidelines of the Province of Michigan, engaged couples must contact the Parish Office six months prior to the desired date of marriage and complete required preparation.



From Fr. Mark Livingston

Who Do We Worship and Serve?

Jesus is so good, even in his toughest teachings his goodness shows through. Everything he does and says is to help us navigate the twists and turns of the spiritual battle in this world so we can overcome the temptation to sin and death, and walk with him in this life and the life to come into eternal glory. Devil tries in many ways to trip us up, often by trying to focus our thoughts, feelings and desires on the things and troubles of this life as an end in themselves, rather than as a means to get to heaven. When we start to think or live like this world is all there is, we get frustrated and confused very quickly. We start to lash out and turn to all kinds of different means of control. One misconception can lead to one venial sin which, over time, may become a mortal sin ... and then mortal sin becomes easier and easier and we can even think it's normal or, worse, that God is okay with it! Sin can begin to grind us down and we can even forget the divine law for our lives according walk commandments of the Lord, with prayer and the sacraments) and

the Lord God, who is guiding us. In difficult things, he is trying to teach us. In times of change (given that they are not inherently evil changes), he is trying to mold and test us. In easy times, he is trying to turn our minds and hearts to gratitude, recognizing that everything is a gift from him.

In our Gospel this weekend, Jesus asks to see the coin with which the tax should be paid. The profile head image of the Emperor was on the coin (as all coins back then) with the inscription, "Caesar Augustus Tiberius, son of the divine Augustus." The coin said that the Emperor was the son of God; he was divine. Basically, Emperor (Caesar) claiming to be God, the son of Knowing this well, and seeing that they were living too much for this life and not the life to come, Jesus replied, "Render to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God." What of ours belongs to God?

Everything! The question he is posing is, "Who and what do you

Plenary Indulgence November 1st through 8th

In Catholic Church teaching, a grant (loosing, rather than binding) may be extended by the Pope for the remission of the temporal punishment in Purgatory (i.e., time spent in Purgatory) due for sins after absolution in sacramental Confession. This is called an indulgence (leniency), which can be plenary (full) or partial. The souls in Purgatory are assisted by the prayers of the faithful because they can no longer merit progress towards God by trust/ faith shrouded by the veil of earthly life; they now have clarity, having met and The effect of experienced God. obtaining a plenary indulgence is elimination of all temporal punishment in Purgatory, guaranteeing that the deceased person immediately enters heaven. The effect of obtaining a partial indulgence is the shortening of time in Purgatory, but not a complete elimination of it, unless your offering was the last leg of their journey in Purgatory.

The Catholic Church offers these indulgences--plenary and partial--on various occasions throughout each liturgical year. One of these occasions is the period from November 1st through November 8th each year. At this time in the liturgical calendar we pray in thanksgiving to God for the saints on Nov 1, All Saints Day, and ask for their intercession for us and, the next day, we pray for the deceased who are not yet confirmed as saints, on Nov 2, All Souls Day. Recognizing the need for us to pray for the dead and the deceased souls' reliance on us to pray and offer sacrifices for them to assist them into heaven more quickly, the Church offers a plenary (full) indulgence to one soul in Purgatory of your choice each day from November 1 through November 8. This will be satisfied by devoutly visiting a cemetery (it is not specified that it must be a Catholic one) and praying for the dead (in any way and for any duration). Also, within that same time frame, on November 2nd, All Souls Day, individuals may additionally devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed and receive a plenary indulgence for the soul of one deceased relative. Essentially, during the time of November 1-8, you can free 9 souls from Purgatory by your prayer in action, one per day with two souls on November 2nd.

Here are the Church's requirements:

- Have a particular person/ soul identified each day or occasion for whom to offer this spiritual gift and work of mercy.
- Perform the indulgenced work by:
- 1. Visiting a cemetery any or every day from November 1-8 and praying, if only mentally, for the deceased, and/ or
- 2. Devoutly visiting a church on November 2, praying the Our Father and the Creed (the 7 PM Mass of Remembrance is a great opportunity to fulfill this)
- Complete the <u>normal requirements</u> to properly dispose yourself several days before or after the indulgenced work day:
- 1. Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin.
- 2. Go to sacramental confession.
- 3. Receive Holy Communion in a state of grace (ideally on the same day as the indulgenced work).
- 4. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father by at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary or any other prayer according to individual piety and devotion (ideally on the same day as the indulgenced work).

November is the month in which Catholics remember those who have joined the Communion of Saints. In order to keep Saint Michael Cemetery a beautiful and dignified resting place for the deceased members of our parish family, it requires a cleaning twice a year. Following 8:15 a.m. mass at Saint Augustine, on Saturday, November 4 (November 11 in case of rain), the annual fall cleaning of Saint Michael Cemetery will take place. The cleanup will begin at 9:00 a.m. All debris and dried foliage will be removed, and trees and shrubs will be trimmed as well. This will prepare the cemetery for the placement of winter decorations, i.e., grave blankets, wreaths, etc. For the past few years, a good number of parishioners volunteered, which made the task much easier! If you are able to join us to help clean our beautiful cemetery on Saturday, November 4, it will be greatly appreciated. Please wear appropriate shoes/boots and bring your work gloves, rakes, shovels, wheel-barrows, etc.



treat like God or a god?" Are our minds constantly occupied with money, or reputation, etc., or are we focused on trusting that the Lord has us and we will be okay in and with Him? Jesus is not really talking about taxes in this Gospel, although he is giving permission to give the tax to Rome (as he does elsewhere in scripture, asking us to pray for our leaders and pay our taxes), he's saying, rather, that Caesar is not God, he is man! So, Jesus is saying in the instance of taxes (and other areas): "Give the requested money to Caesar, and give your entire life (faith, trust, virtue, body, heart, mind) to God."

I saw the most beautiful sunset over the fields a few weeks ago. It was as if the Lord was gently saying to me, "I've got you; everything will work out. Trust me." Then I had peace. Let's not let the cares and troubles of this world and our perceptions of situations distract us from the Lord. He is God and we are not. Rely on him for all things.
