Contact the parish office for hospital or home visits.



From Fr. Mark Livingston

Blessed 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time! We are moving closer and closer—only about a month away—to the close of the Church year. Our new year begins at the start of Advent. Time flies! Lately, we have been hosting various Trunk or Treat events in our Family and I have been able to see some really fun and creative costumes of all sorts. The sense of fun and community has been a joy. Did you know that Halloween is really all about the next day, All Saints? Here's a breakdown of the word: "Hallowed" ("holy"; it kind of looks like the word "halo" which we put above the head to indicate that someone was holy) and "een" (from Old English meaning "evening"). So, "Halloween" means "All Hallows (Saints) Eve". It's an evening to get candy for sure, but mainly to celebrate All Saints, which is a holy day of obligation in the Church to celebrate God's amazing work of salvation and elevation of souls as saints. Remember St. John's words to us, "Beloved, we are God's children now; it does not yet appear what we shall be, but we know that when he appears we shall be like him, for we shall see him as he is" (1 John 3:2). If in this life we are God's children, in the next, it is still to be revealed what we shall be ... saints with a mission from God. This is a far cry from what our culture has turned it into. Scary or death-focused costumes and decorations

have become more the norm than the exception today.

Halloween has even been turned into a night of occult practice, rather than the celebration and worship of God. Persons practicing evil have tried to do their evil practices to harm society, especially around this time of year. Sometimes people even try to take Jesus in the Eucharist (walking away and not consuming it, or taking it with them in a pyx) for evil and occult purposes. I've also heard of Halloween parties at which fortune tellers or mediums are invited. Stay away from this stuff because it's spiritually dangerous (read Deuteronomy 18). This may be shocking and even sickening to you, but it's the reality of the dark side of our culture's modified version of Halloween. But "be not afraid," God's light and life shines brighter than any darkness and evil in the world! You are protected by your baptismal character and the grace of God.

We are called to be light to a dark world! As Catholic Christians, we don't celebrate death (unless it's martyrdom for the Lord, but that's only because of the life that awaits them); we celebrate and promote life! We know that we will all die because we are mortal. I remember that thought having a particularly strong

Plenary Indulgence November 1st through 8th

In Catholic Church teaching, a grant (loosing, rather than binding) may be extended by the Pope for the remission of the temporal punishment in Purgatory (i.e., time spent in Purgatory) due for sins after absolution in sacramental Confession. This is called an indulgence (leniency), which can be plenary (full) or partial. The souls in Purgatory are assisted by the prayers of the faithful because they can no longer merit progress towards God by trust/faith shrouded by the veil of earthly life; they now have clarity, having met and experienced God. The effect of obtaining a *plenary* indulgence is the elimination of all temporal punishment in Purgatory, thus guaranteeing that the deceased person immediately enters heaven. The effect of obtaining a *partial* indulgence is the shortening of time in Purgatory, but not a complete elimination of it, unless your offering was the last leg of their journey in Purgatory.

The Catholic Church offers these indulgences--plenary and partial--on various occasions throughout each liturgical year. One of these occasions is the period from November 1st through November 8th each year. At this time in the liturgical calendar we pray in thanksgiving to God for the saints on Nov 1, All Saints Day, and ask for their intercession for us and, the next day, we pray for the deceased who are not yet confirmed as saints, on Nov 2, All Souls Day. Recognizing the need for us to pray for the dead and the deceased souls' reliance on us to pray and offer sacrifices for them to assist them into heaven more quickly, the Church offers a plenary (full) indulgence to one soul in Purgatory of your choice each day from November 1 through November 8. This will be satisfied by devoutly visiting a cemetery (it is not specified

that it must be a Catholic one) and praying for the dead (in any way and for any duration). Also, within that same time frame, on November 2nd, All Souls Day, individuals may additionally devoutly visit a church or an oratory and recite an Our Father and the Creed and receive a plenary indulgence for the soul of one deceased relative. Essentially, during the time of November 1-8, you can free 9 souls from Purgatory by your prayer in action, one per day with two souls on November 2nd.

Here are the Church's requirements:

- Have a particular person/ soul identified each day or occasion for whom to offer this spiritual gift and work of mercy.
- Perform the indulged work by:
 1. Visiting a cemetery any or every day from November 1-8 and praying, if only mentally, for the deceased, and/ or
 2. Devoutly visiting a church on November 2, praying the Our Father and the Creed (the 7 PM Mass of Remembrance is a great opportunity to fulfill this)
- Complete the normal requirements to properly dispose yourself several days before or after the indulgenced work day:
 1. Be free from all attachment to sin, even venial sin.
 2. Go to sacramental confession.
 3. Receive Holy Communion in a state of grace (ideally on the same day as the indulgenced work).
 4. Pray for the intentions of the Holy Father by at least one Our Father and one Hail Mary or any other prayer according to individual piety and devotion (ideally on the same day as the indulgenced work).

November is the month in which Catholics remember those who have joined the Communion of Saints. In order to keep Saint Michael Cemetery a beautiful and dignified resting place for the deceased members of our parish family, it requires a cleaning twice a year. Following 8:15 a.m. mass at Saint Augustine, on Saturday, November 4 (November 11 in case of rain), the annual fall cleaning of Saint Michael Cemetery will take place. This will prepare the cemetery for the placement of winter decorations, i.e., grave blankets, wreaths, etc. For the past few years, a good number of parishioners volunteered, which made the task much easier! If you are able to join us to help clean our beautiful cemetery on Saturday, November 4, it will be greatly appreciated. Please wear appropriate shoes/boots and bring your work gloves, rakes, shovels, wheel-barrows, etc.

Third graders just completed reading the chapter book, Flat Stanley written by the late author, Marc Brown. The tale is about a boy who becomes flat after a bulletin board falls on him. Stanley, (the main character) thinks it's pretty cool being flat because he can slide under doors and even take part in a sailboat race where he is the sail!

As the story goes on Stanley wishes he could visit a friend in California, but his parents can't afford the airfare. So they decide to put him in an envelope and mail him to California.

The third graders developed this into a writing project/social studies project. The students begin by decorating their own paper Flat Stanley. They can even design a few accessories to accompany him like in the book (i.e. food, milk etc.) You can definitely tell I have a new generation of kids. Their idea of accessories this year were iPhones, Play Stations and a Fit Bit watch! Next they decide which relative or friend they want their Flat Stanley to visit and write a letter to accompany him on his trip. The relative/friend may or may not live in Michigan. This year Flat Stanley is making a lot of trips faraway. Some of the places Flat Stanley got mailed to this year were Arizona, Colorado, Washington, New Jersey, Texas, United Kingdom, Spain, and even the Netherlands! Their letter instructs the relative to take care of Stanley for a while and then return him with a log of all the adventures they had with him. The students always eagerly await the return of their Flat Stanley!

There are many learning skills acquired in this fun project. The students learn the writing process and they compose letters, edit final copies, and then mail them. In addition, students learn basic map skills as we graph all the states Stanley has visited.

Please pray for the safe returns of all our Flat Stanleys! Although this project is not in our textbook, it certainly fills each child with wonder and excitement. In fact, many have no idea how much they are learning because they are having so much fun!

P.S. The students wanted me to send my own Flat Stanley as well. I sent mine to Fr. Mark! Can't wait to hear about his Catholic adventures!

effect on me as a child. I was really
afraid of dying because I didn't
understand it. But, as Catholics, we
understand that we die and enter into
something, not into nothing. We can
die mortally and enter into Eternal
Life or into eternal death. This all
depends on how deeply we enter into
and live the Christian life of grace and
works in accord with the grace offered
to us in this mortal life, using our free
will for good rather than evil. How
will you and your family live All
Saints and All Saints Eve
(Halloween)? We can do this by the
costumes we choose to witness to the
world. We can avoid going to certain
houses or parties. We can pray
together as a family before going out
for candy. We can go to Mass on All
Saints. Be assured that I plan to
celebrate Mass on All Saints Eve
(Halloween) to support you and the
world in prayer ... after passing out
candy (and pocket New Testaments)!

Tuesday is "All hallows
eve" (Halloween). Wednesday we
celebrate All Saints (a holy day of
obligation, see page 2 for mass
schedule). Thursday, we celebrate All
Souls (see page 3 for mass schedule)
to pray for those who have died, but
may still be in Purgatory. This is a
very holy week. Let's show it to a
world (maybe even our own neighbor)
that has lost the sense of the sacred.

Forgiveness and Reconciliation

There is one thing you can do to bring yourself a sense of peace and comfort; **forgive someone**. We don't realize how much being angry or disappointed at someone else affects our lives. They often go about their lives unscathed, while we stew in our feelings of betrayal and loss.

St. John Paul II once said, "The only way to peace is forgiveness." If that is true, why is it that we find it so difficult to forgive? We sometimes conclude that if we take the step towards reconciliation then the other person "wins" and we lose. If that's your attitude, then the next question we must ask ourselves is, what is my relationship with the person or people I am struggling with about? Is it about getting the upper hand, to dominate, to control? Or is it about love, compassion and the relationship we have formed?

Sometimes we get angry with institutions, local government, our country, or the world itself. We are aware of a great divide between "Liberal vs Conservative" leadership and those who subscribe to one side or another. It's in these situations where we find anger, violence and even death justified and even honored. These are the circumstances where winning coming at any cost seems justified.

This was the mindset in the time Jesus Christ walked the earth. On the surface, the Romans and Jewish leadership seemed to win. We know differently. It was through his Death and Resurrection that Jesus reconciled God and His people, opened the Gates of Heaven, and started His Church.

Sadly, we as His Church have in many ways fallen into the earthly mindset and sometimes seem to be pitted one against another. We must not let this happen or become a part of this divide. We must work together, find common ground, and contin-

ue on the path of peace, forgiveness and reconciliation that Jesus laid out for His disciples, His Church, and for you and me.

Every time we say the Our Father, we ask Our Lord to "...*forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.*" That's a pretty heavy statement, especially if we are someone who struggles with forgiveness. Yet we all want and need God's forgiveness, and we should be aware how broken we are as human beings. Shouldn't we then, offer what we desire? In doing so, we are the ones who 'win,' not in a sports sense where there are winners and losers, but we win in a moral and Godly way, where we offer and bring about reconciliation and peace with others we know and love.

The Father in the Prodigal Son parable that Jesus shared did not become angry or vindictive when his son wished him dead and took half his money as an inheritance. No, he sat daily on his porch, looking out into the distance, yearning, waiting and hoping for his son's return. We know how that story ended, with an embrace and immediate forgiveness and reconciliation.

Blessed Fulton Sheen did not see forgiveness as an option or a decision. He once said "One of the conditions of receiving the full pardon of Our Blessed Lord is that we pardon others."

So let us take the first step in forgiveness and forgive ourselves for our hardheartedness. Then, let us resolve to forgive everyone for everything we perceive they may have done against us, not just in our hearts, but verbally as well, and become reconciled as one. It is there and then that we will finally receive from Jesus Christ one of His great promises to us, "A peace which is beyond all human understanding"


