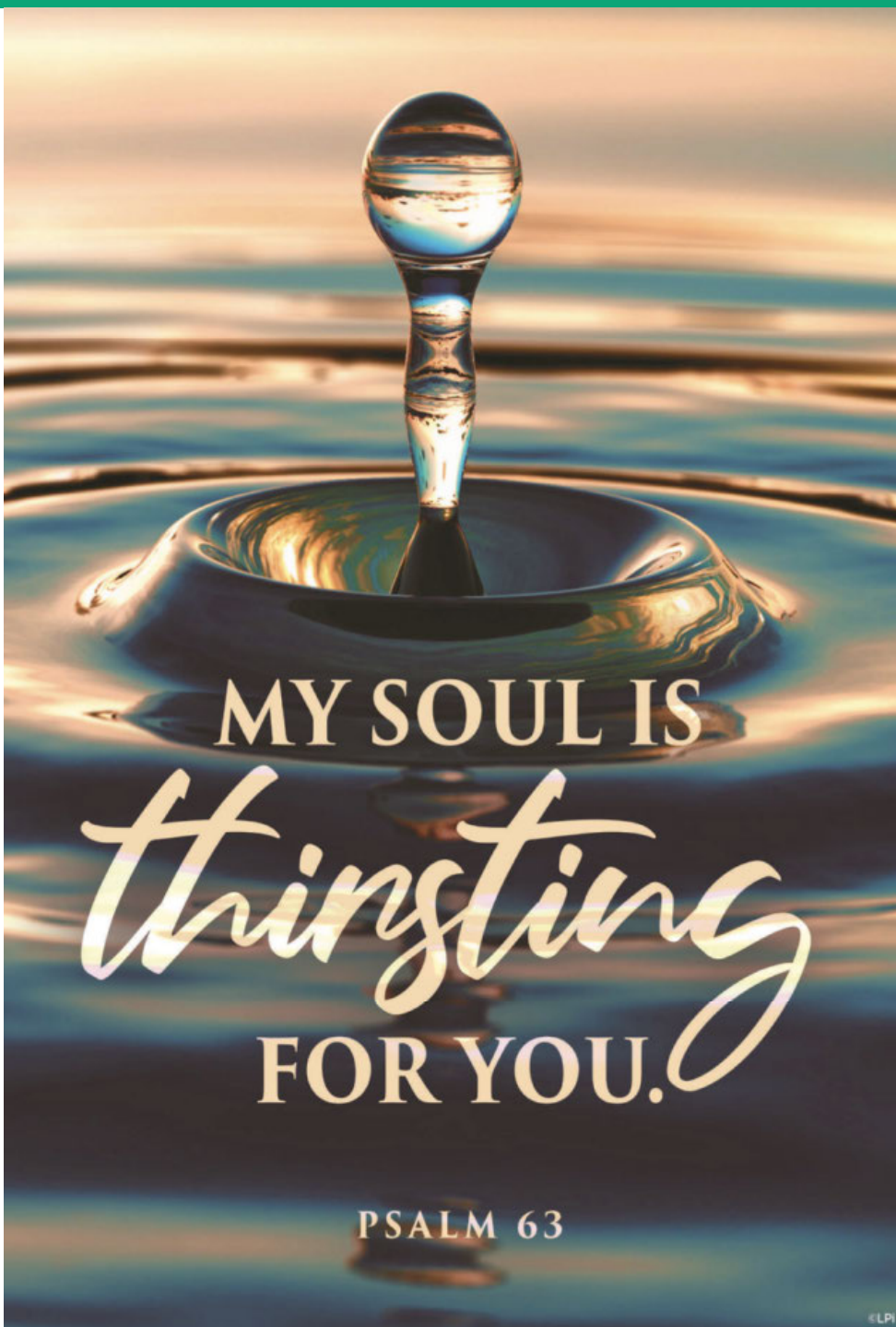

## From Fr. Mark Livingston

Having just lived the time of great mercy at the beginning of November, with All Saints followed by All Souls, when we received a plenary indulgence for ourselves or a deceased loved one (family, friend, acquaintance, or random soul in Purgatory) from the 1st to the 8th, we look ahead to preparations for Thanksgiving and the end of our liturgical year. God is so good that he concludes this liturgical year with the week of Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. In this moment, as we live the liturgy, God asks us to “stay awake” because “we know not the day nor the hour” of his coming. Please get good sleep, eat healthy, and exercise. Please continue to foster your spiritual life with the Lord Jesus and his Church. Please also stay aware and awake to The Way, The Truth and The Life, Jesus Christ and how he is moving and calling you to grow with him. Stay aware and awake to how the Devil is trying to tempt us to lack of unity and disturbance of peace, individually and collectively. The oil to keep the light of Christ burning in our hearts is prayer, the sacraments, and good works, including almsgiving and assisting those in need. Let’s make sure our hearts, homes and

relationships are full of these things.

### The Eucharist

The Eucharist should move us to take good action in life. St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta once said to her spiritual daughters, “Every Holy Communion fills us with Jesus and we must, with Our Lady, go in haste to give him to others. For her, it was on her first Holy Communion day that Jesus came into her life [the Annunciation], and so for all of us, also. He made himself the Bread of Life so that we, too, like Mary, become full of Jesus. We too, like her, should be in haste to give him to others. We too, like her, serve others.”

We don’t serve as social workers or others in secular society, though there are wonderful therapists, social workers and other civil servants. We serve with the heart and mind of Christ. We engage in Christian service. In our service, we should not shy away from inviting service recipients to pray with us, not as a condition for receiving assistance but as the greatest of the gifts we can offer, food and clothing being secondary to the spiritual and communal assistance offered. Service should flow from prayer. Service without

a foundation in prayer and worship of the One True God is somewhat impoverished. Prayer without some form of service that reaches out to others, is somewhat impoverished also. Jesus calls us to pray and celebrate the sacraments with him first and, then, as living tabernacles, carry Jesus into the world, to individuals in desperate need of the One True Light, Jesus Christ, though they may not know it. In other words, we are living tabernacles tasked by Jesus to go out into the world and bring him to others through prayer, sacrifice and Christian service. We are called to be “wounded healers” by God’s grace and help.

At Mass, as we pray to prepare to enter mission territory, let’s remember a sense of reverence and charity towards our neighbor who also has come to worship the Lord also. We are all excited to see each other on Sunday! That is a great thing! There is a buzz in our churches when we encounter each other after possibly not having seen each other in a week or longer. It’s good to greet each other and to be excited. Let’s also try to pray before and after Mass in a spirit of anticipation of and gratitude for God’s gift, what he is doing and has done for us.



To prepare for reception of Jesus in the Eucharist, out of reverence, we should fast from food and drink (unless medically necessary) one hour prior to receiving the Eucharist, or at least 15 minutes before Mass start time (because we will receive Jesus about 45 minutes into Mass). Also, I'd like to recommend that, for a little time before Mass, please silently pray in your pew, asking God for the graces you desire. Then, at the end of Mass, after the closing hymn, please consider taking a little time (a moment even) to silently thank God for the graces received at Mass and for the gift of his very Body and Blood living in you and each of us.

Advent means "to come" or "coming." It refers to the coming of the Lord. The Church celebrates her new year at the first Sunday of Advent. As we inch towards the end of this year and the start of the new, what change is Jesus asking of you? Is it increased prayer and thanksgiving before and after Mass? Is it more service of neighbor? Ask Jesus this week and then listen with your whole heart to his response. Be filled the oil of grace and good works to burn brightly before God and others. The Lord loves you!

## What Does it Take to be a Saint?

In second grade and throughout our school, we have been studying all about Saints in preparation for the celebration of All Saints Day. In our classroom, we chose Saint Joan of Arc to study, because we thought she was “cool.” She was a teenage warrior who led an army into battle, a devout girl from France who had a vision and was spoken to by angels at the age of thirteen and a Catholic who in the end, died for her beliefs. We could make a connection: Jesus died on the cross for our salvation and St. Joan was persecuted for her dedication to the Lord.

Many Saints were represented here at school for the great sacrifices and the dedications they made in the name of God. But in the ways of the Catholic faith, a second grader may wonder, “How does one become a Saint?” Well in the simplest of terms, the first step to becoming a Saint is unfortunately, death. Step two: be a servant of God. Step three: Venerable. Step four: Blessed and step five: Saint. Of course, living a life of exceptional goodness is what most believe will get one to Sainthood, but in reality the threshold is living a life of “heroic virtue.”

This may be a little difficult to explain to someone who is eight years young, so as their teacher, I decided to pose the question to them. What exactly do they think could take them from being a “mere” disciple of God to making it “all the way” to Sainthood? The following are some examples of their answers:

“You have to be really, really, really, good!”

“Never spend time in the time out corner”

“To give food to the people who don’t have any”

“You have to give the poor money...and food”

“Help the teacher”....(Amen!!)

“Help the poor and grandparents because Jesus was kind to all people”

“Never ever give up because did Jesus give up?...No!”

“You have to go to school to become a Saint”

“You have to be respectful, because Saints show respect”

“Just be kind to everyone because it feels good”

“You have to go to church and confession”

“You probably have to pray every day”

“Give lots of bandages to people when they get hurt”

“Give people hats, gloves and coats...”

“Pray, pray and pray, like every day!!!!”

“Be a good Friend”

“Be extra Kind”

“Tell Jesus’s words to others”

And finally,

“Do your best work, share with others, love each other.”

It may be simplistic, but if we all could follow these suggestions, I think Heaven would fill up and be “overloaded” with goodness. After all, isn’t that just what the world needs today?

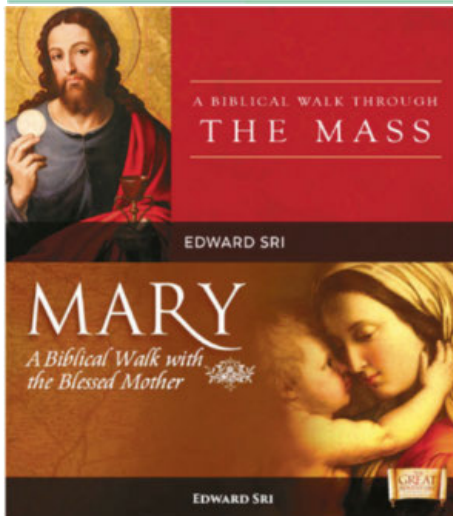
## St. Augustine Ushers!

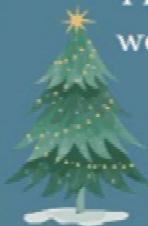

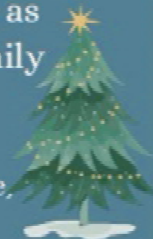
