Thanksgiving Vigil Mass, on Wednesday, 11/22, at Holy Family at 7 PM. On Thanksgiving Day, we have two Masses, one at 8:15 AM at St. Augustine and another at 9:00 AM at St. Mary Mystical Rose. I will see you at church!

The Eucharist

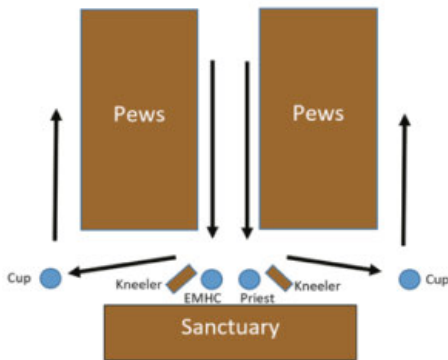
There will be changes to some aspects of liturgical practice in our Family of Parishes beginning on the first weekend of Advent. I have been writing about the theology of the Eucharist and permissions behind these changes for the past two months. Here are the upcoming changes:

- **The new standard daily Mass schedule, beginning Monday, December 4, will be:**
 - Monday, 8:15 AM at St. Augustine
 - Tuesday, 7:00 PM at Holy Family
 - Wednesday, 9:00 AM at St. Mary Mystical Rose
 - Thursday, 8:15 AM at St. Augustine
 - Friday
 - * 1st Friday, 8:15 AM at Holy Family
 - * All other Fridays, 9:00 AM at St. Mary Mystical Rose

- Weekend Masses will remain as they currently are.
- At all Masses beginning December 2nd and 3rd,
 - **We will return to coming up for communion down the center aisle**, rather than the side aisles. Ushers will direct you; be not afraid!
- **Intinction will be discontinued and the cups will return.** As I have mentioned in a previous article, while intinction is allowed by the Church, only a priest can do it and we will have EMHC’s assisting in our Family. You receive both the Body and the Blood of Christ in either one of the sacred species and it is not necessary to receive under both kinds, as is the case in the Traditional Latin Mass (TLM) and in other liturgical contexts. With regard to drinking the Precious Blood from the cup, please make the decision that is best for your personal health and comfort level.
- **The kneelers will remain for receiving Holy**

Communion but they will be turned to the outside of the center aisle and not arrayed in a “communion rail” fashion. I wrote previously about the Church’s permission to receive standing or kneeling, in the hand or on the tongue. It is important to me (and the Lord) that all valid reception options are available to individuals within our Family. The choice is yours. I only ask that, whatever you do, do it out of love and reverence for the Lord.

- Here is a general depiction of what I have described, above:



Be assured of my love for each of you and that you remain in my daily prayers. Let’s continue to love the Lord in the Eucharist and in Christian community together.

Thankful

November 1st feels like the flip of a switch. The Halloween costumes get packed up and our hearts become thankful. We begin taking time to notice and appreciate the blessings around us. We prepare baskets for families less fortunate and begin preparing our homes to be filled with family. Stores are beginning the Christmas hustle and bustle which will be here before we know it. The change in weather makes us grateful to have a cozy place to go home to.

As we feel this switch and the temptation to trim the tree, bake the cookies, and drink hot cocoa, it is important to remember everything we have been blessed with. There is so much to be grateful for during this time of year which makes it the perfect time for a prayer of thanksgiving.

As first graders see their Halloween costumes get put away and the calendar gets closer to thanksgiving break, it has been imperative to discuss their blessings. To do this, first graders made prayer turkeys. They can use these to pray before eating their thanksgiving meal or at any

prayer time at home. We first read a story about all the things to give thanks for, called "Thankful," by Elaine Vickers. This gave us many ideas to brainstorm. Then, students made four turkey feathers. Two that began with "Thank you God for..." and two that began with "Dear God, please help..." Students can use these feathers as they pray. For example, "Thank you God for the trees that help us breathe. Thank you God for my family who loves me. Dear God, please help the poor. Dear God, please help me do well in school." It is so important as children are getting excited about the holidays to help them be reminded of the blessings God has given us. I think it is also important to teach young people about asking God for help even in seasons of celebration, love, and happiness.

During this time of preparing our homes and our children for thanksgiving and all that the holiday season brings, let us remember to give thanks and ask God for help.

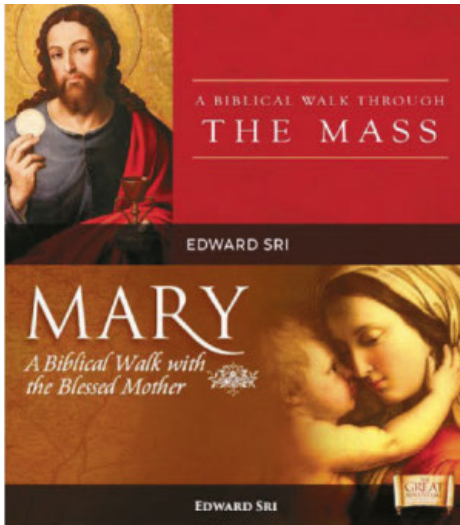



Q. Please help my family settle a debate. Is it a sin to wear a Rosary as a necklace or hang it from a rear-view mirror in an automobile?

A. Generally speaking, I do not believe it is a sin but it is certainly inappropriate. A person's intentions however, could become questionable to downright sinful. Are they using the Rosary as a lucky charm to conjure up some kind of good karma? Or even worse, is the intent some kind of mockery? If either of these intentions exist then it may well be sinful.

The Rosary (from Latin *rosarium*, meaning "Crown of Roses or "garland of roses") is a sacramental and Marian devotion to prayer plus the commemoration of Jesus and events of his life. The term "Rosary" is used to describe both a sequence of prayers and the string of prayer beads used as an aid to count the prayers.

Throughout centuries, the Rosary has been promoted by several popes as part of the veneration of Mary. The rosary also represents the emphasis on participation in the life of

Mary, whose focus is on Christ.

Veneration of the Blessed Virgin Mary is based on dogma as well as Scripture. The incarnation of the Son of God through Mary thus signifies her honor as Mother of God. From the Council of Ephesus in 431, which dogmatized this belief, to the Second Vatican Council (1963) and Pope John Paul II's encyclical *Redemptoris Mater*, the Virgin Mary is seen and venerated not only as the Mother of God but also as the Mother of the Church.

As the mother of Jesus, Mary has a central role in the Church. Pope Benedict XVI maintained that the Virgin Mary possesses divine motherhood through which she continues to serve as intercessor and bestower of "graces associated with God's blessing."

I would say that given the very special recognition of the Rosary as a solemn devotion and that Rosary beads are used to guide us through these solemn prayers, Rosary beads should be limited to their intended use. The Rosary is a sacramental item, not jewelry, a good luck charm, or an ornamental doo-dad.

GOSPEL MEDITATION by Fr. John Muir

When I was a kid, I hated playing Monopoly because my siblings and friends always seemed to win. But worse was how it happened. Scared to risk my fake money on buying properties, I'd hold on to it. My opponents hungrily bought up the various real estate squares on the board. Then, inevitably, my poor, low-equity self would land on their spots, pay them rent, and my money would drain to zero. It seemed so unfair. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. I had to learn that monopoly money is meant to be spent. I was scared to lose some of it. So, I lost all of it.

How do we see what we possess? Jesus' parable about the talents is not really about economics but about the investability of everything he entrusts to us. How marvelous that everyone in the fable who places talents in the open market doubles their investment. The only one who doesn't is the man who fearfully buries his one talent. Jesus' success strategy for us seems to be, whatever we have, get it out of our possession. Risk it as quickly and as fully as we can.

You and I have precious gifts. We have valuable things to invest — time, talents, treasure. The Lord invites us to be brave and even somewhat reckless, to give as much away as possible. If we give it away in the direction of love and truth, it will grow. If we hold on to it in fear, the little we have will be taken away. Let me challenge you this week: find something in your life you're holding on to, and risk it by giving it away. It won't double if you hold on to it. ©LPi
