## **From Fr. Mark Livingston**

God bless each you and I hope you're well. This weekend we celebrate the solemnity of "Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe! That's quite the title! He's not just king of the United States or king of the world. He is king of all creation. I love in the book of Genesis there is a curious line found there: "And he made the stars." Such a simple line with such an incredible beauty and expanse. I once read an estimate that there may be 2 trillion galaxies in the universe. There are estimated to be 100 billion stars in a "typical" galaxy. So, there are roughly 200 billion trillion stars in the universe. I can't even fathom such a big number and expanse. Yet, with all of the big-ness of the universe, God is deeply personal. His heart is fixed on you, each of us and all of us. He sees you and knows your name. He cares about you. He is teaching and leading you every moment of your life. He wants you to be with him in heaven. Even the most hardened sinner is beloved deeply by God and all of heaven. I remember hearing related to me in the testimony of Fr. Don Calloway that, after turning from dealing

drugs and running with the Japanese mafia, Our Lady said to him, "I love you so much, Donny." He had not been called that except by his mother. She is a great reflection of the love that God has for each of us, even the one who is furthest away from him. Let's never give up hope that you and each person in the universe is loved beyond our comprehension and God's greatest desire is for all to be converted and find happiness in this life and the life to come in and through him. Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, have mercy on us!

### **The Eucharist**

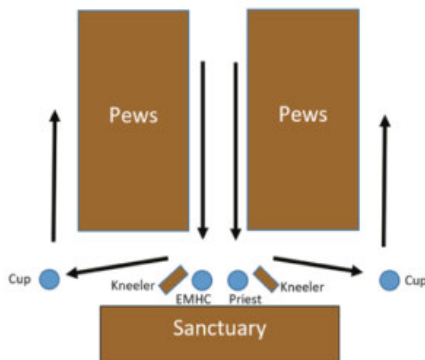
There will be changes to some aspects of liturgical practice in our Family of Parishes beginning on the first weekend of Advent. I have been writing about the theology of the Eucharist and permissions behind these changes for the past two months. Here are the upcoming changes:

- **The new standard daily Mass schedule, beginning Monday, December 4, will be:**
  - Monday, 8:15 AM at St. Augustine
  - Tuesday, 7:00 PM at Holy Family

- Wednesday, 9:00 AM at St. Mary Mystical Rose
- Thursday, 8:15 AM at St. Augustine
- Friday
  - \* 1st Friday, 8:15 AM at St. Augustine
  - \* All other Fridays, 9:00 AM at St. Mary Mystical Rose
- Weekend Masses will remain as they currently are.
- At all Masses beginning December 2nd and 3rd,
  - **We will return to coming up for communion down the center aisle**, rather than the side aisles. Ushers will direct you; be not afraid!
  - **Intinction will be discontinued and the cups will return.** As I have mentioned in a previous article, while intinction is allowed by the Church, only a priest can do it and we will have EMHC's assisting in our Family. You receive both the Body and the Blood of Christ in either one of the sacred species and it is not necessary to receive under both kinds, as is the case in the Traditional Latin Mass

(TLM) and in other liturgical contexts. With regard to drinking the Precious Blood from the cup, please make the decision that is best for your personal health and comfort level.

- **The kneelers will remain for receiving Holy Communion but they will be turned to the outside of the center aisle and not arrayed in a “communion rail” fashion.** I wrote previously about the Church’s permission to receive standing or kneeling, in the hand or on the tongue. It is important to me (and the Lord) that all valid reception options are available to individuals within our Family. The choice is yours. I only ask that, whatever you do, do it out of love and reverence for the Lord.
- Here is a general depiction of what I have described, above:



Be assured of my love for each of you and that you remain in my daily prayers. Let's continue to love the Lord in the Eucharist and in Christian community together.

## Kinder-Garden Corner

Each morning in Kindergarten we add an arrow to count our days in school. A few years ago I decided to add something to our arrows - a blessing. Each day one Kindergarten teacher is asked to tell a blessing in his or her life. I ask them to tell me a blessing, something that they are glad God gave them. When I began to do this, I wasn't sure what to expect. My little ones did not fail to make me proud. Their blessings have included favorite toys, favorite foods, pets, friends, family members, teachers, God's gifts of nature, Mary, Joseph, Jesus and God Himself. As I wait each day to write their blessing on the arrow, I watch little brows furrow as they think about what they want to say. They know it will be a couple of weeks before they get to name a blessing again, so they want to make sure they say something special. I can tell how special their blessing is to them because they either smile or look very solemn. They understand how lucky we are to have so many blessings in our lives, and they are grateful for them. We talk about always respecting our friends' blessings, because there is no right or wrong when counting our blessings. Even the teacher gets a turn to name a blessing, which makes me realize how often we take all God has given us for granted.

I know for myself personally there have been years when I haven't made a conscious effort to count my blessings until Thanksgiving - the day we focus on being thankful and grateful. As adults we often get busy and while we may think of our blessings, we don't actually stop and thank God for them. We wait until the last Thursday in November and we make a list of all we are grateful for and we share it over a meal, and then

life goes on.

This year, I have found myself thinking more and more about being grateful. I am grateful to God for all He has blessed me with and I try to make a conscious effort every day to thank Him for all of my blessings. But I've found myself thinking more about the people I am grateful for. We lost my Mom this past January, and I know she knew that I loved her, but I've been wondering if she knew how grateful I was for all she had given us. I know we say that we're sure they knew - but did I ever tell her? I don't ever recall sitting down and telling her how grateful I was for her sacrifices, her help, her guidance, her "lessons in life," and the lifetime of memories she gave us. And now I can't.

This has made me think more about making a conscious effort to make sure I don't lose that opportunity to share my gratitude with all those people who are still in my life who I am so grateful for. I know it should be easy, but life gets busy and my initial plan to tell somebody every day has already fallen off the track, but I'm determined to make that effort - with a text, an email, a phone call, a written note, a visit - whatever I am able to do just so they can know how important they are to me and what a difference they have made in my life.

I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude to all of you for all of the support you give to our school, as well as the support you have given to me as a teacher and the friendships I have made through my years here at St. Augustine.

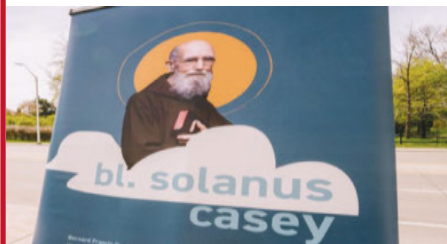

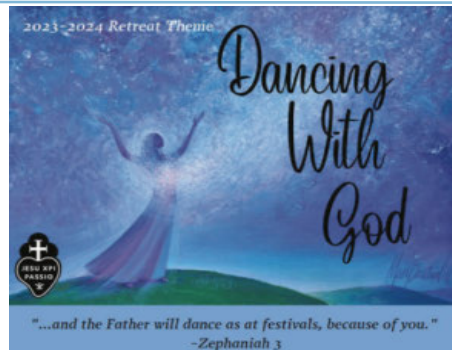

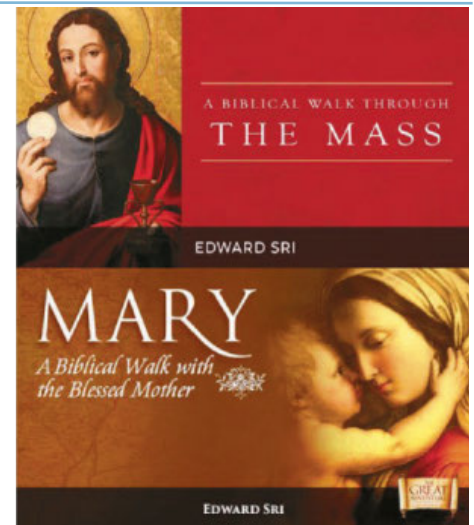

### Oplatki Christmas Wafers (Oplatek)

The tradition of the Oplatki originated in Poland during Early Christian times. This Christmas Custom began with a simple white wafer, baked from flour and water. The wafers are wonderfully designed to display Christmas images, such as the Nativity.

### HOW TO CELEBRATE THE OPLATKI TRADITION

The Oplatki are enjoyed by families, typically right before the Christmas Eve meal. The entire family will gather around the table with the Oplatek. Generally the eldest member of the family will begin the ritual by breaking off a piece of the wafer and passing it to another family member with a blessing. This blessing can simply consist of what you desire for your loved one in the upcoming year – whether it be good health, success, or happiness. The purpose of this act is primarily to express one's unconditional love and forgiveness for each member of his or her family.

### THE SYMBOLISM

The significance of the Oplatki Christmas wafer is in that it shadows the Eucharistic meal that Catholics participate in at each Mass. Just as we share in the Eucharist as one family in Christ and receive Christ's love through the Eucharist, the Oplatki allows for one's immediate family to come together and share the love they have for one another. This symbolism is deepened by the fact that the name of the town where Jesus Christ was born, Bethlehem, means "House of Bread," which makes the Oplatki tradition an especially beautiful way to celebrate the charity and unity so characteristic of the Christmas season.

### A SYMBOL OF FAMILY UNITY

The Oplatki tradition is one that is easy, fun, and deeply meaningful to introduce to the family anytime during the long Christmas season. All it requires is a simple wafer paired with love and affection, and the willingness to share it. This is a heartwarming tradition that will complete your family's time together during the Christmas season.

### Thank you to our St. Michael Cemetery Clean Up Volunteers

Twenty volunteers gathered at St. Michael Cemetery following morning mass on Saturday, November 4th. for the annual autumn clean-up. Out-of-season plants, leaves, and other debris were cleaned and removed in order to prepare the cemetery for the upcoming winter months. Our volunteers worked very hard, and it took only about two hours to make the cemetery look great! The efforts of our dedicated volunteers will help keep Saint Michael Cemetery a beautiful and dignified final resting place for the deceased members of our parish family. A special thanks to all of our volunteers; especially to those who brought their power equipment to aid in the clean up. Volunteers brought tractors, leaf blowers, and hedge trimmers, which greatly facilitated the time it took to clean the cemetery.

There is a concern, however, on the kind of decorations people have been leaving at their loved one's graves. In order to maintain a clean and orderly cemetery, please use only bio-degradable items that can be easily removed at the end of the season. Do not install bird houses, flags (other than Veterans flags), flower pots, or silk flowers, for these items are very difficult to clean. Under any circumstances, do NOT use rocks or stones as planter borders or decorations. Rocks are a safety hazard when it comes to mowing, and will be removed if found. These guidelines are necessary to keep St. Michael Cemetery clean and safe.

## Mail Call

**Q.** A very knowledgeable, trusted protestant friend claims that St. Peter was never in Rome, much less buried there, that it's just another example of a false Catholic tradition for which there is no evidence. Has the Church publicly retracted this claim?

**A.** Church tradition and Roman records dating back to the first century record Saint Peter resided in Rome where he suffered a martyr's death in the year 67 A.D. For thirteen centuries no one questioned the presence of St Peter's tomb at the Vatican. The first to dispute this were the adherents of the Waldensian heresy, who rejected the primacy of the Pope, maintaining that St. Peter was never in Rome and is not buried there. Likewise, Luther and other leaders of the Reformation denied the existence of St Peter's tomb in the Vatican. They too, denied papal primacy.

However, excavation work beneath St. Peter's Basilica confirms Church tradition. The excavations in the central area of the basilica, under the pope's altar, lead to the sensational discovery of the actual tomb and relics of St. Peter. The tomb of the Apostle Peter was highly venerated, to which the many inscriptions on the so called "graffiti wall" bear witness to the authenticity of this ancient site.

The first monument to be erected on the site was early in the 2nd century, about 30 years or so after St Peter's

death. Since the earliest information concerning the tomb of St. Peter comes from the Roman priest Gaius, the tombstone was called Gaius' Trophy.

The relics became the subject of anthropological studies of many years duration. Initially the studies were headed by Professor Galeazzi Lisi, then by Professor Correnti. The results of the studies were printed in 1965 in a book published by the Vatican: *Le reliquie di Pietro sotto la Confessione della Basilica Vaticana*.

The bones of St. Peter were wrapped in a valuable purple cloth interwoven with pure gold. The anthropological studies revealed that the bones belonged to one person, a male of stocky build, aged between 60-70 years and 5 feet 5 inches tall.

The scientific confirmation of the authenticity of the relics of St. Peter was an extremely important event. During the general audience on June 26, 1968 Pope Paul VI officially announced the discovery of the relics of St Peter. The following day, during the course of formal celebrations, the relics of the first Pope were laid to rest where they remain to this day.

For a direct answer to your questions: no, the Church has not retracted the claim that St Peter is entombed at the Vatican.
