From Fr. Mark Livingston

This Sunday, the Lord asks us to celebrate and take up the Word of God! He is the One Word and he has spoken many to lead us to salvation. In Pope Francis' September 30, 2019 motu proprio (an edict issued by the Pope personally to the Roman Catholic Church or to a part of it), called Aperuit illis ("opened to them"), he declared that "the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time is to be devoted to the celebration, study, and dissemination of the word of God." The title of this work is derived from the story of the road to Emmaus, in which "He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures" (Luke 24:45). His word has power to open us to life. The letter to the Hebrews says, "For the word of God is living and active, sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing to the division of soul and spirit, of joints and marrow, and discerning the thoughts intentions of heart" (Hebrews 4:12). In other words, he can get into us deeply. He can incise what otherwise would be impossible—truth and falsehood, right and wrong. He can cut through difficult things to discern well and give us the wisdom and ability to know the Lord's will and follow it.

The word of God reveals the face—the very identity—of the Word of God. St. Jerome famously wrote, "Ignorance of scripture is ignorance of Christ."

If we do not know the "living and effective" word of God in scripture that reveals his heart to us, then how can we say that we know Him? From our meditation on God's word, we see and experience the heart of God. He corrects and encourages. He speaks to us of his love for us and our true identity as precious and beloved sons and daughters of the Living God. He warns us to reject evil and to renounce the identity lies ("I'm not good enough", etc.) of the Evil One for true freedom.

Jesus, the Word Made Flesh, is the way, the truth and the life. We are hungry for Truth. We are hungry for true Life. We are hungry to know the Way. We are really hungry for Jesus. We will be satisfied by his word. The Lord tells us in scripture that "Man shall not live by bread alone, but by every word that pro-

ceeds from the mouth of God" (Matthew 4:4). In The Confessions, St. Augustine heard these famous words being chanted repeatedly by a child at the moment of his conversion, "Take and read!" He discerned it to be a call from the Lord to open scripture and read. So, he went to his friend, took his Bible, opened it, and read these words from Romans 13:12-14, "the night is far gone, the day is at hand. Let us then cast off the works of darkness and put on the armor of light; let us conduct ourselves becomingly as in the day, not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to gratify its desires." St. Augustine had been struggling with the desires of the flesh and, here, was freed from his slavery. The word of God cut through all of his struggles between flesh and Spirit to heal him.

On this "Word of God Sunday," take and read! This is not meant to be one Sunday only dedicated to the word of God, but

that every day might become word of God day. He wants us to read his Word and so live because of it. Please read a little scripture every day and pray with it. Maybe look up how to pray lectio divina and try it daily. You will feel at peace, helped and healed. He spoke his word to give us Life.

How are you doing with reading scripture daily? Take and read daily, possibly starting with the New Testament (Matthew) and reading daily until you reach the end of the Bible. Read a little on the page every day; don't try to do too much. Then, start adding other readings from other books from the Old Testament. Your hunger will grow! Maybe pick up a "Bible in a Year" reading plan online and follow it. Or, consider listening to the Bible in a Year Podcast with Fr. Mike which is excellent. Schmitz. Make the commitment to "take and read" the greatest living and effective work that ever was, is, and will be!



St. Augustine Catholic School spreads the Good NEWS by Navigating a Christian course, Educating body, mind and spirit, Worshiping the Lord, and Serving others.

Our middle school students recently had an opportunity to step into the mind of St. Francis's best known prayer to gain wisdom needed to live a holy life. Each student's task was to write a paper in which they had to break down each of St. Francis's requests to our Lord and not only describe what they thought he meant, but support their interpretations with Scripture. I'd like to share with you a seventh grade student's work, which gives a great example of the impact of this project.

St. Francis Prayer

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace

I can live my life to be like the Lord through faith. I can learn to adapt myself to the life of faith, mercy, and peace just how God is. I should mimic myself to be like God. Peace was all throughout the nation when Jesus was born. John 14:27. "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." This bible verse tells me that I should not be afraid because God gives peace on earth between everything.

Where there is hatred, let me sow love

Where hate is present, love should be shown. Instead of saying "If you do this to me, I'm gonna do this to you." I should instead show mercy and help when they need it and not show hate and be mature about situations. Ephesians 4:31-32: "Get rid of all bitterness, rage and anger, brawling and slander, along with every form of malice. Be kind and compassionate to one another, forgiving each other, just as in Christ God forgave you." This bible verse tells us that instead of hate and rage, I really just need to calm down, talk to God, and forgive who wronged me or I have wronged, just like Jesus did to all of us on the cross.

Where there is injury, pardon

Where there is pain or injury, pardon your enemies instead of not helping them, show them mercy. Romans 6:22: "Along with setting you free from sin's death penalty, God's pardon leads you to holiness and eternal life." This means that instead of sinning to hurt your enemies, I should talk to God about it, and ask him to forgive me. Do not fall into the path of sin when help is needed your way, it doesn't matter to God who you do and don't like.

St. Francis Inspires Us

Where there is doubt, faith

When you are in doubt, or questioning if God is real, pray. Faith is a gift from God and we all need to use it, instead of wondering by yourself "is God real?" just simply ask him. James 1:6-7: "But ask in faith, never doubting, for the one who doubts is like a wave of the sea, driven and tossed by the wind; for the doubter, being double-minded and unstable in every way, must not expect to receive anything from the Lord."

Where there is despair, hope

When hope is lost, it is to be regained. Since despair is the enemy of hope, do not give up on the Lord, pray and talk to him and ask him to show you love. Psalms 42:11: "Why are you in despair, my soul? Why are you disturbed within me? Hope in God! For I shall still praise him, the saving help of my countenance, and my God. This is just saying that if you are in despair, continue to praise the Lord."

Where there is darkness, light

When you are in the dark, whether it's depression, anger, or something else you're going through, always look for the light and make the best of hard times. John 1:5. "The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." This says that God shines in the darkness and he will overcome your fears.

Where there is sadness, joy

When you are sad, look for God instead of sulking and pray to him to let love and happiness into your life. Let joy overcome your sorrow and find peace and love in yourself and your faith. Psalm 30:11-12 "You have changed my sadness into a joyful dance; you have taken away my sorrow and surrounded me with joy. So I will not be silent; I will sing praise to you. Lord, you are my God; I will give you thanks forever." This bible verse just tells how much God really loves you and how much he wants you to be happy.

Grant that I may not so much seek to be consoled as to console

Instead of asking for comfort, look for people who need comfort and help them to find their faith once again. See people before you look at yourself. Isaiah 41:10: "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." This is what Jesus tells us and does not want us to fear because he is the ultimate comforter.



To be understood as to understand

Christ wants us to not be the one people understand but the person who understands everyone. Understanding is a gift that only some people acquire, a gift from God and once we figure out how to use it, you need to share it with others. Proverbs 3:13: "Happy is the man that findeth wisdom, and the man that getteth understanding." Happiness may be humanity's greatest desire. Men and women have always been looking for that which will make them happy. This tells that understanding is humanity's greatest desire.

To be loved as to love

When you are loved, be grateful, but you should also love others as much as you can. Stop loving yourself and trying to impress other people, put all of your love into other people. You should want to love rather than be loved. You want to give all of yourself to the ones you love. Ephesians 4:2: "Be completely humble and gentle; be patient, bearing with one another in love." This just tells you that you should be humble and patient, instead of greedy and mean

For it is in giving that we receive

Think of when you receive a gift, you're happy, then think of giving someone a gift they love, doesn't it make you happy to give someone else a gift and see how happy they are. Acts 20:35: "In everything I did, I showed you that by this kind of hard work we must help the weak, remembering the words the Lord Jesus himself said: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.'"

In pardoning, we are pardoned

When you forgive and show mercy, the Lord will show mercy to you, and forgive you. Isaiah 55:7: "let the wicked forsake his way, and the unrighteous man his thoughts; and let him return to the LORD, and he will have mercy on him; and to our God, for he will abundantly pardon." This tells me that God will always show mercy on me if I show mercy on others. And if you are in need of forgiveness, ask God to help you.

In dying, born to eternal life

This doesn't mean actually dying, it means that yourself has been reborn into a child of God that will enter eternal life. Romans 6:23: "For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord." Jesus must grow while my ego decreases as a reward of eternal life. If there is nothing left of yourself, and you give everything to other people, you are living a life of sacrificial love by following Jesus' example.



Sanctity of Life Sunday

The **3rd Sunday of January** is always Sanctity of Life Sunday (SOLS), which is January 21st this year. Please see the inserts in this weekend's bulletin for Sanctity of Life Sunday and pray the prayer on the back. The fliers were donated by Right to Life of St. Clair County (RTLSCC). We work and pray for the Sanctity of Life from conception to natural death.

The threat of Physician-Assisted Suicide is back. Several Michigan Senate Democrats introduced a package of bills to legalize Physician-Assisted suicide in Michigan on November 9, These bills threaten the terminally ill. This could eventually lead to threaten the elderly, minority groups, the disabled, and mentally ill. Adding assisted suicide as a possible "solution" could result in coerced or pressured deaths. 
