Fact of Faith: Why is Lent Forty Days? By Fr. Kishore Beezam

The Lenten season is a time of preparation for the liturgical celebration of the suffering, death, and resurrection of Christ. Many Catholics spend that time on the three practices of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It is a time to participate in the sacrament of penance and reconciliation.

The season of Lent lasts from Ash Wednesday until the evening of Holy Thursday. If Sundays are excluded from the count, the season lasts forty days. The forty-day length of Lent is rooted in the biblical usage of the number forty. Forty is typically indicative of a time of testing, trial, penance, purification, and renewal. In the New Testament, forty days is the length of Jesus' time of trial in the desert in preparation for his public ministry, proclaiming the Gospel.

Mark: 1: 12-15

"The Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and he remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan. He was among wild beasts, and the angels ministered to him. After John had been arrested, Jesus came to Galilee proclaiming the gospel of God: This is the time of fulfillment. The kingdom of God is at hand."

The 40 days period of Jesus' trial in the desert echoes a number of events in the Old Testament:

The face of the earth was cleansed and purified during the promised period of days and nights that rain poured down during the great flood--- "I will bring rain down on the earth for forty days and forty nights, and so I will wipe out form the surface of the earth every moving creature that I have made" (Gen: 7:4).

- The face of the earth was renewed during a forty-day period after the mountain tops appeared and the waters of the great flood receded--"The tops of the mountains appeared. At the end of forty days Noah opened the hatch of the ark that he had made" (Gen: 8: 5-6).
- Moses spent forty years as a shepherd in the desert before God called him to lead the Israelites out of slavery--- "Moses fled when he heard this and settled as an alien in the land of Midian... Forty years later, an angel appeared to him in the desert near Mount Sinai in the flame of a burning bush" (Acts: 7: 29-30).
- Moses fasted for forty days and nights on Mount Sinai before receiving the tablets of the covenant- "So Moses stayed there with the Lord of forty days and forty nights, without eating any food or drinking any water, and he wrote on the tablets the words of the covenant, the ten commandments" (Ex: 34: 28).
- The Israelites spend forty years wandering in the desert, as a time of testing, trial and purification of the people, before reaching the Promised Land--- "Now the Israelites had wandered forty years in the desert, until all the warriors, among the people that came forth from Egypt died off because they had not obeyed the command of the Lord" (Jos: 5:6; see Num: 32: 13).
- The prophet Elijah spend forty days in the desert before encountering God on Mount Horeb--- "(Elijah) got up, ate and drank; then strengthened by that food, he walked forty days and forty nights to the mountain of God, Horeb" (1Kgs: 19:8).

• The Ninevites were given forty days before God was going to destroy the city, allowing time for repentance and conversion—"Jonah began his journey through the city, and had gone but a single day's walk announcing, 'Forty days more and Nineveh shall be destroyed', when the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast and all of them, great and small, put on sackcloth" (Jon: 3: 4-5).

Practicing Lent Traditions

We can benefit from celebrating Lent even if your church does not formally do so. Here are some of the key elements of the Lenten season and some of the symbolism that comes with it. Many of these practices can be celebrated both individually and as a community:

- Confession: As mentioned above, Lent is a penitential season or expressed sorrow and repentance... The 40 days are set aside to examine areas of recurring sin in our lives that prevent us from conforming to God's Will. An excellent way to start an examination of conscience is by praying Psalm 139, verses 23-24: "Search me, O God, and know my heart; test me and know my thoughts. See if there is any wicked way in me, and lead me in the way everlasting."
- Fasting and Prayer: Fasting is a
 practice that has really gone by the
 wayside in many Christian circles.
 Yet, if done correctly, it can be a
 powerful time to renew your relationship with God. Fasting can be
 found in both the Old Testament
 and the New, with Moses (Exodus

- 34:28; Deuteronomy 9:9,18), Elijah (1 Kings 19:8), and our Lord (Matthew 4:2) all participating in 40 -day fasts. Fasting is a way of denying ourselves the excesses of life so that we might be more attuned to the Lord's voice. It is also a way of disciplining yourself, strengthening your "spiritual muscles," so to speak, so that when temptations arise in life, you are already used to saying "no" to your desires. And finally, fasting is also a way of participating, in a small way, in the sufferings of Christ and can be particularly powerful when accompanied by prayer and confession.
- Charity/Almsgiving: A very important element of the Lenten season is becoming aware of not only the suffering and sacrifice of Christ but also the suffering of others. Between now and Good Friday, choose one way you can increase your giving to those in need. It could be through extra financial offerings, donating goods you no longer need or use to charity, or increasing your personal time commitment to a ministry or cause close to your heart.

What to Give Up for Lent

Fasting is an important practice during Lent. Traditionally, people choose to give up certain indulgences or habits as a form of self-discipline to focus on spiritual growth and closeness to Christ. Are you looking for some ideas of what to give up for Lent? Here are some ideas found online for things that Christians might consider giving up for Lent:

 Social Media: Taking a break from social media can provide more time

- for prayer, reflection, and personal connection. It also reduces distractions and allows for a quieter, more focused Lenten season.
- Television and Entertainment: Cutting back on TV or entertainment can create more time for prayer, Bible study, and other spiritual practices.
- Meat: Abstaining from meat on certain days or throughout the entire Lenten period is a common practice, symbolizing solidarity with Christ's sacrifice.
- Negative Speech or Gossip: Choosing to give up negative speech, gossip, or critical comments can foster a more positive and uplifting environment.
- Alcohol: Abstaining from alcohol during Lent is a way to practice self -control and redirect the focus on spiritual matters.
- Complaining: Giving up the habit of complaining and cultivating a spirit of gratitude can lead to a more positive and thankful outlook on life.

It's important to note that the purpose of giving up something for Lent is not simply to abstain from a particular pleasure, but to use the opportunity for spiritual reflection, growth, and drawing closer to God. Individuals may choose to replace what they give up with acts of kindness, prayer, or other positive habits to deepen their Lenten experience.

Thank God for the gift of this season.

Don't Expect Me Not to Pray

The life of a teacher is far from easy. Many of the days are filled with stress and uncertainty, rebellion and craziness, and ...(well, you get the point). For this reason, there is no doubt that every could use bit teacher a encouragement, wisdom, support, advice, or even just a pat on the back to let them know they're doing okay and that things will turn out just fine, (They will, you know).

Recently, as I was exercising with teachers who work in public school systems, I found some of the support and wisdom that only teachers can give to one another. Even better than that, I got a perfect reminder of how truly wonderful being a CATHOLIC school teacher can be.

Oh..don't get me wrong. Teaching is tough! Let me see if I can enlighten you about some of the things it involves...

Teachers have to go in a room filled with twenty kids or so and fill every waking moment with a love for learning. They're supposed to instill a sense of pride, modify disruptive behavior, observe them for signs of bullying, and even censor their dress habits.

Teachers in the upper grades check backpacks, teach patriotism, good citizenship, sportsmanship, fair play, how to register to vote, how to balance a checkbook, and how to apply for a job.

Teachers have to maintain a safe environment, know procedures for fire drills and lockdown drills, recognize signs of antisocial behavior, and make sure all students pass mandatory state exams, even those who don't come to school regularly or complete only half of their assignments.

They are to make sure that all students with handicaps receive an equal education regardless of the extent of their mental or physical abilities. They have to communicate regularly with parents by in person meetings, phone, email, newsletter, and report cards.

Teachers have to do all of this with just a piece of chalk or expo marker, a computer, a few books, a smart board and a big smile!

The big difference between St A's teachers and public school teachers is that teachers don't have to do it all alone. We can pray anytime, anywhere, OUT LOUD and so can our kids! The emphasis here is God. We are confident that God hears us and He gives us what we need, when we need it.

In our third grade classroom at St. Augustine, I KNOW that God is with me every single day, on the good ones and the not-so-good-ones. I love our prayer table decorated with a statue from Sr. Maureen, a special rosary (a gift from a student), a children's bible, a basket full of plastic eggs with our lenten promises, and two containers overflowing with blessings and worries that the children can fill and know God is listening.

I love that I can stop my daily routine anytime to pray. We can walk over to church in the middle of the day and put our prayer requests in the divine mercy box and even light a prayer candle for an injured child at recess. (That's a beautiful sight to see...20 nine year olds bowing their heads in prayer, giving their worries to the Lord).

There are many other opportunities to pray. I can pray with a parent after a conference. Students can draw pictures of their favorite place to pray. We can start each day with prayer. We can pray before we receive our favorite hot lunch of pizza. We can send them on their way at the end of the day with prayer.

Though teaching, like other professions, may be a little less than perfect, to be a Catholic school teacher who is free to pray with students is, to me, one of the luckiest people in the entire universe!

Our thanks to you for your support and prayers for all teachers and these precious little ones!
