Time, Treasure, and Talents

The past few Sundays we have heard about prayer, fasting, and almsgiving as we prepared to enter into the Lenten season. These three things are about each of us giving something of ourselves so that we can enter into a relationship with Jesus in a more personal level, getting to know Him and how He looks at us too. In all the Gospels, before Jesus does anything He first goes to a quiet place and prays,

“After doing so, he went up on the mountain by himself to pray. When it was evening he was there alone.” (Matt 14:23)

This can give us a clue on just how to hear God call us to use our own time, talent, and treasures as He meant us to, for the good of the faithful and His Church. There are different areas where all of us could use some of our treasure, time, or talent to help the poor and suffering that need the faithful “us.”

God gives us all that we have to build up His Kingdom, we should not use faithfulness in one calling as an excuse to forsake another. How we spend our time both reveals and trains our hearts, but how do we know God is calling us? Remember a couple Sundays back when Samuel was awakened because he thought Eli was calling his name? Then finally, Eli realized it was God calling Samuel and then instructed Samuel how to respond to God who was really calling him. So to, for us sometimes God calls us to do something through the people around us but we fail to recognize that it is God calling us. I laugh sometimes when I am greeting people after Mass and once in a while I see a young person walk by and I will say to them, “have you thought about being an altar server?” And I see a parent smile. I don’t say it to every young person just some.

Have you had more than one person ask you if you have ever thought of be-

ing an usher, or a lector? How about an Extraordinary Minister of Holy Communion (EMHC)? The first time I felt called to a ministry was overhearing a message on a machine that was directed toward my wife, but also asked if I would be interested in a ministry during the Mass. God reaches out to us in so many ways. Maybe during one of Fr. Mark’s talks at Wednesday evening something just pulled at your heart but you just are not sure what it is, where do you go? Who do you look for to find out more? Another question. My wife is a lector and my daughter/son is an altar server, there is no way for me to serve because it is impossible to be at three different Masses? Here are some answers:

- Anyone can approach the priest or deacons after Mass and we can encourage you to continue to pray about your possible call to a ministry at Mass. We will tell you to please call the office to get further information.
- You could also ask the person who has mentioned a ministry to you if they know who to see about more information.
- There is also a scheduling system in place that can have multiple family members serve at the same Mass so there are not multiple trips to different Masses. You can schedule many weeks in advance and if you have times when you are not available that too can be scheduled in so you do not have to worry about missing a date.

Lastly, all three of our Parishes are in need of altar servers, lectors, ushers, EMHC’s, and sacristans to have the Mass move smoothly so that our people hear God speak to them as he speaks to all of us.

Q. I am a Methodist by birth. I have been attending Mass with my husband for about four years now. This time every year I become confused. It is unclear to me exactly what the Church means by fasting and abstinence. Can you please explain? My husband is not the best at explaining things like these.

A. I will be happy to try. Many questions, like yours, really require a lot more space to answer than is available in a church bulletin. Certainly, many things we Catholics take for granted can indeed be confusing, and even misunderstood by our brothers and sisters in other faith communities. I know this for a fact because I did not enter the Church until my mid-fifties, and I had my share of both questions and misunderstandings.

Abstinence is an obligation that applies to all Catholics age 14 and older and means we must abstain from eating meat on certain days. Seafood is a typical substitute. In the United States abstinence is an obligation only on Ash Wednesday and all Fridays of Lent. Before the Council of Vatican II, every Friday of the year was a day of obligatory abstinence. Many Catholics today still practice some form of abstinence on Fridays to help keep Jesus Christ front and center in their lives. This fasting may be something other than fasting from food, television for example.

Fasting on the other hand is an obligation that applies to all Catholics ages 18 to 59 and is only obligatory on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. Fasting means we are allowed to eat only one

full meal on the day of the fast. Two smaller meals may be eaten so long as together they don't equal the one full meal. Snacking is also prohibited. Fasting is only required for those healthy enough to fast. Medical conditions prevent some people from fasting. Although people above the age of 59 are exempt from the obligation, many seniors, who are in good health, still practice fasting.

Both abstinence and fasting are ways for us to discipline our desires. The more we practice self-discipline the better we become at it. These small sacrifices on our part help to remind us of the great sacrifice Jesus paid for our redemption as we practice them. Since you were interested enough to ask this question, and given your marital status, you may well have other questions. I suggest the inquiry period of the RCIA – (Right of Christian Initiation of Adults). This is a process where people learn the answers to their questions about Catholicism. You will learn answers to questions you didn't even know you had. There is no pressure to become Catholic. The Church believes that is a personal decision and must be made based solely on the desire of the individual without outside pressure.

What's New in Second Grade

Wow!! What a very important and very busy year we are having here in second grade. Along with reading, writing, and arithmetic, this is the year that children prepare for two Sacraments, Reconciliation and First Holy Eucharist, or First Communion. The children have now completed their First Reconciliation and we are continuing to prepare for our "Big Event", the Sacrament of the Eucharist.

As their teacher, I can explain that this is a very important sacrament, but experiencing it is what makes it a reality. We have learned that in preparing to receive the body and blood of Christ, we have been invited to the table of Jesus to receive that gift of his body and blood. With the current liturgical calendar, the children know that this is the season of Lent where Jesus celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples. It was during this event that Jesus gave us the gift of His body and blood. We also understand that during Mass, we are called upon to remember what Jesus did at the Last Supper.

At Mass we listen to the words that are spoken by Father, "Then Jesus took the bread, said the blessing, broke the bread, and gave it to his disciples saying, 'Take this all of you and eat it, this is my body, which will be given up for you, do this in memory of me.'" When we listen to these words and watch in preparation of our First Holy Communion, we have to wonder, "What does this really mean?" So I asked the children that question, "What does this really mean?". We took a moment to ponder and reflect on these questions, "What does the Bread of Life Mean to you?" and "How can you prepare your heart to receive Jesus in Holy Communion?"

These were some of the answers I received:

- That Jesus loves us and that he forgives our sins...

- Communion is super special because we are receiving Jesus's body and blood...
- It is so that you can remember Jesus, his death, and his resurrection...
- It's like following in Jesus's footsteps until his last moments, knowing that he will come again...
- When you receive the Eucharist, you remember what Jesus did for us...
- He did this so that our sins could be forgiven.....
- We learned that you have to reconcile your sins before you can take communion...
- We are being called to Jesus's supper, the altar is his table...
- When you take the host, and say Amen, it means "I believe"...

Much like before we take the Lord's meal at Mass, as we are called to his supper in the form of communion, we pray. We ask for the forgiveness of sins, we state our beliefs, and we accept the host and wine, as Jesus's body and blood. This practice is at the core of our beliefs. Every day, before we go to lunch to eat our mid-day meal, we say a prayer: I thought about this as we talked about it as a class. We decided our lunchtime prayer shows a direct correlation between what we practice at Mass before partaking in Jesus's meal and what we say before our daily meal. This is our prayer, see if you can say it too:

**"For what we are about to
receive,
(the Eucharist)
May the Lord make us truly
thankful,
(for Jesus's sacrifice)
Amen."
(I believe)**



My name is Joyce Toia. I am the representative from the Detroit Cursillo Movement for our Parish of Families. Cursillo came to Detroit in 1962 and is sanctioned by the Archdiocese of Detroit. There are thousands of cursillistas, as we are called, in Michigan and millions around the world including bishops, ordained clergy and lay people. Pope Francis is a cursillista and he promotes it openly.

Cursillo is considered a lay movement. A lay movement that is run by Catholic lay leaders along with the clergy.

On a weekend lay people witness to their faith in presentations and the clergy present the doctrinal talks. It is a weekend of fellowship, information, beautiful liturgies, prayer, meditation, singing, and a lot of merriment. It is a special time with the Lord. Time when you can relax, enjoy, be waited on, and have a private room with your own shower. There are no expectations of you but to enjoy, learn and absorb all that the Lord has planned for you.
