Our Catholic Faith

Advent is only 2 weeks away!

Advent (Lat. ad-venio, to come to)

It's time to start preparing for Advent. This year begins the Sunday after Thanksgiving, **November**28th begins the Liturgical season of Advent. The next two weeks we will focus on being prepared to focus on this special liturgical season. First by learning about Advent, and next week about special ways to celebrate the season.

What is Advent? It is the period of the Church leading up to Christmas. It consists of 4 Sundays

The Advent season is a time of *preparation* that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and to the anniversary of Our Lord's birth on Christmas.

When is Advent? The Sunday nearest the feast of Saint Andrew the Apostle (November 30th). It can be as early as 27 November (a 28 day season) and as late as 2 December (a 21 day season).

Why celebrate Advent? Our Advent readings call us to be alert and ready, not weighted down and distracted by the cares of this world (Lk 21:34-36). Like Lent, the liturgical color for Advent is purple since both are seasons that prepare us for great feast days. Advent also includes an element of penance in the sense of preparing, quieting, and disciplining our hearts for the full joy of Christmas.
