
Welcome to Sacred Heart Parish



ROSARY FOR PEACE

Join us for the Rosary for Peace Wednesdays, 4:30pm

Rosary is being offered for our brothers and sisters being persecuted for their faith, for our special intentions, for friends in need of healing and for our family and friends. All are welcome to attend!

Our Lady of the Rosary, October 7th October became the Month of the Rosary as it is also the time we celebrate Our Lady of the Rosary, October 7th, a feast commemorating the defeat of the Ottoman Empire fleet by the Catholic league navy at the Battle of Lepanto, 1571. It was a time when naval battles were far more significant than modern warfare, and approximately 400 vessels lined up to fight in the skirmish. The Holy League going into battle was outnumbered by the Ottomans; however, a call to arms, or rosaries in this case, by Pope Pious V, pleaded with soldiers and Catholic communities to fervently pray the Rosary in hopes of success. As a result, approximately 65,000 soldiers of the Holy League carried a rosary with them into battle. The victory against the Empire is a turning point in Western history. It was the last significant engagement against the Ottoman Empire and ceased its goal to expand over Europe. Interesting Facts

- Our Lady of the Rosary is also called Our Lady of Victory. Its original title until Pope Gregory XIII focused the feast on commemorating the strengthening of the power of praying the Rosary.
- The Pope helped fund the army. The Ottoman Empire would have pressured Europe to convert to an Islamic State.
- ◆ The Holy League was made up of Spanish and present-day Italian soldiers.
