Anointing of the Sick





Our Catholic Faith



So... how do we use it?

A wreath is often used in homes as the focus of prayer. The Advent wreath is most appropriately lit at dinner time.

On the first Sunday in Advent (November 27), gather around the Advent wreath. In silence, light the first purple candle, and pray:

Father,
we praise you for sending your Son
to save us from our sins
and to be light in our darkness.
Bless us as we gather in his name,
and bless this wreath as a sign of His light among us.
We ask this blessing through Christ our Lord. Amen!

On the remaining Sundays in Advent (December 4,11, &18) gather around the Advent wreath. Lighting the candle from the previous week, and one more purple candle, pray:

Heavenly Father,
look upon us with love,
and fill us with the spirit of Jesus.
Help us to love you,
and protect us this week
as we await the coming of our Lord. We ask this
grace in the name of Jesus our Lord. Amen!

On the third Sunday in Advent (December), gather around the Advent wreath. Lighting the candles from the previous two weeks, and then the rose candle, pray the above prayer in those or similar words.

On the final Sunday of Advent (December), lighting the candles from the prior Sundays, and finally light the last purple candle, pray the above prayer in those or similar words.
