From the Pastor:



With the birth of Christ the Holy Family became visible to the world and they remain for us the model of Christian family life. Today, in the Church, we celebrate the feast of the Holy Family and we ask God to bless and protect all families.

Sister Lucia, one of the Fatima children was told by our Lady that the final battle between God and the devil will be over marriage and the family.

An article from Catholic News Agency states, "Cardinal Caffarra explained that Saint John Paul II had commissioned him to plan and establish the Pontifical Institute for Studies on Marriage and Family. At the beginning of this work, the cardinal wrote a letter to Sister Lucia of Fatima through her bishop, since he could not do it directly."

"Inexplicably, since I did not expect a reply, seeing as I had only asked for her prayers, I received a long letter with her signature, which is now in the archives of the Institute," the Italian cardinal said. "In that letter we find written: 'The final battle between the Lord and the kingdom of Satan will be about Marriage and the Family.' Don't be afraid, she added, because whoever works for the sanctity of Marriage and the Family will always be fought against and opposed in every way, because this is the decisive issue. Then she concluded: 'nevertheless, Our Lady has already crushed his head'."
