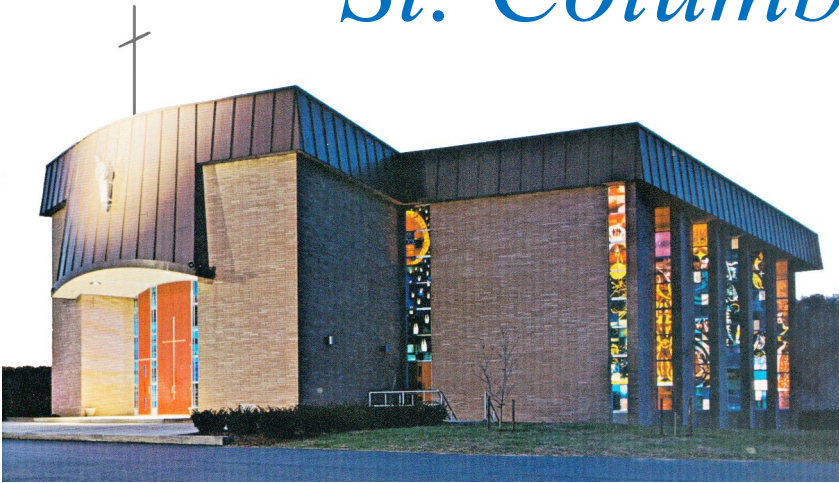

The following is from an article in the Washington Times by Bradford Richardson - *The Washington Times* - Wednesday, April 11, 2018:

In England, when they cut funding for sex education, teen pregnancies actually declined.

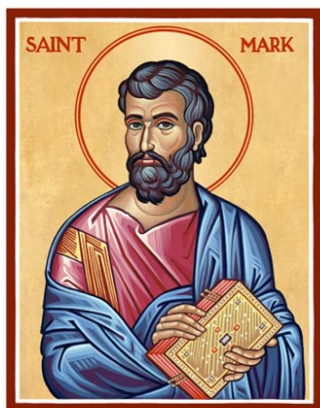
I pray that the truth will be made known and that the truth of Jesus professed by the Catholic Church will be heeded.
