~PASTOR'S NOTES~

I hope everyone had a nice Thanksgiving.

Today is the last Sunday of Ordinary Time and so we celebrate the Solemnity of Jesus Christ, King. Our liturgical calendar mirrors the ages from the beginning of creation until the end of time. Advent begins a new church year as we prepare for the coming of God as man (Christmas), His life and teachings while on earth (Ordinary Time), His redemptive act of suffering, dying, and rising from the dead (Lent and Easter), while the end of the church year reminds us that Jesus Christ will come at the end of time when, "He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and His Kingdom will have no end." (Nicene Creed)

However, our Lord Jesus Christ is to rule not just at the end of time, but He is to rule all people's hearts and minds here and now, including countries and governments.



Atheism has reared its ugly head in society and is attacking those who believe in God while trying to force their sick and immoral Godless agenda on all citizens. There will likely be a renewed attack since the Democratic Party, along with our diabolical governor, has taken control of both the Senate and Assembly in New York State. As G.K.
