




WINE, HOST, AND TABERNACLE CANDLE

~PASTOR'S NOTES~

December 27, 2020

Friday we rejoiced in the Birth of Jesus, God made Man. Today we honor the members of the family He was born into. The Holy Family, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, offer all our families an example we should all strive for. This feast had its roots in a devotion of Bishop Francois Laval who established many confraternities in honor of the Holy Family in Canada in the 17th century. In 1893, Pope Leo XIII instituted this feast throughout the universal Church. Certainly in our own day and age, when marriage and the family are under constant assault by the media, government, and anti-Catholic groups, it is important to reflect and meditate on the virtues of the members of the Holy Family. As Jesus was the center of the Holy Family so he should be the center of every family. If we ignore Jesus or relegate Him to the periphery of our family lives, we will struggle vainly to form a home of love, obedience, and respect for one another. **May the Holy**

Family guard and protect us as we are about to enter a new year, and draw us closer to each other by drawing us closer to Jesus.



In some exciting news, Pope Francis has also declared this year the Year of St. Joseph, as we read from this article by Rodney Pelletier: **VATICAN CITY** (ChurchMilitant.com) - Pope Francis is declaring December 2020–2021 the Year of St. Joseph, asking people to "implore his intercession and to imitate his virtues and zeal."

The apostolic letter, released Tuesday, features seven reflections on the person of St. Joseph. Pope Francis declares "After Mary, the Mother of God, no saint is mentioned more frequently in the papal Magisterium than Joseph, her spouse." He further notes that Pope Pius IX declared him patron of the Catholic Church, Pope Pius XII declared him patron of workers and Saint John Paul II called him guardian of the Redeemer.

In the letter, Pope Francis speaks to the fatherly qualities of St. Joseph, declaring:
Each of us can discover in Joseph — the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence — an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble. Saint Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation.

The following prayer can be found on the second floor of St. Joseph's Seminary in Dunwoodie by a statue of St. Joseph. I recited this prayer every day when I was studying for the priesthood and still say today.

O Glorious St. Joseph! Model of those who are devoted to labor, obtain for me the grace to work in a spirit of penance for the expiation of my many sins: to work conscientiously, putting the call to duty above my inclinations; to work with thankfulness and joy, considering it an honor to employ and develop by means of labor the gifts received from God; to work with order, peace, moderation, and patience, never shrinking from weariness and trials; to work, above all, with purity of intention and detachment from self, keeping unceasingly before my eyes death, and the account I must give of time lost, talents unused, good omitted, and vain complacency in success, so fatal to the work of God.

All for Jesus, all through Mary, all after thy example, O patriarch Joseph, such shall be my watchword in life and in death. Amen.
