

+ Apostles Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord; who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. He descended into hell; the third day He arose again from the dead; He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of God, the Father Almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and life everlasting. Amen.

+ The Ten Commandments

+ How to Pray the Rosary

Begin the rosary with the Sign of the Cross. Recite the Apostles' Creed. Pray one Our Father, Three Hail Mary's, One Glory B Fatima Prayer

To pray each decade, meditate on the mystery saying the Our Father on the large single bead and a Hail Mary on each of the ten smaller beads. Close each decade by praying the Glory Be and Fatima Prayer.







Advent: 4 weeks of preparation before the celebration of Jesus' birth

Christmas: recalling the Nativity of Jesus Christ and his manifestation to the peoples of the world Lent: a six-week period of penance before Easter Sacred Paschal Triduum: the holiest "Three Days" of the Church's year, where Christian people recall the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus Easter - 50 days of joyful celebration of the Lord's resurrection from the dead and his sending forth of the Holy Spirit

Ordinary Time - divided into two sections (one span of 4-8 weeks after Christmas Time and another lasting about six months after Easter Time), wherein the faithful consider the fullness of Jesus' teachings and works among his people.



+ Beatitudes

- Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- Blessed are the meek; for they shall possess the land.
- Blessed are they that mourn; for they shall be comforted.
- Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for justice, for they shall have their fill.
- Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy.
- Blessed are the pure of heart, for they shall seeGod
- Blessed are the peacemakers; for they shall be called the children of God.
- Blessed are those who are persecuted for justice sake; for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.





Prayers/Teaching introduced and learned in 5th Grade

+ Sacrament of Baptism

Baptism frees us from Original Sin and is necessary for salvation. We are called to be Priest, Prophet and King.

+ Sacrament of the Sick

The Sacrament of the Sick helps unite those who are suffering with Jesus' saving and healing power.

+ Types of Sin

After we are baptized and the stain or Original Sin is washed away, **all sins** are a result of **our choices**. There are 2 types of sin:

Venial – a deliberate act, of minor consequence.

Mortal – a grave matter, committed deliberately and full understanding it is wrong.

+ The Memorare

Remember, O most gracious Virgin, Mary, that never was it known that anyone who fled to thy protection, implored thy help or sought thy intercession, was left unaided. Inspired by this confidence, I fly unto thee, O Virgin of virgins, my Mother; to thee I come, before thee I stand, sinful & sorrowful. O Mother of the Word Incarnate despise not my petitions, but in thy mercy hear & answer me. Amen.



+ The Stations of the Cross

- 1. Pilate condemns Jesus to die
- 2. Jesus accepts his cross
- 3. Jesus falls for the first time
- 4. Jesus meets his mother, Mary
- 5. Simon helps carry the cross
- 6. Veronica wipes the face of Jesus
- 7. Jesus falls for the 2nd time
- 8. Jesus meets the women of Jerusalem
- 9. Jesus falls for the third time
- 10. Jesus is stripped of his clothes
- 11. Jesus is nailed to the cross
- 12. Jesus dies on the cross
- 13. Jesus is taken down from the cross
- 14. Jesus is placed in the tomb

+ Steps to making a Moral Choice

- 1. Ask the Holy Spirit for help
- 2. Think about God's law and the teachings of the Church.
- 3. Think about what will happen as a result of your choice – will the consequences be pleasing to God? Will my choice hurt someone else?
- 4. Seek advice from someone you respect and remember that Jesus is with you.
- 5. Ask yourself how your choice will affect your relationship with God and others.

+ Sacrament of Reconciliation

The Sacrament of Reconciliation, one of the two Sacraments of Healing, is an encounter with Jesus that forgives sins and restores us to grace

+ Sacrament of Anointing the Sick

The sacrament that helps unite those who are suffering with Jesus' saving and healing power is the Anointing of the Sick

Prayers/Teaching Introduced and learned in 8th Grade

+ Precepts of the Catholic Church

Each of these precepts of the Catholic Church is a requirement. Together with the Ten Commandments, they represent the minimum level of moral living.

Intentional violation of the precepts or the Commandments is a *grave matter*, meaning a mortal sin.

- 1. You shall attend Mass on Sundays and on holy days of obligation and rest from servile labor.
- 2. You shall confess your sins at least once a year.
- 3. You shall receive the sacrament of the Eucharist at least during the Easter season.
- 4. You shall observe the days of fasting and abstinence established by the Church.
- 5. You shall help to provide for the needs of the Church


All Catholics are called to move beyond the minimum by growing in love of God and love of neighbor

+Sacrament of Marriage

The Sacrament of Marriage is a covenant, which is more than a contract. Covenant always expresses a relationship between persons. The marriage covenant refers to the relationship between the husband and wife, a permanent union of persons capable of knowing and loving each other and God. The celebration of marriage is also a liturgical act, appropriately held in a public liturgy at church. Catholics are urged to celebrate their marriage within the Eucharistic Liturgy.

+Sacrament of Holy Orders

Catholic men who "take Holy Orders" receive a special sacrament called *Holy Orders*, which creates the hierarchy of deacon, priest, and bishop. These men (who are ordained by a bishop by means of that sacrament) serve the spiritual needs of others in the Catholic Church

Introductory Rite - We Offer our Prayer

Greeting/Opening Prayer

--> We gather as community to celebrate God's presence in our lives.

Penitential Rite

--> We acknowledge our sinfulness and ask for God Mercy

Kyrie

--> We pray for God's forgiveness

• Gloria

--> We sing praise that truly gives Glory to God

Collect

--> Collects the prayers of those gathered

Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

--> Usually from the Old Testament or Acts of the Apostles

Responsorial Psalm

--> We respond to God's word in the Psalm (usually sung)

Second Reading

--> We listen to Gods word from the books of the New Testament

Gospel Acclamation

--> We sing praise and open our hearts to hear the Gospel

Gospel

--> We listen to a reading from one of the Gospels

Homily

--> We listen as Priest or Deacon explains God's Word

Profession of Faith

--> We proclaim our faith and what we believe

Prayers of the Faithful

--> We pray for the needs of ourselves and others

Liturgy of the Eucharist

Presentation

--> Gifts are brought to the altar

and Preparation of the Gifts --> The altar is prepared

Eucharistic Prayer/Preface

--> The Priest offers Prayer of Thanksgiving

Holy, Holy, Holy

--> We are all called to pray in praise of God

Consecration

--> Through the power of the Holy Spirit, and actions and prayer of the Priest, the bread and wine become the Body and Blood

of Jesus Christ

Mystery of Faith

--> We remember all that Jesus has done to save us

■ The Lord's Prayer

--> We pray to be united with Christ

Sign of Peace

--> We pray that we may be united with each other through Christ

Lamb of God

--> We ask the Lamb of God, who talks away our sins, to give us peace

Communion

--> We receive the Body (and Blood) of Christ

Prayer after Communion

--> After silent prayer, the Priest leads Prayer after Communion

Concluding Rites

Greeting and Blessing

--> The Priest offers a final blessing

Dismissal

--> We are sent to Glorify the Lord by loving and serving Him in one another
