Dear Parishioners,

Being around so many children, teenagers, and young adults both in India and in the USA; I've gained much insight and experience by ministering to them. Our children are so rich, life-changing, and unforgettable! They're truly blessings from God! Like a ball of yarn; they're tangled in love and affection, play and teasing, quarrels and infectious smiles!

Children indeed amaze us with their simplicity, innocence, curiosity, and wonderment and instinctively gravitate to love. They make our lives beautiful and meaningful. Whether family, relatives, friends or our church community, we can all experience the children as they unite everyone together bringing so much joy and happiness to the family and community. Children are close to the kingdom of God. Children reflect that part of us that is still innocent, loving, forgiving, sympathetic, loyal and trusting to only name a few. If we can relate to these qualities in a child, we can reconnect with our own inner child. What true blessings from God!

The Bible is clear that children are to be looked upon as a blessing, not an inconvenience. They are a reward and truly, are a GIFT from God. They are ours in the sense they are entrusted to us, yes...Still... they are His children; God's children and belong to Him.

Mass is not about some thing. It is about the One who loves me.

"Mass is Boring."

Before I had truly *encountered* Jesus, this statement described my experience at times. Perhaps it does for you as well. We go to Mass and feel the same holy water on our foreheads, participate in the same rituals, speak the same words, see the same things... But is Mass really boring?

Just to help keep myself honest, I looked up the definition of boring. My source indicates boredom comes from restlessness, because I am not interested in something. Hmm. Yet Mass is not about some *thing*. It is about the *One* who loves me.

Mass—I can say it, we each can say it—is about the Someone who loves me so much that not only did he die for me, but he literally defeated sin and death, crushed Satan, and opened up the gates of heaven for me so that I could live in eternal bliss forever. Even if I were the only human in the universe, the only person in need of rescue, he would have done it all for me, just for me.

And guess what? He would have done it just for you, too.

Friends, this is what the Mass is about: entering into the depths of self-giving love that Jesus poured out on the cross and continues to pour out every time his self-sacrifice is renewed at Mass. And he wants us there, all of us. No, not just meaning each and every one of us (although that is true too!), but our whole selves—our minds, our hearts, our bodies, our souls—100% of me, all there; 100% of you, all there—for him, through him, with him, in him.

It is possible to perceive Mass as boring, but the objective truth of the matter is that this just isn't reality. Mass is the most exciting, passionate, profound experience we could ever have with another Person. And that Person happens to be the Son of God, Jesus Christ, in perfect communion with his Father, through the Spirit.


