Letter from the Pastor

Being out in the desert by ourselves would be a very frightening experience for many of us. We may have the feeling of being lost and feeling a sense of loneliness and abandonment. The desert at a glance may appear as an arid wasteland and perhaps lifeless. Looking at it more closely, a desert is full of life and beauty but also death. Lent is our journey through the desert where we encounter God in a very special and unique way. Prayer, fasting, almsgiving—these have been the traditional means whereby we journey with Jesus Christ for 40 days and nights. Love comes first, otherwise we may become a people zealous and excited for social justice and peace but unable to inspire it in others. Indeed, we may be good and holy people but if we have not discovered in prayer the reason for our journey, it cannot succeed. It is difficult and yet so important to let my Lenten prayer and fasting overcome my near occasion of sin. May this God of faithfulness and love do in us what he did in Jesus. Christ Jesus was able to pray always to fast, to trust in the will of God the Father, to remain faithful and lastly to overcome temptation and sin. May we have the courage to enter Lent with a changed heart.

Lenten Schedule

- **Stations of the Cross:** Join the school for Stations of the Cross each Friday of Lent at 2:30 pm in church.
- **Confessions:** Confessions are at 11:00 am -12 noon weekdays. On Saturdays of Lent, until and through the Eve of Palm Sunday, priests will be available from 3:00-3:45 pm **Confessions before Easter are by appointment ONLY between Holy Wednesday and Holy Saturday.**
- **Fasting:** Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59 years are obligated to fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday. To fast means to eat no more than one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to the full meal within a 24 hour period. Those who are ill, pregnant, nursing, or work in extremely physical jobs are exempt from the fast.
- **Abstinence:** All those between ages 14-65 are to refrain from eating meat and foods prepared from meat such as sauces, gravies, and soup from meat stock on **Ash**

Wednesday, Lenten Fridays, and Good Friday. People should seek to do more rather than less, since fasting and abstinence on the prescribed days should be considered a minimal response to the Lord's call to penance and conversion of life.

- *Estaciones de la Cruz:* Unirse a la escuela para Estaciones de la Cruz cada viernes de Cuaresma a las 2:30 pm en la iglesia.
- *Confesiones* son a las 11:00 am - 12:00 pm cada día laborable. Los sábados de Cuaresma, inclusive hasta el Domingo de Ramos, sacerdotes estarán disponibles 3:00 a las 3:45. Confesiones antes de Pascua son con cita previa entre el Miércoles Santo y el Sábado Santo.
- *Ayuno:* Católicos entre las edades 18 - 59 están obligados ayunar en oración el Miércoles de Ceniza y el Viernes Santo. Ayunar significa comer no más que una comida completa y dos comidas más pequeñas (que no son iguales a la comida completa) durante el día completo de 24 horas. Los que están enfermos, embarazadas, amamantando, o trabajar en trabajos físicos están exentos del ayuno.
- *Abstinencia:* Todos entre las edades de 14 - 65 son de abstenerse de comiendo carne y alimentos preparados de carne como salsas y sopas de caldo de carne el Miércoles Santo, los viernes de Cuaresma, y el Viernes Santo. Los fieles deben tratar de hacer más y no menos, porque el ayuno y la abstinencia en los días prescritos deben ser considerados una respuesta mínima a la llamada del Señor a la penitencia ya la conversión de la vida.

Viviendo la Cuaresma

Durante este tiempo especial de purificación, contamos con una serie de medios concretos que la Iglesia nos propone y que nos ayudan a vivir la dinámica cuaresmal.

Ante todo, la vida de oración, condición indispensable para el encuentro con Dios. En la oración, si el creyente ingresa en el diálogo íntimo con el Señor, deja que la gracia divina penetre su corazón y, a semejanza de Santa María, se abre la oración del Espíritu cooperando a ella con su respuesta

libre y generosa (ver Lc 1,38). Asimismo, también debemos intensificar la escucha y la meditación atenta a la Palabra de Dios, la asistencia frecuente al Sacramento de la Reconciliación y la Eucaristía, lo mismo la práctica del ayuno, según las posibilidades de cada uno.

La mortificación y la renuncia en las circunstancias ordinarias de nuestra vida, también constituyen un medio concreto para vivir el espíritu de Cuaresma. No se trata tanto de crear ocasiones extraordinarias, sino más bien, de saber ofrecer aquellas circunstancias cotidianas que nos son molestas, de aceptar con humildad, gozo y alegría, los distintos contratiempos que se nos presentan a diario. De la misma manera, el saber renunciar a ciertas cosas legítimas nos ayuda a vivir el desapego y desprendimiento.

De entre las distintas prácticas cuaresmales que nos propone la Iglesia, la vivencia de la caridad ocupa un lugar especial. Así nos lo recuerda San León Magno: "Estos días cuaresmales nos invitan de manera apremiante al ejercicio de la caridad; si deseamos llegar a la Pascua santificados en nuestro ser, debemos poner un interés especialísimo en la adquisición de esta virtud, que contiene en si a las demás y cubre multitud de pecados".

Esta vivencia de la caridad debemos vivirla de manera especial con aquél a quien tenemos más cerca, en el ambiente concreto en el que nos movemos. Así, vamos construyendo en el otro "el bien más precioso y efectivo, que es el de la coherencia con la propia vocación cristiana" (Juan Pablo II).





As we begin this Lenten journey of forty days, it is a call from Christ to reflect on our lives in an honest way before our loving God. 

Who decided that fish isn't meat?

Q Who decided that fish doesn't constitute meat for Catholics? I really hate fish, and it bugs me when my friends eat lobster for dinner on Fridays in the name of "sacrifice."



Latin is the official language of the Catholic Church. Canon law as written in Latin says we must abstain from *carne* ("meat"), a word that refers to warm-blooded animals that walk on the ground. By that definition, fish is allowed.

You make an excellent point about the lobster dinners and the nature of sacrifice. In its document "Questions and Answers about Lent and Lenten Practices," the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops says, "While fish, lobster and other shellfish are not considered meat and can be consumed on days of abstinence, indulging in the lavish buffet at your favorite seafood place sort of misses the point. Abstaining from meat and other indulgences during Lent is a penitential practice. On the Fridays of Lent, we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence and prayer."

As we enter Lent, we must remember that our acts of penance should be more than thinking about just giving something up—like meat. Our fasting needs to lead us to a closer relationship with God instead of merely being a time of sacrifice.
