In Jesus' parable of the Unjust Steward, we encounter a financial manager who has wasted his master's wealth and faces dismissal from his position. To overcome the crisis confronting him, the steward reduces some very considerable debts owed by poor neighbors to his master in order to help them out. Though the steward has sinned against God and his master by squandering what belongs to someone else, both the prudent way in which he goes about resolving the crisis coupled with relieving people who are in need can be seen as a way to better steward the gifts entrusted to us by God. Although good stewards today acknowledge that they may never use their God-given gifts in a way that completely conforms to the demands of the Gospel, a commitment to using their gifts with prudence and for the purpose of helping their neighbors wins God's favor.

St. Joseph Cupertino

St. Joseph was born in 1603 at Cupertin in the Kingdom of Naples. After spending his childhood and adolescence in simplicity and innocence, he finally joined the Franciscan Friars Minor Conventual. After his ordination to the holy priesthood, he gave himself up entirely to a life of devotion to the Lord and his church. His deep devotional life led him to the kind of holiness which is forged through humility, voluntary mortification, and obedience. He was consecrated to the Blessed Virgin Mary and promoted devotion to her among all classes of people as wonderful path to a deeper Christian life and love for Jesus Christ. It is said that his mother often considered him a nuisance and treated him harshly. Joseph was purported to be slow to learn and absent-minded. He tried to learn the trade of shoemaking, but failed. He asked to become a Franciscan, but they initially would not accept him. Finally he did join the Capuchins. However, eight months later, they sent him away. His mother was not at all pleased to have the eighteen-year-old Joseph back home

again, so she finally got him accepted as a servant at the Franciscan monastery. He was given the friars habit and put to hard work taking care of the horses. About this time, Joseph began to change. He grew in humility and gentleness, fruits of the Holy Spirit at work in a person. He became more careful and successful at his work. He also began to pray more do more voluntary acts of penance. Finally, he was able to enter the Franciscan order and, eventually, study for the priesthood. Although he was a good and holy friar, he had a very hard time with studies. During his seminary exams, the examiner happened to ask him to explain the only thing he knew well, and so he was ordained a deacon, and later a priest. After this, the Holy Spirit began to work many amazing miracles through St. Joseph. Over seventy times, people say they saw him rise from the ground while offering mass or praying. Often he went into ecstasy and would be caught up in talking with God. He fell so deeply in love with God that everything he saw only drew him into a deeper union. St. Joseph became so famous for the miracles that he was finally kept hidden from the public, but he was happy for the chance to be alone with his beloved Lord. On His part, Jesus never left him alone and one day came to bring him to Heaven. Pope Clement XIII canonized him in 1767. He is the patron saint of air travelers, pilots and learning disabled.


Clases de Inglés

San José

San José nació en 1603 en Cupertin en el Reino de Nápoles. Despues de pasar su infancia y adolescencia en la sencillez y la inocencia, que finalmente se unió a la Franciscanos Menores Conventuales. Despues de su ordenación al santo sacerdocio, se entregó por completo a una vida de devoción al Señor y su iglesia. Su profunda vida de devoción le llevó a la clase de santidad que se forja a través de la humildad, la mortificación voluntaria, y la obediencia. Fue consagrado a la Virgen María y promovió su devoción en toda clase de personas como maravilloso camino a una vida cristiana más profunda y amor a Jesucristo. Se dice que su madre a menudo le considera una molestia y lo trató con dureza. Joseph se pretende que sea lento para aprender y distraído. Él trató de aprender el oficio de la fabricación del calzado, pero fracasó. Él pidió que fuera un franciscano, pero al principio no lo aceptaría. Por último, se unió a los capuchinos. Sin embargo, ocho meses más tarde, se le enviaron. Su madre no era en absoluto contentos de tener a los dieciocho años de edad, José de vuelta a casa, por lo que finalmente se le aceptó como un criado en el monasterio franciscano. Se le dio el hábito de los frailes y se puso a trabajar duro el cuidado de los caballos. Acerca de este tiempo, José comenzó a cambiar.

Creció en la humildad y dulzura, frutos del Espíritu Santo que actúa en una persona. Se volvió más cuidadoso y éxito en su trabajo. También comenzó a orar más hacer actos de penitencia más voluntarios. Finalmente, fue capaz de entrar en la orden franciscana, y, finalmente, estudiar para el sacerdocio. A pesar de que era un fraile bueno y santo, que tenía un tiempo muy duro con los estudios. Durante sus exámenes de seminario, el examinador le pasó a pedirle que explique lo único que conocía bien, y así fue ordenado diácono, y más tarde un cura. Despues de esto, el Espíritu Santo comenzó a trabajar muchos milagros increíbles a través de San José. Más de setenta veces, la gente dice que lo vieron elevarse desde el suelo al tiempo que ofrece la masa o rezar. A menudo entró en éxtasis y se alcanzó en hablar con Dios. Se quedó tan profundamente en el amor con Dios que todo lo que veía sólo lo hizo entrar en una unión más profunda. San José se hizo tan famosa por los milagros que finalmente se mantuvo oculto por parte del público, pero que estaba contento por la oportunidad de estar a solas con su amado Señor. Por su parte, Jesús nunca lo dejó solo y un día vino a traerlo al cielo. Clemente XIII lo canonizó en 1767.
