

“When the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?”

Jesus tells of a woman who seeks a *just* decision from a judge who, by his own admission, does not “fear God nor respect any human being.” She is not asking for special treatment, but simple *justice*. The judge is resistant - not much different than many judges today. But the woman is persistent. The judge becomes alarmed by her determination and renders the *just* decision she seeks. The woman had faith in the justice of her claim. Persistence in prayer is a sign of our growth of faith in God. Consider that most of the products we enjoy today are the result of people who had faith in a great idea and the persistence to find someone who could help them produce and market their invention. Such persistence in prayer reveals our faith that God loves us. That is the kind of faith Jesus wonders whether he will “find on earth?” That is the faith of a good steward. Is it out faith?



to be eaten by hungry lions that were let out of their cages. All around this large ground were seats for the Romans to watch while the lions killed the people and they enjoyed watching the Christians die. Although St. Ignatius traveled to Rome under military guard, he stopped in Smyrna and Troas. From each of those cities, he wrote letters to the Christian communities. He was the first writer to use the term "the Catholic Church." He told the churches that he was very happy to die for Jesus so they must not stop him. He asked them to pray that God would grant him his wish. In this way, like the great St. Paul, he preached the Good News to the people. When the beloved Ignatius arrived in Rome, he joined the brave Christians who waited in prisons. The day came when the bishop was pushed out into the amphitheater. Two fierce lions devoured him. He left the beautiful witness of Christian life and his letters. St. Ignatius died around 107.

St. Ignatius of Antioch

St. Ignatius of Antioch was born in the year 50 to a pagan family. He later wanted to become a Christian and was converted. Ignatius was the third bishop of Antioch. This is the city where St. Peter labored before he moved to Rome. It is also the city where followers of Jesus were first called Christians.

Ignatius was condemned to death by Emperor Trajan who hated the Christians. He was taken from Antioch to the amphitheater in center of Rome. This was the place where the Christians who were to die were left in the center of a big ground



San Ignacio de Antioquia

San Ignacio de Antioquia nació en el año 50 de una familia pagana. Más tarde quería ser un cristiano y se convirtió. Ignacio fue el tercer obispo de Antioquia. Esta es la ciudad donde San Pedro trabajó antes de trasladarse a Roma. También es la ciudad donde los seguidores de Jesús fueron llamados cristianos por primera vez.

Ignacio fue condenado a muerte por el emperador Trojano que odiaba a los cristianos. Fue trasladado desde Antioquía hasta el anfiteatro en el centro de Roma. Este era el lugar donde los cristianos que estaban por morir fueron dejados en el centro de una gran planta para ser comidos por leones hambrientos que se dejaron fuera de sus jaulas. Todo alrededor de este gran terreno eran asientos para los romanos para ver mientras los leones mataron a la gente y disfrutaron viendo a los cristianos morir. Aunque San Ignacio viajó a Roma bajo custodia militar, se detuvo en Esmirna y Troas. De cada una de esas ciudades, escribió cartas a las comunidades cristianas. Fue el primer escritor en utilizar el término "la Iglesia Católica." Le dijo a las iglesias que estaba muy feliz de morir por Jesús. Se les pidió que oren para que Dios le conceda su deseo. De esta manera, al igual que el gran San Pablo, predicó la buena nueva a la gente. Cuando el amado Ignacio llegó a Roma, se unió a los valientes cristianos que esperaban en las cárceles. Llegó el día en que el obispo fue empujado hacia el anfiteatro. Dos feroces leones lo devoraron. Abandonó el hermoso testimonio de vida cristiana y sus cartas. San Ignacio murió alrededor de 107.
