PASTORAL PLAN FOR PRO-LIFE ACTIVITIES: A CAMPAIGN IN SUPPORT OF LIFE

In our present social context, marked by a dramatic struggle between the "culture of life" and the "culture of death", there is need to *develop a deep critical sense*, capable of discerning true values and authentic needs. What is urgently called for is a *general mobilization of consciences* and a *united ethical effort* to activate a *great campaign in support of life*. *All together, we must build a new culture of life.* - Blessed John Paul II, *The Gospel of Life*, no. 95 We issue this *Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life Activities: A Campaign in Support of Life* to put forth "a precise and vigorous reaffirmation of the value of human life and its inviolability, and at the same time a pressing appeal addressed to each and every person, in the name of God: *respect, protect, love and serve life, every human life*" (*The Gospel of Life*, no. 5). As pastors and teachers, we proclaim that human life is a precious gift from God; that each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self, and others; and that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence. These beliefs flow from ordinary reason and from our faith's constant witness that "life must be protected with the utmost care from the moment of conception"—a teaching that has been a constant part of the Christian message since the apostolic age.

Fun Facts:

St. Michael the Archangel isn't a saint, but rather he is an angel, and the leader of all angels and of the army of God. He has four main responsibilities or offices, as we know from scripture and Christian tradition. The first is to combat Satan. The second is to escort the faithful to heaven at their hour of death. The third is to be a champion of all Christians, and the Church itself. And the fourth is to call men from life on Earth to their heavenly judgment. Very little is known about St. Michael other than what we know from scriptures. In Daniel, St. Michael is mentioned twice. The first time as one who helped Daniel, and the second time he is mentioned with regard to the end times of the world when he will stand for the "children of thy people."

His next mention comes in the Epistle of St. Jude, where St. Michael is said to guard the tombs of Moses and Eve and has contended with Satan over the body of Moses. The final mention is in Revelation, where St. Michael and his angels, do battle with the dragon.



Respetemos La Vida Domingo

PLAN PASTORAL PARA ACTIVIDADES PROVIDA: UNA ESTRATEGIA EN FAVOR DE LA VIDA

En el contexto social actual, marcado por una lucha dramática entre la “cultura de la vida” y la “cultura de la uerte,” debe madurar un fuerte sentido crítico, capaz de discernir los verdaderos valores y las auténticas exigencias. Es urgente una movilización general de las ciencias y un común esfuerzo ético, para poner en práctica una gran estrategia en favor de la vida. Todos juntos debemos construir una nueva cultura de la vida. —Juan Pablo II, El Evangelio de la vida, no. 95 Damos a conocer este Plan pastoral para actividades provida: Una estrategia en favor de la vida para expresar “una confirmación precisa y firme del valor de la vida humana y de su carácter inviolable, y, al mismo tiempo, una acuciante llamada a todos y a cada uno, en nombre de Dios: ¡respetá, defiende, ama y sirve a la vida, a toda vida humana!” (El Evangelio de la vida, no. 5). Como pastores y maestros, proclamamos que la vida humana es un don precioso de Dios; que cada individuo que lo recibe tiene responsabilidades hacia Dios, hacia sí mismo y hacia los demás; y que la sociedad, mediante sus leyes e instituciones sociales, debe proteger y cuidar la vida humana en cada etapa de su existencia. Estos principios provienen de la razón y del testimonio constante de nuestra fe de que “la vida desde su concepción ha de ser salvaguardada con el máximo cuidado” (Constitución pastoral sobre la Iglesia en el mundo actual, no. 51) — una doctrina que ha sido parte constante del mensaje cristiano desde la era apostólica.

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica 2273

El derecho inalienable a la vida de todo individuo humano inocente es un elemento constitutivo de una sociedad civil y de su legislación: "Los derechos inalienables de

la persona deben ser reconocidos y respetados por la sociedad civil y la autoridad política. Estos derechos humanos no dependen de individuos solos ni de padres; ni representan una concesión hecha por la sociedad y el estado; pertenecen a la naturaleza humana y son inherentes a la persona en virtud del acto creador del cual

la persona tomó su origen. Entre estos derechos fundamentales se debe mencionar en su consideración el derecho de todos los seres humanos a la vida ya la integridad física desde el momento de su concepción hasta la muerte ". En el momento en que una ley positiva priva a una categoría de seres humanos de la protección que la legislación civil les debe otorgar, el Estado niega la igualdad de todos ante la ley.

Cuando el Estado no pone su poder al servicio de los derechos de cada ciudadano, y en particular de los más vulnerables, se socavan los fundamentos mismos de un

Estado basado en la ley. Como consecuencia del respeto y la protección que debe garantizarse para el feto desde el momento de concepción, la ley debe proveer penal apropiado sanciones por cada deliberar violación del derechos del niño".

Catechism of the Catholic Church on Right to Life

Paragraph 2273

The inalienable right to life of every innocent human individual is a constitutive element of a civil society and its legislation: "The inalienable rights of the person must be recognized and respected by civil society and the political authority. These human rights depend neither on single individuals nor on parents; nor do they represent a concession made by society and the state; they belong to human nature and are inherent in the person by virtue of the creative act from which the person took his origin. Among such fundamental rights one should mention in this regard every human being's right to life and physical integrity from the moment of conception until death." "The moment a positive law deprives a category of human beings of the protection which civil legislation ought to accord them, the state is denying the equality of all before the law. When the state does not place its power at the service of the rights of each citizen, and in particular of the more vulnerable, the very foundations of a state based on law are undermined... As a consequence of the respect and protection which must be ensured for the unborn child from the moment of conception, the law must provide appropriate penal sanctions for every deliberate violation of the child's rights."
