Saint Agatha St. Agatha is one of the most highly venerated virgin martyrs of the Catholic Church who dedicated her life to God by becoming a consecrated virgin. One man, named Quintianus, thought he could force her to marry him. When she spurned him, he had her arrested and brought before him, the judge. He expected her to give in to his demands when she was faced with torture and death, but she reaffirmed her belief in God by praying for help to overcome the devil. He had her imprisoned - in a brothel. Agatha never lost her confidence in God. When he heard of her calm strength he ordered that she be brought before him again. She continued to proclaim Jesus as her Savior, Lord, Life and Hope. He had her tortured by having her stretched on

a rack to be torn with iron hooks, burned with torches, and whipped. Because she endured this torture with a sense of cheer, he ordered that her breasts be cut off and sent her back to prison with no medical attention. She had a vision of St. Peter, who comforted her and healed her wounds through prayer. After 4 days, Quintianus had her stripped naked and rolled over hot coals mixed with sharp shards. When she was returned to prison, Agatha prayed, "Lord, my Creator, you have ever protected me from the cradle; you have taken me from the love of the world,

and given me patience to suffer: receive now my soul."

FIRST DAY

Martin learned from Our Lord to be gentle and humble of heart. Thoughts of pride or vanity were wholly alien to his Christian spirit. His relationship with God was the relationship of a child to a loving Father. Being a loving Father God can only want us to be happy. So Martin realized that happiness can be found only in a whole-hearted surrender to God's Holy will. His rule of life was to pray "Thy will be done" and to behave accordingly.

PRAYER

O Saint Martin, Obtain for us from God and His Holy Mother Mary, the grace to be truly gentle and lowly of heart. May we find happiness in cheerful acceptance of God's Holy Will and may there be no place in our hearts for thoughts of pride or vanity.

ONE DECADE OF THE ROSARY

SECOND DAY

"In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the expiation for our sins. Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another." This inspired saying of Saint John could be taken as a summary of the way that Martin lived his life. His love and gratitude to God found expression in loving and helping others in whatever way that he could.

PRAYER

O Saint Martin, obtain for us from God and His Holy Mother Mary, the grace to deepen our awareness of the greatness of God's love for us, so that we may ever seek true happiness in the loving service of God, and our neighbor for God's sake.

ONE DECADE OF THE ROSARY

THIRD DAY

Martin was called the Father of the Poor. He lived by the saying of Our Lord: "Truly I say to you, as you did it to one of the least of these my bretheren you did it to me." He spent himself in caring for the poor, the suffering, and the afflicted in all of whom he saw Our Savior.

PRAYER

Saint Martin, teach us to be generous with the gifts that God has given us. Pray to Jesus and to His Holy Mother Mary, Our Lady of Mercy, that our hearts may not be hardened by sin an selfishness, but that we may always be kind and generous to our neighbors who are suffering or in need, because they, like us, are children of the same Heavenly Father.

ONE DECADE OF THE ROSARY

FOURTH DAY

"Faith comes by hearing, hearing the word of God."

Martin listened to the word of God in the proclamation of the Scripture in the Church. In simplicity of faith he tried to live in the spirit of the Gospel. God rewarded him by giving him a profound understanding of revealed Truth and the grace to express it in word and deed.

PRAYER

Saint Martin, obtain for us from God and His Holy Mother Mary, the grace to open our hearts to the Gospel and to accept it in faith as you did. May the way that we live draw others to Christ so that there may be one Fold and one Shepherd, Jesus Christ Our Lord.

ONE DECADE OF THE ROSARY

FIFTH DAY

Martin had an unwavering hope in God. He trusted in the power of God to save us, which is revealed in the Gospel. With Mary he believed that there would be fulfillment of what was spoken by the Lord. He relied on God Our Loving Father, to give us everything we need. Above all he trusted that he would be granted the grace of final perseverance and a happy death.

PRAYER

Saint Martin, obtain for us from God and His Holy Mother Mary, an unwavering hope so that we may trust in God's care for us in all events of this life and securely expect from him the supreme grace of final perseverance and a happy heath.

ONE DECADE OF THE ROSARY

SIXTH DAY

Martin sought to keep his mind and heart centered on God. His prayer came from the depths of his soul. He naturally turned to God to adore Him, to thank Him, and to ask Him for help. Martin prayed with humility and perseverance, and God was pleased to answer his prayers in miraculous ways. He will pray for us before the throne of God in Heaven.

PRAYER

Saint Martin, obtain for us from God and His Holy Mother Mary, that by fervent, persevering and trustful prayer we may obey Our Divine Lord's command: "Ask and you shall receive, seek and you shall find, knock and it shall be opened unto you." In this way may we be granted a deep spirit of prayer and complete trust in its power.
