



God's desire is to liberate his people so that they fulfill their holy destiny.

Liberation is at the heart of our Scriptures – a freedom that will liberate us from worldly anxieties and concerns, and from all that might hinder us in fulfilling our holy mission. Listening to and obeying God's Word prevents us from hardening our hearts and distancing ourselves from his presence in our lives.

In the first reading, the Lord promises Israel that he will raise up a new prophet, one who will speak with his authority. Paul urges the Corinthians to remain free of worldly anxieties. In Mark's Gospel, it is the unclean spirit that recognizes Jesus' true identity and responds to his commands.

Virgen de Suyapa:



Saint Blaise

The first known record of the saint's life comes from the medical writings of Aëtius Amidenus, where he is recorded as helping with patients suffering from objects stuck in their throat. People often turned to Saint

Blaise for healing miracles. In 316, the governor of Cappadocia and of Lesser Armenia, Agricola, arrested then-bishop Blaise for being a Christian. On their way to the jail, a woman set her only son, who was chocking to death on a fish bone, at his feet. Blaise cured the child, and though

Agricola was amazed, he could not get Blaise to renounce his faith. Therefore, Agricola beat Blaise with a stick and tore at his flesh with iron combs before beheading him. In another tale, Blaise was being

led to the prison in Sebastea, and on the way came across a poor old woman whose pig had been stolen by a wolf. Blaise commanded the wolf return the pig, which it did -alive and uninjured - to the amazement of all. When he reached Sebastea, the woman came to him and brought two fine wax candles in an attempt to dispel the gloom of his darkened cell. In the Middle Ages, Blaise became quite popular and his legend as a beast tamer spread. He

was then referred to as the "saint of the wild beast." Saint Blaise is often depicted holding two crossed candles in his hand, or in a cave with wild animals.

Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica

Párrafo 2304


El respeto y el desarrollo de la vida humana requieren paz. La paz no es simplemente la ausencia de guerra, y no se limita a mantener un equilibrio de poderes entre los adversarios. La paz no se puede alcanzar en la tierra sin salvaguardar los bienes de las personas, la libre comunicación entre los hombres, el respeto por la dignidad de las personas y los pueblos, y la práctica asidua de la fraternidad. La paz es "la tranquilidad del orden". La paz es el trabajo de la justicia y el efecto de la caridad.

San Blas

El primer registro conocido de la vida del santo proviene de las escrituras médicas de Aëtius Amidenus, donde se registra que ayuda a pacientes que sufren de objetos atrapados en su garganta. La gente a menudo recurrió a San Blas para hacer milagros de curación. En 316, el

gobernador de Capadocia y de la Armenia Menor, Agrícola, detuvieron al entonces obispo Blaise por ser cristiano. En su camino a la cárcel, una mujer puso a su único hijo, que estaba atiborrado de una espina de pez, a sus pies. Blaise curó al niño, y aunque Agrícola se sorprendió, no pudo lograr que Blaise renunciara a su fe. Por lo tanto, Agrícola golpeó a Blaise con un palo y le desgarró la carne con peines de hierro antes de decapitarlo. En otro cuento, Blaise estaba siendo llevado a la prisión de Sebastea, y en el camino se encontró con una pobre anciana cuyo cerdo había sido robado por un lobo.

Blaise le ordenó al lobo que le devolviera el cerdo, lo que hizo -alivio e ilesos- ante el asombro de todos. Cuando llegó a Sebastea, la mujer se acercó a él y trajo dos finas velas de cera en un intento de disipar la oscuridad de su celda oscurecida. En la Edad Media, Blaise se hizo muy popular y su leyenda como domador de bestias se extendió. Luego fue referido como el "santo de la bestia salvaje". A menudo se representa a San Blas con dos velas cruzadas en la mano o en una cueva con animales salvajes.
