## RESPECT LIFE SUNDAY

### PASTORAL PLAN FOR PRO-LIFE ACTIVITIES: A CAMPAIGN IN SUPPORT OF LIFE

In our present social context, marked by a dramatic struggle between the "culture of life" and the "culture of death", there is need to develop a deep critical sense, capable of discerning true values and authentic needs. What is urgently called for is a general mobilization of consciences and a united ethical effort to activate a great campaign in support of life. All together, we must build a new culture of life. - Blessed John Paul II, *The Gospel of Life*, no. 95 We issue this *Pastoral Plan for Pro-Life Activities: A Campaign in Support of Life* to put forth "a precise and vigorous reaffirmation of the value of human life and its inviolability, and at the same time a pressing appeal addressed to each and every person, in the name of God: respect, protect, love and serve life, every human life" (*The Gospel of Life*, no. 5). As pastors and teachers, we proclaim that human life is a precious gift from God; that each person who receives this gift has responsibilities toward God, self, and others; and that society, through its laws and social institutions, must protect and nurture human life at every stage of its existence. These beliefs flow from ordinary reason and from our faith's constant witness that "life must be protected with the utmost care from the moment of conception"—a teaching that has been a constant part of the Christian message since the apostolic age.

## RESPETEMOS LA VIDA DOMINGO

### "PLAN PASTORAL PARA ACTIVIDADES PROVIDA: UNA ESTRATEGIA EN FAVOR DE LA VIDA

En el contexto social actual, marcado por una lucha dramática entre la "cultura de la vida" y la "cultura de la uerte," debe madurar un fuerte sentido crítico, capaz de discernir los verdaderos valores y las auténticas exigencias. Es urgente una movilización general de las con ciencias y un común esfuerzo ético, para poner en práctica una gran estrategia en favor de la vida. Todos juntos debemos construir una nueva cultura de la vida. —Juan Pablo II, El Evangelio de la vida, no. 95 Damos a conocer este Plan pastoral para actividades provida: Una estrategia en favor de la vida para expresar "una confirmación precisa y firme del valor de la vida humana y de su carácter inviolable, y, al mismo tiempo, una acuciante llamada a todos y a cada uno, en nombre de Dios: ¡respeta, defiende, ama y sirve a la vida, a toda vida humana!" (El Evangelio de la vida, no. 5). Como pastores y maestros, proclamamos que la vida humana es un don precioso de Dios; que cada individuo que lo recibe tiene responsabilidades hacia Dios, hacia sí mismo y hacia los demás; y que la sociedad, mediante sus leyes e instituciones sociales, debe proteger y cuidar la vida humana en cada etapa de su existencia. Estos principios provienen de la razón y del testimonio constante de nuestra fe de que "la vida desde su concepción ha de ser salvaguardada con el máximo cuidado" (Constitución pastoral sobre la Iglesia en el mundo actual, no. 51) — una doctrina que ha sido parte constante del mensaje cristiano desde la era apostólica.

#### Catecismo de la Iglesia Católica 2273

El derecho inalienable a la vida de todo individuo humano inocente es un elemento constitutivo de una sociedad civil y de su legislación: "Los derechos inalienables de la persona deben ser reconocidos y respetados por la sociedad civil y la autoridad política. Estos derechos humanos no dependen de individuos solos ni de padres; ni representan una concesión hecha por la sociedad y el estado; pertenecen a la naturaleza humana y son inherentes a la persona en virtud del acto creador del cual la persona tomó su origen.

Entre estos derechos fundamentales se debe mencionar en su consideración el derecho de todos los seres humanos a la vida ya la integridad física desde el momento de su concepción hasta la muerte ". En el momento en que una ley positiva priva a una categoría de seres humanos de la protección que la legislación civil les debe otorgar, el Estado niega la igualdad de todos ante la ley. Cuando el Estado no pone su poder al servicio de los derechos de cada ciudadano, y en particular de los más vulnerables, se socavan los fundamentos mismos de un Estado basado en la ley. Como consecuencia del respeto y la protección que debe garantizarse para el feto desde el momento de concepción,

la ley debe proveer penal apropiado sanciones por cada deliberar violación del derechos del niño".

#### Catechism of the Catholic Church on Right to Life Paragraph 2273

The inalienable right to life of every innocent human individual is a constitutive element of a civil society and its legislation: “The inalienable rights of the person must be recognized and respected by civil society and the political authority. These human rights depend neither on single individuals nor on parents; nor do they represent a concession made by society and the state; they belong to human nature and are inherent in the person by virtue of the creative act from which the person took his origin. Among such fundamental rights one should mention in this regard every human being’s right to life and physical integrity from the moment of conception until death.” “The moment a positive law deprives a category of human beings of the protection which civil legislation ought to accord them, the state is denying the equality of all before the law. When the state does not place its power at the service of the rights of each citizen, and in particular of the more vulnerable, the very foundations of a state based on law are undermined... As a consequence of the respect and protection which must be ensured for the unborn child from the moment of conception, the law must provide appropriate penal sanctions for every deliberate violation of the child’s rights.”

## RESPECT LIFE REFLECTION

### Christ Our Hope: In Every Season of Life

From the time we are knit together in our mothers' womb until we take our final breaths, each moment of our lives is a gift from God. While every season of life brings its own challenges and trials, each season also gives us new opportunities to grow in our relationship with God.

Today the gift of life is threatened in countless ways. Those who are most vulnerable, rather than receiving the protection they deserve, are all too often seen as a burden and as expendable. As new attacks on human life continue to emerge, we can be tempted to despair, but Christ instead offers us unfailing hope.

Hope is not false optimism or empty positivity. Christian hope is something much more profound and goes to the very depths of our identity as followers of Christ.

Hope is the virtue "by which we desire the kingdom of heaven and eternal life as our happiness, placing our trust in Christ's promises and relying not on our own strength, but on the help of the grace of the Holy Spirit" (CCC, 1817).

Like us, Christ entered the world through the womb of a woman. He willingly experienced the fullness of human suffering. He breathed his last on the Cross at Calvary in order that He might save us. Therefore, "God is the foundation of hope; not any god, but the God who has a human face and who has loved us to the end" (Spe salvi 31).


Christians know "they have a future; it is not that they know the details of what awaits them, but they know in general terms that their life will not end in emptiness" (SS 2).

For this reason, a woman experiencing a difficult pregnancy can find the strength to welcome her precious child into the world. A man facing a terminal diagnosis can see that the end of his earthly life is only the beginning of eternal life with Christ.

The Church teaches that "the one who has 'hope lives differently'" (SS 2). Christ's promise of salvation does not mean that we will be spared from suffering. Rather, the promise of salvation ensures that even in the darkest moments of our lives, we will be given the strength to persevere. By virtue of this Christian hope, we can face any challenge or trial. When the seas of life swell and we are battered by the waves, hope allows us to remain anchored in the heart of God. May we hold fast to Christ our hope, from the beginning of life to its very end.

### Cristo es nuestra esperanza en cada etapa de la vida

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Desde el momento en que fuimos tejidos en el vientre de nuestra madre hasta que exhibimos el último suspiro, cada momento de nuestra vida es un don de Dios. Aunque cada etapa de la vida trae sus propios desafíos y pruebas, también nos brinda nuevas oportunidades para crecer en nuestras relaciones con Dios.

Hoy el don de la vida está amenazado de incontables maneras. Los más desamparados, en lugar de recibir la protección que merecen, demasiado a menudo son vistos como una carga y como preescindibles. A medida que siguen surgiendo nuevos ataques a la vida humana, podemos sentirnos tentados a desesperarnos, pero en cambio Cristo nos ofrece una esperanza inquebrantable.

La esperanza no es un falso optimismo o una positividad vacía. La esperanza cristiana es algo mucho más profundo y llega a lo más hondo de nuestra identidad como seguidores de Cristo.

La esperanza es la virtud "por la que aspiramos al Reino de los cielos y a la vida eterna como felicidad nuestra, poniendo nuestra confianza en las promesas de Cristo y apoyándonos no en nuestras fuerzas, sino en los auxilios de la gracia del Espíritu Santo" (CIC 1817).


Tal como nosotros, Cristo entró en el mundo por mediación del vientre de una mujer. El voluntariamente asumió la plenitud del sufrimiento humano. Exhaló su último suspiro en la cruz del Calvario para poder salvarnos. Por lo tanto, "Dios es el fundamento de la esperanza; pero no cualquier dios, sino el Dios que tiene un rostro humano y que nos ha amado hasta el extremo" (Spe salvi 31).

Los cristianos saben que "tienen un futuro; no es que conozcan los pormenores de lo que les espera, pero saben que que viven, en conjunto, no acaban en el vacío" (SS 2).

Por esta razón, una mujer que atraviesa por un embarazo difícil puede encontrar la fuerza para acoger a su preciado hijo en el mundo. Un hombre que enfrenta un diagnóstico terminal puede ver que el final de su vida terrenal es solo el comienzo de la vida eterna con Cristo.

La Iglesia nos enseña que "quien tiene esperanza vive de otra manera" (SS 2). La salvación que Cristo nos promete no significa que nos libraremos del sufrimiento. Más bien, la promesa de salvación asegura que, incluso en los momentos más oscuros de nuestra vida, se nos dará la fuerza para perseverar. En virtud de esa experiencia cristiana, podemos enfrentar cualquier desafío o prueba. Cuando los mares de la vida se hinchan y las olas nos golpean, la esperanza nos permite permanecer anclados en el corazón de Dios. Aterrémonos a Cristo nuestro esperanza, desde el principio de la vida hasta su fin.
