# 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time



Experience shows that hearts respond more generously when they are shown trust; we do not conquer people for divine love with fear, imprisoning them in their misfortune... The image of the fig tree planted in the vineyard suggests, perhaps, that the kingdom of God is much larger than either Israel or Jerusalem, and that Jesus the Messiah, the divine gardener, came to seek in the Holy City the fruits of mercy, justice, and faithfulness. These are the fruits that God likes, the fruits expected by the "owner of the orchard". But time is running out and the decision to cut down the fig tree is made, because these fruits have not been found. This is also the meaning of the episode of the barren fig tree of Mark (13:28) and Matthew (21:18-22), which conclude with the curse of the tree. But surprisingly, in the parable of Luke, it is the gardener who intercedes with the owner, asking him to have mercy on Jerusalem. And as if this were not enough, he commits himself to doing everything possible to make this very expensive tree fruitful... Unfortunately, the invitation to conversion was not accepted, the warnings were not heard, the signs were not understood, and the time of grace was not embraced. But before the final tragedy of Jerusalem occurred, the Tree of Life itself, Jesus, accepted to be cut down so that, in the end, the root of all evil was torn out and the Tree was planted in our hearts, eternally vivifying it with the sap of the Holy Spirit.



La experiencia muestra que los corazones responden más generosamente cuando se les muestra confianza; no conquistamos a las personas por amor divino con miedo, aprisionándolas en su desgracia ... La imagen de la higuera plantada en la viña sugiere, tal vez, que el reino de Dios es mucho más grande que Israel o Jerusalén, y que Jesús el Mesías, el jardinero divino, vino a buscar en la Ciudad Santa los frutos de la misericordia, la justicia y la fidelidad. Estas son las frutas que a Dios le gustan, las frutas que espera el "dueño del huerto". Pero el tiempo se acaba y se toma la decisión de cortar la higuera, porque no se han encontrado estos frutos. Este es también el significado del episodio de la higuera estéril de Marcos (13:28) y Mateo (21: 18-22), que concluye con la maldición del árbol. Pero sorprendentemente, en la parábola de Lucas, es el jardinero quien intercede con el dueño, pidiéndole que se apiade de Jerusalén. Y como si esto fuera poco, se compromete a hacer todo lo posible para que este árbol tan caro sea fructífero ... Desafortunadamente, la invitación a la conversión no fue aceptada, las advertencias no se escucharon, los signos no se entendieron y el tiempo de gracia no fue abrazado. Pero antes de que ocurriera la tragedia final de Jerusalén, el mismo Árbol de la Vida, Jesús, aceptó ser cortado para que, al final, la raíz de todo mal fuera arrancado y el Árbol fuera plantado en nuestros corazones, vivificándolo eternamente con él. La savia del Espíritu Santo.


