

THE PASTOR'S CORNER

THOUGHT FOR A EUCHARIST REVIVAL

THIS TUESDAY LAST, we celebrated the Memorial of St. John Bosco (born: August 16, 1815; Died: January 31, 1888). Orphaned early in his childhood when his father died, raised in desperate poverty by his mother who was both pious and illiterate and sensibly anti-clerical (she told him, "If you have the misfortune to become rich, I shan't set foot in your house again"), he nevertheless discerned as a young man a vocation to the priesthood. With only the space in this bulletin to give some slight sense of his extraordinary life (see <https://catholicsaints.info/saints-of-the-day-john-bosco-priest-founder>), his faith made him most agreeable and attractive to the poor and wastrel youth of Rome. He would found the Salesian Order that would come to provide schooling for boys worldwide. In the offering prayer of the Mass for a Founder, the Church prays:

*Grant our supplication, we pray, Almighty God,
That these sacrificial offerings of your people,
Which we bring you in commemoration of your
servant John Bosco,
You may graciously mingle with the gifts of
heaven. Through Christ our Lord.*

What a lovely thought that the gifts - bread and wine - we bring to the altar, which represent our own works and sacrifices for the sake of our loved

ones and building up the kingdom, in their very substance (only the appearance or *accidents* remaining before us) should be mingled with the gifts of heaven.

This, of course, is why we stand when the gifts of bread and wine are brought to the altar. We *mean* by this action that these gifts which will soon mingle with the gifts of heaven are our gifts!


This notion is suggested in the first Eucharistic prayer (*the Roman canon*) when we pray that "*these gifts be borne by your holy Angel to your altar on high in the sights of your divine majesty...*" Perhaps at this moment in Mass, we should interrupt our usual cautions and wariness and dare to imagine this very scene with the abandon of children? Here is just one way we imbue our reality with meaning, preventing it from becoming humdrum and tedious. G. K. Chesterton made the point: "It is the main earthly business of a human being to make his home, and the immediate surroundings of his home, as symbolic and significant to his own imagination as he can."

And so we do when we hear the words of the liturgy and understand the amazing things they actually tell us, "...so that all of us, who through this participation at the altar receive the most holy Body and Blood of your Son, may be filled with every grace and blessing" (from Eucharistic Prayer I).

WELCOME FATHER PAUL!

THE BOOKS OF THE BIBLE



Titus brings us to our 63rd book of the Bible. It is the third of the “Pastoral Letters” in the New Testament, and, as the letters to Timothy were written

to the one Paul left in charge at Ephesus, Titus is written to the one he left in charge on Crete. Paul pleads with Titus to lead by good example, as that more than anything else will help to lead those to whom he is sent *to the Truth and away from* those things that initially occupied the bulk of their attention, that is, their more selfish passions and pleasures. Eternal life is a much more lofty goal on which to focus. If this letter is indeed from Paul’s own hand, then it is written after his house arrest in Rome (after 63 A.D.) since he is available to meet with Titus in Nicopolis (see 3:12).

In the verses of this book, we read about the coming-into-focus of church offices that are familiar to us (such as bishops) and we learn of the qualifications required of ones to occupy those offices (ch. 1), the types of behavior that those who are older in the community should display and the fact that God’s grace is to save all of humanity and not just a certain people (ch. 2), and a call to be obedient to authority, to be gentle, to be kind and to be realistic: if after two times others choose to persist in their sinful ways, just move on (ch. 3).

When you finish this book, you will have read 63 (86.3%) of the 73 books of the Bible (only 10 more to go!), yet 1,277 (95.7%) of the 1,334 chapters of the Bible.

READINGS FOR THE FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reading I – Isaiah 58:7-10

The author lists six ways for light to rise in the darkness. St. Matthew will cite these as the bases for our final judgment. (Mt. 25:31ff)

Reading II – I Corinthians 2:1-5

The mystery of God is revealed in Christ crucified. Paul adds that he will not use any clever arguments or rhetorical devices to soften this truth.

The Gospel – Matthew 5:13-16

Jesus uses salt and light as compliments made to His hearers in this early section of the Sermon on the Mount.
