My full State of the School letter is available on the school website. I invite you to read it in its entirety and share our good news.



## Middle School Launches New Math Program

Enhancements provide more opportunity and support for students

New this fall, all St. Joseph's Middle School math classes are taught using a co-teaching model with two teachers in the classroom providing instruction and guidance to students. This enhancement to the middle school curriculum provides a greater teacher-to-student ratio and offers additional one-to-one support for all students in the classroom.

Also new to the middle school math program are ability groupings and additional assignments designed to provide students with extra practice on the basic math skills required for higher level math classes.

"Our goal is for every student to always be working to their highest potential," said Peggy Pechacek, middle school math instructor. Co-teacher, Lori Bruce agreed. "With this new model in place, every student will be challenged and supported. Every student will have the opportunity to grow and become more confident in their math skills. Every student will succeed."

The changes to the math program are the result of a year-long, in-depth study conducted by a team of St. Joseph's School administration and faculty. The team researched, evaluated and analyzed successful mathematics programs and best practices.

# Live Fully the Encounter with God

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program proclaims the message of Jesus to students by presenting His parables in a Montessori learning environment

For more than five years, St. Joseph's School students in Preschool through 5th grade have participated weekly in the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program. The program, a unique method of faith formation, acts as an enriching complement to our school's already strong religious curriculum.

The Good Shepherd method strives to proclaim the message of Jesus to children by presenting the mysteries of the Catholic faith in a Montessori learning environment. The children are led closer to God through the use of hands-on materials that are presented within the context of a quiet, carefully prepared environment, called an atrium. At St. Joseph's School there are three atrium levels, each designed for the developmental needs of a specific age group.

Specially trained teachers staff each atrium. The teacher's role is to help students live fully the encounter with God. This experience becomes formative in the child's whole person and generates great joy.

"It is a privilege to offer this program to the students of St. Joseph's School," said Good Shepherd Program Director, Chris Stokman. "We have been blessed to be one of the few Catholic Schools in this Archdiocese to incorporate Good Shepherd as a component of the spiritual formation of the child. The students take their time in the atrium seriously and seem to really enjoy the quiet. We are continually amazed at their ability to thoughtfully ponder scripture and see their growth in understanding of the prayers and gestures of the Mass where we are fed with His Holy Word and with His very self in the Eucharist."





### Alumnus, Danny Nozell, Achieves Great Success in the Music Industry

Stays grounded in his faith, roots

The road from St. Joseph's School to the top of the music industry is an uncommon one. But it has proven to be a very successful and fulfilling path for alumnus, Danny Nozell.

Danny is CEO of CTK Management in Nashville, Tennessee. Most notably, he manages the careers of music icons such as Dolly Parton, KC and the Sunshine Band and Kenny G. But his career reaches far beyond managing and producing music. Danny also owns Nove Entertainment, a premier recording studio, private soundstage and storage facility in the Nashville area. He is an executive producer of feature films, owns his own record label and owns a company that manages logistics for private jets.

"It's a twenty-four seven job," said Nozell. "But I wouldn't have it any other way." Danny started at the bottom, working as a runner for a promotion company and worked his way up taking roles as production manager, tour manager, and tour accountant. In 2004 he was hired as a tour consultant for Dolly Parton. The two instantly connected and have had a successful, loyal partnership ever since.

Nozell credits his work ethic, instilled by his father, and his "charm", a gift from his mother, as two of the keys to his success. He also credits his faith which began at home and in the St. Joseph's community. Danny grew up just ten blocks from St. Joseph's. His mother was one of the original members of the church, attending Masses when they were held in "Sloppy Joe's" tavern. Danny and his two siblings attended St. Joseph's School. "All I knew as a kid was St. Joe's. It was church on Sunday, every Sunday. That was the norm then, and it still is for me now," said Nozell.

Today, Danny travels the world for his career. His busy schedule makes it a challenge for him to connect with his old friends from home on a frequent basis. But when he comes home, "I always go to St. Joe's. I have been so blessed and I know there is a spiritual connection to my success. I am so grateful."
