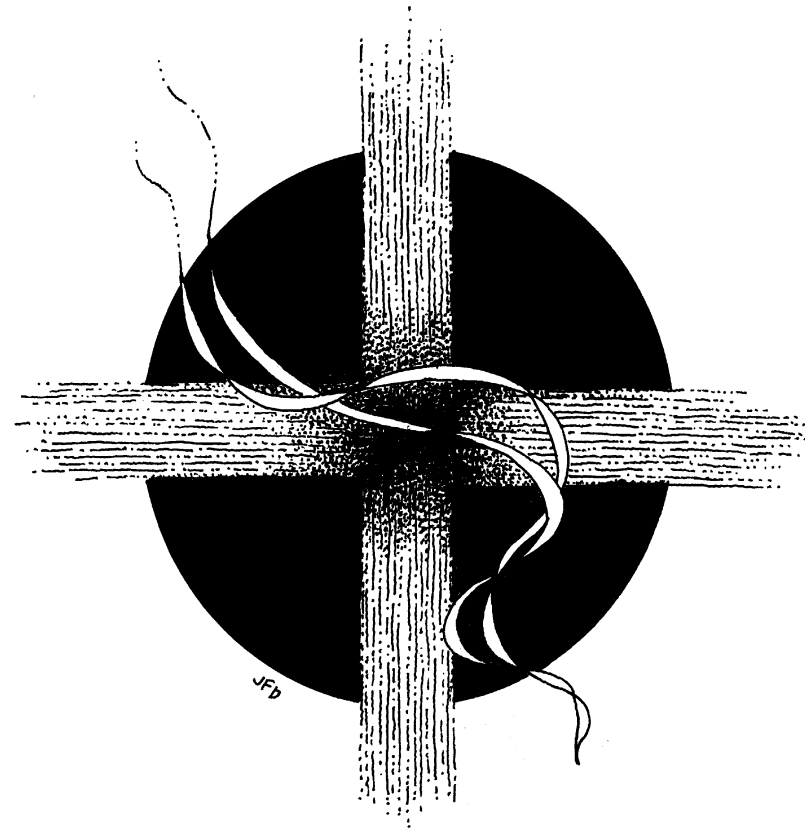

Magnanimous Musings
of Fr. John Robert Skeldon

To know God is to see sunlight, to dwell in a warm, all-embracing, effusive love. The first letter of John says it so simply and yet so profoundly: “God is love and the one who lives in love lives in God and God in him” (1 John 4:16). This is the mystery—the reality that encompasses all reality—of God...that God is a relationship of persons in love: the Holy Trinity. You and I are created in the image and likeness of that eternal relationship, of God who is Love. And you and I are meant to be drawn up into that relationship at the end of our earthly lives. Shouldn’t then our lives here on earth reflect that relationship in which we were created and for which we are destined?

We must, in the words of Deuteronomy “fix in our hearts” that we are meant for love, and the way we treat each other says something about how we understand and love God. As Paul says, we “did not receive a spirit of slavery to fall back into fear...” We “received a Spirit of adoption, through which we cry, ‘Abba, Father!’” We are meant, in the words of the gospel, to “go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit...” We do this by not caving into ourselves, our own fears, our own pettiness, but by truly calling out to God as Abba, Father, the one in whose image and likeness we are created.

One of the deuterocanonical texts of the Old Testament is the book of Tobit. It is a beautiful story whose central character has a name which comes from the Hebrew word for *good*, the goodness of the Lord. (In Spanish the book is named for Tobit’s son, Tobiah.) In a nutshell, Tobit endured much in his life and remained faithful to God. Yet, this did not stop him from undergoing much hardship, and one of the things he endured was blindness. At first, he wanted God to take away his life; he couldn’t endure not seeing. Yet, he persevered; he remained faithful; he did not give in to a spirit of slavery. And as the story progresses, he is healed. It is a beautiful story of Tobit discovering the presence of God in the relationships, the loves, of his life: his wife, his son, his relatives, and the stranger Azariah who is really the angel Raphael. As one beautiful line of the text puts it when God decides to hatch his plan to heal Tobit: “So Raphael was sent to heal them both: to remove the cataracts from Tobit’s eyes, so that he might again see God’s sunlight...”

You and I were created in God’s sunlight, in the love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. You and I are meant to dwell forever in God’s sunlight, in the love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. We are also meant to reflect that sunlight in our lives here in earth. Sometimes, it gets clouded. Sometimes, we lose it. But, in the persons and relationships of our lives, we can discover it. Let us, with Tobit, not fall into a spirit of slavery and fear and pettiness, but persevere in hope and love. In so doing, we might yet again see the sunlight of God, the love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit, in this world. Amen.



Reflexión Magnánima de Padre John Robert Skeldon

El conocer a Dios es ver la luz del sol, es habitar en un ambiente cálido, que lo abarca todo, con un amor efusivo. La primera carta de Juan lo dice con tanta sencillez y sin embargo, tan profundamente: “Dios es amor: y el que permanece en el amor permanece en Dios y Dios en él” (1 Juan 4:16). Éste es el misterio—la realidad que abarca toda realidad—de Dios...que Dios es una relación de personas en el amor: la Santísima Trinidad. Ustedes y yo fuimos creados en la imagen y semejanza de esa relación eterna, de Dios que es Amor. Y ustedes y yo estamos destinados a ser elevados dentro de esa relación al final de nuestra vida terrenal. Entonces, ¿acaso nuestras vidas aquí en la tierra no deben reflejar esa relación en la cual fuimos creados y para la cual estamos destinados?

Debemos, con las palabras de Deuteronomio, “grabar en nuestros corazones” que estamos destinados por el amor, y que de la manera en que nos tratamos el uno y el otro dice mucho de cómo es que entendemos y amamos a Dios. Como dice Pablo, nosotros “no hemos recibido un espíritu de esclavos que nos haga temer de nuevo...” Nosotros “recibimos un Espíritu de hijos adoptivos, que nos hace exclamar: ‘¡Abbá, Padre!’” Estamos destinados, con las palabras que dice el evangelio, de “ir, y enseñar a todas las naciones, bautizándolas en el nombre del Padre y del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo...” Hacemos esto no encerrándonos en nosotros mismos, en nuestros propios miedos, en nuestras propias pequeñeces, sino que realmente aclamando a Dios como Abbá, Padre, aquel de cuya imagen y semejanza fuimos creados.

Uno de los textos deuterocanónicos del Antiguo testamento es el libro de Tobit. Es una historia hermosa cuyo personaje central tiene un nombre que viene de la palabra hebrea que quiere decir *bueno*, la bondad del Señor. (En Español el libro está nombrado por el hijo de Tobit, Tobías.) En pocas palabras, Tobit sufrió mucho en su vida y se mantuvo fiel a Dios. Sin embargo, esto no le impidió el que sufriera muchas dificultades y una de las cuáles sufrió fue la ceguera.

Al principio, deseaba que Dios le quitara la vida; no podía soportar el no poder ver. Sin embargo, él perseveró; se mantuvo fiel; no cedió al espíritu de esclavitud. Y según la historia avanza, él es sanado. Es una hermosa historia de Tobit descubriendo la presencia de Dios en las relaciones, los amores, de su vida: su esposa, su hijo, sus parientes, y el desconocido/extranjero Azarías quien realmente era el ángel Rafael. Como lo describe en una de las hermosas líneas del texto cuando Dios (decide a hacer) divulga su plan para sanar a Tobit: “...y fue enviado Rafael a curar a los dos: a Tobit, para que se le quitaran las manchas blancas de los ojos y pudiera con sus mismos ojos ver la luz de Dios...”

Ustedes y yo fuimos creados en la luz de Dios, en el amor del Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. Ustedes y yo estamos destinados a habitar por siempre en la luz de Dios, en el amor del Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo. También estamos destinados a reflejar esa misma luz en nuestras vidas aquí en la tierra. Algunas veces se nubla. Algunas veces la perdemos. Pero, en las personas y en las relaciones de nuestras vidas, podemos volver a descubrirla. Junto con Tobit, no caigamos en el espíritu de la esclavitud y del miedo y de las pequeñeces, pero perseveremos en la esperanza y en el amor. Al hacerlo, quizá podamos de nuevo ver la luz de Dios, el amor del Padre, Hijo y Espíritu Santo, en este mundo.

Sacrament of Baptism (newborns - age 6): Parents requesting the Sacrament of Baptism should be either living within parish boundaries or be registered in the parish. Parents and godparents are expected to attend a baptism class for an infant to be baptized. Parents are required to bring a signed photocopy of the child's state-registered birth certificate to the baptism class. Godparents who are not registered at St. Bartholomew must provide a letter from their parish which verifies that they meet the godparent requirements. All paperwork must be turned into the office before scheduling your child's baptism date. The next class will be 7 p.m. on Thursday, June 11th in the church hall. Call the office to sign up for this class. Parents also need to call the office if you need to use the nursery while attending this class.
