From the Desk of Fr. Dan

One of my favorite events at Xavier is celebrating baptisms. There is always a great deal of energy and joy amid the family heirlooms and the candles and the bonnets. At Xavier, we celebrate baptisms with a wide range of family, and can rejoice at the full breadth of God's loving kindness in all forms of family life.

Michael Himes explains that a sacrament makes "what is always and everywhere true, real in time and space." It is always and everywhere true that God calls each of us the Beloved. In baptism we pause just long enough to remember that call. This weekend we remember that Jesus shares in this same baptism. Just as Jesus emerged from the waters and understood God's call of the Beloved, so too must we grapple with this call.

It is sometimes more difficult to receive love than to offer love. When we offer love we are in control. In being called the Beloved of God, as we are, we are invited to receive the love of God. This invitation comes with that unsettling freedom of being known and being our true selves. Real freedom is a frightening enterprise. However, this is our baptismal call: to know ourselves as the Beloved, to be loved, and to be love.

Two important notes:

- 1. On January 15, 2019 the Northeast USA Jesuit province will release the names of all Jesuits who have been credibly accused of abuse of a minor. I will be sending a letter to the parish explaining the release of those names and outlining our commitment to a safe environment for all of our parishioners.
- 2. Some people have asked about an article in the Catholic New York Newspaper that names me as the pastor of St. Francis Xavier parish. While I am honored and humbled by this, it is not entirely accurate. I remain the interim pastor and expect to be assigned in the Middle East some time in September 2019. We are beginning the discernment around a new pastor as we do our pastoral planning for the future. I love Xavier parish and will find it very difficult to leave.

THOMAS MERTON AT XAVIER

As we celebrate the memory of Thomas Merton, Trappist Monk, peace activist, example of interreligious dialogue, we remember his prayer experience in Xavier Church.

1st Quarter Stewardship News

Thank you to all of you who have given so much of your time, talent, and treasure to support our parish throughout last year. We are grateful for your support during the Christmas season. Whether you gave your time to serve during the liturgies or share your musical talents or volunteer to decorate the church or share your financial blessings with the parish...or a little bit of everything, we want you to know it is greatly appreciated! Our Christmas collection of \$72,634 fell short of last year's total of \$77,861 and our budget of \$80,000. We received \$6,533 for Christmas flowers compared to \$9,421 last year. Also we received \$39,307 in end of year gifts compared to \$31,350 last year. It is only through your gifts can we make a difference in the lives of those we serve.

Thanks to a very generous \$460,000 bequest, the largest in over 10 years, we finished the quarter with a surplus of \$410,563 versus a budgeted deficit of \$20,453. Without this bequest we would have had an operating deficit of approximately \$50,000. The favorable results are due primarily to the bequest and higher wedding income offset by higher operating expenses and a decrease in the Sunday offertory of \$15,000 below budget. We are projecting nearly \$800,000 in capital improvements for the 17th Street property and our church within the next few years. We ask that you prayerfully consider increasing your donations this year, if you can through your Sunday offertory, maintenance 2nd collection, and Easter gifts to cover current expenses thereby allowing us to direct more bequest income to the planned capital improvements.
