From the Desk of Fr. Dan

This weekend we will hold our annual parish ministries retreat. Every year we gather the leaders of the parish to reflect on where we are, and where we are being called in light of the Gospel. It is one of the many extraordinary things about Xavier. It takes real work, but we are a deliberately, lay driven parish. Our ministries are centered in the Gospel call and are prophetic in their witness, and they are driven by the people of the parish.

We walk a fine line. On one hand we celebrate the Sacraments of the Roman Catholic Church with elegance, beauty and joy. We also believe that the Church is to be a place of welcome and hospitality, a place to meet people where they are. As Pope Francis says, the Church is to be a field hospital, not a museum. That field hospital is not just for individuals, it is also for our society and our Church. The call of the Gospel, and the work of a sacramental Church must be the work of social justice and reform of structures. This is what is so exciting about Xavier when we see the work that is happening in direct relationship with our worship. Our liturgy and our social action are inextricably linked.

I admit that it is not easy to be publically Catholic these days. As a recently ordained priest I grow disheartened by the structures of sin that have become part of our institutional Church. I also worry that we are not doing enough to address the sins of racism and able-ism in our own parish. These are all very real.

The image that has been part of my prayer recently, and that has helped me focus on my work, has been the image that St. Paul uses of the Church as a body. We are the Body of Christ. We cannot say to one part of the body that it does not belong, or is less important, all are part of the body. We also cannot pretend that parts of our body do not ache. Some are pains that we would rather avoid, and some are pains that we can accept more readily. However, they are all part of the same glorious body, that wonderful, beautiful body that is all of us. What a joy to be part of the beautiful, messy, body of Christ!






