

Youth Ministry

The Youth Ministry of the Church St. Francis Xavier, for students between 7th to 12th grade, officially began its ministry on Sunday, February 3 (Feast of St. Blaise.) After receiving a blessing from the community at the 9 am mass, 19 young people gathered at X-Cafe with four members of the adult group that accompanies our youth for a retreat. The retreat focused on knowing about St. Blaise and the tradition of blessing the throats. From there, the conversation concentrated on our throats as a symbol of the prophetic role by baptism; finding our voice within church and society. As a manual activity, our youth created candles to take home.

Last year we began the formation process of this youth ministry with the help of Daniel Genn, Associate Director of the Youth Ministry Office of the Archdiocese of New York. This office supports parish, school and church leaders through training, formation, networking, support, consulting and events for youth and youth leaders. The Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal covers this support, named Domus (Latin for home.) This process had some essential steps.

- 1- Recruit, build and guide an effective leadership team. Our youth selected among the parishioners, the adults they wanted as the initial adult leadership team. These adults met all the requirements of the Safe Environment Program and will receive four full-day training sessions.
- 2- Assess the needs, hopes, and gifts of our community through surveys carried out at the parish level. We are very grateful to all the parishioners who electronically/manually filled out the survey.
- 3- From the surveys, a vision and plan for long-term success were created.

Join us Wednesday Evenings 6:30-8:30pm beginning March 13th as we explore the biblical women in Jesus' family tree.


