# From the desk of Fr. Dan

This weekend is the five year anniversary of the murder of Jesuit Fr. Frans van der Lugt in Homs, Syria. I met Frans on many occasions when he would come to our house in Beirut, during cease- fires. He would return quickly once he had gathered the food and supplies he needed to continue to feed the hundreds of people he housed, or fed from the Jesuit community. For 50 years Frans lived with the people of Syria. He was intelligent, welcoming, and humble. Above all, as a man of prayer, he was radically free.

While under siege he housed the elderly, and disabled, Muslim and Christian alike. Frans ate the food they ate, and he shuddered under the same bombardments when the neighborhood was attacked. He was shot five years ago this weekend because he was a threat to the central narrative of all violence: That there exist people outside the parameters of God's concern. In deeds more than words Frans exposed the lie of that claim.

When the siege was lifted, thousands of Muslims and Christians made pilgrimages to the burial site of Frans, in the garden of the Jesuit community, to give thanks, and to draw strength from his courage and his freedom. People still make pilgrimages to his grave today.

His witness inspires the work of reconciliation and solidarity. It is slow work but it is the only way to expose the lie of hatred and fear.



The Jesuits in Holland made a recent video about Frans. The title on Youtube is "Frans van der Lugt SJ, 5 years after his death – his final message."

Frans is a wonderful Lenten example to all of us of the Gospel call to solidarity. Let us rejoice in the example of this amazing person as we continue our work of dismantling structures of separation and oppression, and realizing the radiance of God's Glory all around us!
