From the desk of Fr. Dan

This weekend we celebrate Mother's Day. It is a time to consider the impact of all of the mother figures in our lives. Above all, it is a time to be grateful for all of those who have been mother figures for us. Thank you all!

On Tuesday evening the Lay Spirits ministry offered a panel discussion on the role of the Blessed Virgin Mary in our spiritual lives. As a Church we remember Mary in a particular way in the month of May so it was a perfect time to offer this reflection. The wonderful thing about the evening was that it offered a series of reflections from the Orthodox, Episcopalian, Catholic and Muslim traditions. It was beautiful to know how much we all hold in common. It was an important reminder that much more unites us all than divides.

On the feast of the Annunciation of Mary (March 25) every year, the Jesuit High School outside of Beirut, Notre Dame de Jamhour has an inter-faith prayer service celebrating this woman who Muslims and Christians both hold as a prophet and as the virgin mother of Jesus. It was the one time a year when the leaders of all of the major religious groups in Lebanon would gather together in prayer. It was a beautiful evening, with music and recitation from the Christian and Islamic traditions. All of them told the story of Mary. The story of Gabriel visiting the teenage Mary in first century Palestine is told in both the Gospels and the Qur'an. This very strong young woman meets the angel and asks questions, and invites God to be magnified through her. The image is of a person who is completely free, and willing to be an instrument of Love. That freedom and openness takes real courage and work.

Mary is an exemplary prophet in the Islamic tradition and is revered. The Muslim scholar who spoke on Tuesday shared the story that when she was expecting her children she recited the Book of Mary (Sura al Myriam) every day of her pregnancy to help with a safe and easy birth. It is also a wonderful reminder of the way in which we are all called to mother the Word of God into the world. Mary is the only woman mentioned by name in the Qur'an, and she speaks more in the Qur'an than in the Gospels. She is an important person in this prophetic work.

The Orthodox priest who presented spoke about Mary's role as Theotokos, the God Bearer. This early title for Mary highlights this essential element that Mary was special, that there was something about the ordinariness of Mary that made her capable of carrying the One- who – carries- all. St. Athanasius reminds us that "The Son of God became human so that humans might become God." It is in the person of Mary, in her ordinariness that God chose her to be the one through whom we all realize our participation in God. It invites me to pray about how my ordinariness might be a vehicle through which God desires to operate.

In this month of May, perhaps we can use the image of Mary, this strong, prophetic woman as a model of freedom and strength for us. As we attend to the violence and divisiveness of our nation and world, may we be instruments of God's unifying action.

URGENT DONATIONS NEEDED TO HOUSE REFUGEE FAMILY ARRIVING TUESDAY



Last year, many of you met Sam at our Light In the Darkness Pilgrimage to Elizabeth Detention Center. Sam shared his story of the terrible conditions he suffered inside for seven months as a detainee seeking asylum, and led our group praying for the 300 detainees inside. He was granted asylum for religious persecution in June 2018, and his family was given legal permission to join him from West Africa in December. His wife and four children finally arrive at JFK airport Tuesday night, after separation of more than 500 days. He will hold his 11-month old newborn son for the first time.
