OUR HISTORY: FROM DIGNITY TO TODAY

Decades before Pope Francis inquired "Who am I to judge?" there was the Church of St. Francis Xavier, where lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender Catholics found a spiritual oasis. To this day, LGBT parishioners serve as pastoral council members, Eucharistic and hospitality ministers, lectors, spiritual directors, and Xavier Mission volunteers. They bring spiritual care to the sick and homebound, and advocate for human rights, including those of women and refugees. They are Jesus's disciples.

XAVIER & DIGNITY

The evolving AIDS crisis dramatically impacted LGBT people. Xavier, under the leadership of Rev. Joseph Dirr, SJ, offered Dignity space in Xavier Elementary School, and the 269 members began meeting there on November 4, 1978. In 1979, they were invited to celebrate Eucharist weekly in the church. Dignity found a loving home for nine years, until they were expelled in 1987 by the Archdiocese of New York.

XAVIER & THE AIDS CRISIS

In the 1980s, Redden's Funeral Home on West 14th Street was the first mortuary that accepted persons who had died of AIDS. Xavier was the first Catholic church willing to minister to those suffering with the fatal disease. Parishioners visited AIDS patients in hospitals and in their homes.

In 1986, Xavier distinguished itself as the first Catholic church to hold a memorial service for a gay man who had died of AIDS. Diego J. Lopez, parishioner Manny Lopez's brother, was a social worker, psychotherapist, and Vietnam War veteran.

In 1996, the first meeting of the Gonzaga HIV Support Group took place in the Mary Chapel. Moderators included Sister Honora Nicholson, RSM, Sister Judy Mertz, SC, Rev. John Mullin, SJ, and Rev. Ned Coughlin, SJ. That same year, Xavier dedicated the altar with St. Aloysius Gonzaga to people with AIDS.

XAVIER & THE LESBIAN AND GAY MINISTRIES

On January 4, 1993, with initiatives from Irma Levesque, Sister Ann Citarella, the Jesuit provincial, and Xavier's staff (including Rev. Michael E. Donahue, SJ and the parish council), Gay Catholics, which included men and women, was born. In 1995, Catholic Lesbians created its own ministry for gay women, by gay women, with gay women. Xavier first participated in the New York City Pride March in June 1994. It was the only parish to take such a bold step, marching under its name and letting the thousands of people on the sidelines know there is a Roman Catholic church that truly welcomes LGBTQ+ people. Other parishes, aware of Xavier's loving example, started their own LGBT ministries and asked for our guidance. They now participate in the march, though Xavier is still unique in that it participates under its name.

Every November, Catholic Lesbians and Gay Catholics hold a retreat at Linwood Spiritual Center in Rhinebeck, New York, for faith and fun!

The Church of St. Francis Xavier is a home for every seeker, regardless of sexual orientation, gender, marital or citizenship status, race, ethnicity, economic status. . . .

Ray is our Maintenance & Inventory Manager. He has a long history at Xavier Mission, first as a guest of our shelter, then as a graduate of L-STEP, and then he was hired as a custodian in the Welcome Table before leaving for a full-time job as an EMT. Ray is now back with us part-time and taking care of all of the deliveries, cleaning, and storage areas.

Maria is our new part-time administrative assistant. She is a former advertising and entertainment producer who recently moved to New York from the Philippines. She produced television commercials, documentaries, films, and did pioneering work on branded content in her country. With her move to the U.S., she now wants to focus on her family and on meaningful work in her community. Maria will be with us through August.

OUR IMPACT

With your support, this is the impact Xavier Mission had in our community from January through April 2019!

- The Financial Assistance Program provided \$49,747 to 40 families to prevent their evictions, as well as \$988 to 247 individuals and families for MetroCards! [NOTE: The Financial Assistance Program is currently frozen due to lack of funding.]
- The Welcome Table served 22,765 hot, nutritious meals!
- The Food Pantry provided groceries for 12,051 meals to 1,339 people, including 178 children and 325 seniors!
- The Clothing Room provided clothing and toiletries to 418 individuals!
- The shelter provided a safe space and 1,560 beds for homeless men!
- 6 participants graduated from the L-STEP Program and 5 participants from Homecoming!


BOOK PRESENTATION, DISCUSSION AND SIGNING

Dr. Debbie Almontaser was the founding and former principal of the Khalil Gibran International Academy in Brooklyn, New York the first Arabic Dual Language public school in the United States. A 25-year veteran of the NYC Public School System, she taught and served as a director in special education and inclusion, trained teachers in literacy, and served as a multicultural specialist and diversity adviser. Currently she is the Founder and CEO of

Bridging Cultures Group Inc and a Professor at the College of Staten Island's School of Education in the Post Master's Advanced Certificate Program for Leadership in Education. Dr. Almontaser was a featured speaker at the 2016 National Democratic Convention and has been featured on the front page of the New York Times and profiled in Time Magazine, Newsweek and Daily News.
