### From the desk of Fr. Dan

"As the new millennium approaches, there remains another great challenge facing this community of St. Louis, east and west of the Mississippi, and not St. Louis alone, but the whole country: to put an end to every form of racism, a plague which your Bishops have called one of the most persistent and destructive evils of the nation." John Paul II, Homily in St. Louis, MO July 27, 1999.

Addressing the persistent and destructive evil of racism is an essential element of any legitimate faith community. As is often noted, people of color know how to discuss race and racism, but most white people hide behind the statement that "everyone is equal" in order to avoid the difficult conversations necessary to address structures of racism in our society. John Paul II named this explicitly twenty years ago yet our church has done little to address this. As a prophetic voice within the larger church we hope that St. Francis Xavier can begin to be better about this. On May 11 and June 1 a group of parishioners from Xavier joined with parishioners from St. Charles Borromeo, a predominantly African- American Catholic parish in Harlem, for the beginning of further collaboration on racial justice. Those conversations were facilitated by Fr. Bryan Massingale, a professor of Ethics at Fordham University. Central to the conversation was the fact that everyone is affected by racism, but in different ways. The dignity of all is compromised by the sin of racism. This requires that all address the structures that allow this sin to persist.

To that end we have begun a series of reading groups. First, we read Massingale's Racial Justice and the Catholic Church. In July we will continue with White Fragility. It is my hope that as a community of faith we can continue to address our own structures of racism and then be more active in our accompaniment of all who struggle for racial justice. There will be many opportunities for conversation and action so please pay attention to notices in the bulletin and on the website/weekly emails.

This week we concluded our pastoral council discernment process for 2019-2020. Two new members were chosen, Belinda Conway and Andrea Foley- Murphy. We are delighted to welcome them to this group. As we continue to lead as prophetic witnesses to a new model of church; the pastoral council has a distinct role to support and coordinate the various ministries at Xavier. We have tremendous energy and capacity here. We need to be sure that those are allowed to flourish and grow in harmony.

As I review the last year, I am aware that we need to be better about leadership formation and transitions in our ministries. The human resources of Xavier are amazing and a tremendous gift from God. Our task as a parish is to use those well in beautiful harmony. This takes real work and clear vision.

• The Financial Assistance Program provided \$2,559 to 4 families to prevent their evictions, as well as \$234 to 13 individuals and families for MetroCards!

[NOTE: The Financial Assistance Program is currently frozen due to lack of funding.]

- The Welcome Table served 5,504 hot, nutritious meals!
- The Food Pantry provided groceries for 2,619 meals to 291 people, including 60 children and 45 seniors!
- The Clothing Room provided clothing and toiletries to 105 individuals!
- The shelter provided a safe space and 403 beds for homeless men!
- 6 participants graduated from the L-STEP Program and 5 participants from Homecoming!
