From the desk of Fr. Dan

Happy Feast of Corpus Christi!

When the sacrament is broken, Doubt not, but believe 'tis spoken,

That each sever'd outward token doth the very whole contain.

Nought the precious gift divides, Breaking but the sign betides Jesus still the same abides, still unbroken does remain.

--From the Sequence for the Feast of Corpus Christi

The Sacrament we celebrate on the Feast of Corpus Christi is not an idea or a thought experiment. It is an important reminder that the body, our body, is good and is part of the wondrous work of God's grace here and now. Traditionally, the feast has been celebrated with much pomp and ceremony, and all of that is to remind us to pay attention to the Body of Christ, present in its entirety here and now. Christ is with us not in spirit alone, but in the very real stuff of body.

In the sacrament of the Eucharist we receive the Body of Christ and take it into our own bodies. Even in the brokenness of Christ's body, its fullness remains, as the sequence for the feast says. Even through our brokenness, the fullness of Christ flows.

I am always amazed that the Christian tradition has been so warped as to allow for shame at the physical world. Many Christians, in particular North American Christians, have allowed a bizarre puritanical neo-Platonism to distract from Christianity. This has allowed for a separation between science and religion that fuels much of the misdirected arguments about secularism in the United States today.

Much of what passes for popular religious thought seems to depend on shame around sex and the body. However, scripture and natural law understand both to be gifts from God.

One very real implication of this attention to God's presence in the physical world is our desperate need to live in solidarity with our planet. The Environmental Ministry at Xavier has been doing great work to heighten our awareness of the desperate need to reform how we live on our planet. As Pope Francis reminds us, our faith impels us to reform in our relation to the physical planet: "Faced with a climate emergency, the Pope underlined, 'we must take action accordingly, in order to avoid perpetrating a brutal act of injustice towards the poor and future generations" (https://www.vaticannews.va/en/pope/news/2019-06/pope-declares-climate-emergency.html).

On this feast of Corpus Christi we celebrate the Body of Christ active and alive here and now. Let us celebrate that we have bodies, that they are gifts from God. Let us celebrate that we live on a planet and in a Universe that is also a gift from God.

The Church of St. Francis Xavier—A Roman Catholic Parish." Parishioners have carried a banner bearing these words after Rev. Ned Coughlin, SJ directed Catholic Lesbians and Gay Catholics to represent the entire parish, not just their specific ministries, in New York City's Pride March. It has been a tradition since the 1990s.

With your support, this is the impact Xavier Mission had in our community from May 2019!

• The Financial Assistance Program provided \$2,559 to 4 families to prevent their evictions, as well as \$234 to 13 individuals and families for MetroCards!

[NOTE: The Financial Assistance Program is currently frozen due to lack of funding.]

- The Welcome Table served 5,504 hot, nutritious meals!
- The Food Pantry provided groceries for 2,619 meals to 291 people, including 60 children and 45 seniors!
- The Clothing Room provided clothing and toiletries to 105 individuals!
- The shelter provided a safe space and 403 beds for homeless men!
- 6 participants graduated from the L-STEP Program and 5 participants from Homecoming!
