From the desk of Fr. Dan

Those who do justice will live in the presence of the Lord. (Responsorial Psalm 16th week of ordinary time)

Our readings this weekend are saturated with the commandment to hospitality. We are invited to welcome the stranger and care for God in our midst as the only way to real freedom. Freedom cannot be realized by walls and weapons, it can only be realized by welcoming.

The U.S. is struggling under implicit and explicit racism and xenophobia, the antithesis of the Gospel. We can name our own participation in the structures that allow this to happen and must call ourselves to the work of reform and self-examination. This is not simply a problem that we can blame on politicians and economic structures.

I worry as I leave the U.S. This nation is an influential and powerful nation; it has been a force for good. However, there is a bitter hatred and fear embedded in it and we are only seeing the fruits of generations of sinful structures.

I pray that we as a parish might be better examples of the Gospel values of hospitality, and of the best of our nation's heritage. Let us respond to hatred and fear with love, compassion and innovation. Let us use the resources at our disposal to do the very real, tangible work of hospitality. Let us welcome all, and savor the gift that each person is.

Amid all of the despair in our news, I happened upon an article written by a Dutch Jesuit hero of mine. He has been in the Middle East for over 50 years, in Lebanon, Egypt, Sudan, and Syria. He has had every possible job a Jesuit could have. He is now a beloved wisdom figure. He offered some written reflections amid the painful difficulties in the Church. Here is a paragraph from this saintly man amid the structures of sin in our Church.

"My joy and gratitude are not the fruit of an easy life, but of a deeply experienced and lived belief in resurrection. Every day, especially during the retreats I give to priests, sisters and young people, I experience that the good is stronger than the evil. We must never lose confidence, and we must not be afraid to raise our hands and open our hearts. With Pope Francis, I would like to say, "To me, every human being is a sacred ground for whom I remove my sandals. Not because of his appearance, the color of his skin, or even his faith or unbelief, but because he was created in the image of God."



The Children/ Adults Abuse Prevention Team (C/AAP) Team at Xavier ensures the protection of all, providing training, consultation, and support to anyone in the parish who may suspect, observe, or be the recipient of disclosure of child, youth and vulnerable adults' abuse or neglect.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Ensures that all parish staff and volunteers are fully trained in mandated reporting laws and the Protecting God's Children program (VIRTUS).
- 2. Acts as a resource to the parish on issues of child, youth and vulnerable adults' abuse and neglect.
- 3. Provides consultation and support to anyone in the parish who has concerns about reporting child, youth, and vulnerable adults' abuse/neglect.
