## *From the desk of Fr. Boller*

Our Gospel this Sunday reminds us to be attentive in small things. ## SEASON OF CREATION

We are in the fourth of the five weeks of the Season of Creation. We started with a recycling initiative in the parish; we've participated in the Web of Life retreat with Christina Leano, supported the youth at Friday's Climate Strike; and on Saturday, we cleaned up trash on the shores of the Hudson.

This week starts with the UN Climate Action Summit on Monday, Sept. 23.

Pray on that day that leaders of each country will report tangible, measurable commitments to reducing greenhouse gases that are responsible for global warming. The youth-led Climate Strikes were aimed at pressuring leaders at this Summit to think about the future generations when they announce their commitments. Greta Thunberg will address the Summit.

This whole week is Climate Week NYC, with an incredible variety of day and evening events. Google it for a day-by-day listing.

We highlight three Season of Creation events during this week, one right here at Xavier:

- 3) Merton and the Environment: by Sr. Kathleen Deignan, CND, and Br. Kevin Cawley, CFC, both from the Thomas Berry Forum, at Corpus Christi Church at 529 W. 121st St. on Sat., Sept. 28, 2 – 4 pm

Finally, look for the upcoming Blessing of the Animals events at various churches, including St. Francis Xavier on Oct. 5, and St. Augustine in Larchmont on Oct. 6.
